





Radon can seep in through the foundation of a home or building built on radon-contaminated soil. Inhabitants of homes contaminated with radon or those who work in buildings where radon has seeped in may be at a greater risk of developing cancer than those who do not live or work in such buildings. According to the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, radon is responsible for about 21,000 deaths from lung cancer each year in the United States alone, and roughly 1 out of every 15 homes in the U.S. has unsafe levels of radon.Radon is most often found in basements because the gas sinks to the lowest points in buildings. However, even those homes or buildings without basements can have unsafe levels of radon. Property owners should have their homes or buildings tested for radon, as exposure to radon does not produce any symptoms, meaning those wholive and work in buildings where they are being exposed to radon won't know unless buildings are routinely tested. Kits to test radon levels can be purchased at many hardware stores, or property owners can hire professionals to conduct tests for them. TF141883

\* Make sure a professional inspects your chimneys, chimney connectors, fireplaces and wood or coal stoves at least once a year. \* Give space heaters plenty of space. They should be at least 3 feet away from anything that could burn, and always make sure to turn the heaters off when leaving the room or going to bed.

\* To reduce the risk of electrical shock, install ground-fault circuit interrupters. They shut off faulty electrical circuits and equipment more quickly than conventional fuses or circuit breakers. The devices are inexpensive and can be hard-wired into your home's electrical system by a professional electrician.

12/20/23 Cheers! Elaine Sugar Plum Punch

1 (25.4 oz.) Bottle Sparkling White Grape Juice 2 Cups Cranberry or Cran-Cherry Juice 2 Tbsp. Fresh Lime Juice

Chill the grape juice and cranberry juice for at least 30 minutes before prepping. Combine all the ingredients in a medium sized pitcher and stir. Pour and serve. Makes 6 wine-sized glasses of punch.

# Festive Holiday Punch

- 1 Bottle (64 oz.) Cranberry-Raspberry Juice (chilled)
- 1 Can (12 oz.) Frozen Raspberry Lemonade Concentrate (thawed)

1 Bottle (2 liters) Lemon-Lime Soda (chilled) Fresh Raspberries

Ice Cubes

Lime Wedges (optional)

In a punch bowl, mix juice and lemonade concentrate. Stir in the soda; top with raspberries. Serve over ice. If desired, garnish glasses with lime wedges. Makes 14 servings (3/4 cup each).

Santa's Christmas Punch

- 1 Bottle (2 liters) Lemon-Lime Soda
- 1 Bottle (64 oz.) Cranberry Juice Blend
- 1 Cup Sugar

1 Can Frozen Lemonade Concentrate (thawed)

1 Can Frozen Orange Juice Concentrate

(thawed)

- Ice Cubes
- Water (for amount see directions)
- Garnishes: Lemon Slices, Cranberries, Fresh **Rosemary Sprigs**

Combine the soda and the cranberry blend. Add the sugar and stir vigorously until combined and the sugar is dissolved. Add the thawed concentrates, stir again.

If you desire a strong punch you can leave it as is and just add ice. If you wish to dilute it a bit, add up to 3 cups of water (or to your taste). Remember adding ice will further dilute the punch, so be careful. Add the garnishes if desired. If using the lemon do not forget to wash it well.

### Serves about 16.







rear facing weights. Always read your child restraint manual for instructions on properly using the restraint. Children over age one and at least 20 pounds may ride facing forward.

Audend Merchandiser

Does the safety belt hold the seat tightly in place? Put the belt through the correct slots. If your safety seat can be used facing either way, use the correct belt path for each direction. Check the vehicle owner's manual and safety seat instruction book for guidance.

Is the harness buckled snugly around your child? Keep harness straps snug over the child's shoulders. Place the chest clip at armpit level.

Does your child over 40 pounds have the best protection possible? Keep your child in a safety seat with a full harness as long as possible, at least until 40 pounds. Then use a belt-positioning booster seat which helps the adult lap and shoulder belt fit better. A belt-positioning booster seat is preferred for children between 40-80 pounds. It is used with the adult lap and shoulder belt.

How should a safety belt fit an older child? The child should be tall enough to sit without slouching, with knees bent at the edge of the seat, with feet on the floor. The lap belt must fit low and tight across the upper thighs. The shoulder belt should rest over the shoulder and across the chest. Never put the shoulder belt under the arm or behind the child's back. The adult lap and shoulder belt system alone will not fit most children until they are at least 4'9" tall and weigh about 80 pounds.






