The correlation between attendance and academic performance is undeniable. Students who attend classes regularly have a better grasp of the curriculum, enabling them to stay on track with coursework, participate actively in discussions, and seek clarification on challenging topics. This engagement directly translates into improved grades and overall academic achievement. Below you will see the correlation between attendance and academic performance for our 2023 GCSE cohort.

Attendance	Average Pupil Progress
95-100%	+0.92
90-94%	+0.61
80-89%	+0.08
0-79%	-1.82

Pupil progress is the measure used to show how pupils have performed against their targets e.g. if a pupil has an average target grade of a grade 5 and achieved a progress score of +0.95 then the pupil would on average achieved one grade above across all subjects. The same goes for a negative progress score. If a pupil achieved a progress score of -0.95 then on average they would have achieved one grade below their target. As you can see, attendance matters.

Furthermore, consistent attendance cultivates discipline and responsibility in students. It instils a sense of commitment and dedication, qualities that are not only crucial during their academic years but also in their future endeavours.
