## KENNEDY KRIEGER'S HATS & HORSES RAISES MORE THAN \$400K FOR PEDIACORE

The sixth annual Hats & Horses, a derby-themed evening that benefits Kennedy Krieger Institute, enjoyed an in-person event for the first time since 2019 as the event raised more than \$400,000 for PediaCORE, an institute-designed and created movement therapy system for children.

For the first time since 2019, the

fun-filled event was held in-person, although the extravaganza almost did not make it out of the gate. Originally scheduled for the fall, the event organizers, the Women's Initial Network (WIN) of Kennedy Krieger Institute, postponed the party to May 5 because of last fall's rise in COVID-19 cases.
