

# June Made It Society Prep and Supplies!

We will be making two projects this month. I am going to be making an Envelope project that you could use to be anything, a card, a folio, an invitation, an envelope...lol.

Each month we will use what we like to call our Make It Kit. This is a list of supplies we typically use for all projects so you will want to have all of these on hand to create.

## Make It Kit

Trimmer

Scissors (big and small)

Pokey Tool

Pencil

Scoreboard and Bone Folder

Ruler

Glue (wet, sticky tape and foam)

Cloth to clean up messes

Any tools you routinely work with as well.

SNACKS!

For best participation, we suggest having two screens. One to watch and one to chat, for example, use your computer or TV to watch the projects and your phone or tablet to chat in the livestream. This is not necessary but it is helpful.

Made It Society is not a class so it does not function as our live classes do, this is more of a Make-a-long so we will just craft together and have fun! Class will open at 10am CST. Not early like our traditional online classes do.

## Project One: Envelope Mini Album, or Card, or Folio, or Invitation or....

I was inspired by the video I will be including here. I will be using my new Envelope Punch Up tool but you can create your envelope any way you have access to.

Tip: there are videos on YouTube on how to make envelopes without any tools.

I will be making mine as large as I can with a 12 x 12 piece of card stock to start. For the paper I will use, we just got in the most beautiful paper pack from Carta Bella called Flower Shoppe and I can't wait to use it!

This delicate project is perfect for our stash crafting, I will be using the video to help inspire me, I may or may not do it very much like Suzna did but I will also link the blog post from Suzna so you can see her other Envelope Mini Albums as inspiration. Dig through your stash and lets play, honestly, if you just have a paper pack and a way to make envelopes we can make this project. Of course there will be a few changes but for the most part we can make it with a coordinating card stock only.

\* \*grab some fun ephemera you can add too, ribbons, buttons, charms, grommets, etc.



## Second Project: Paneled Scrapbook Page

I am so excited to try this technique, this project is inspired by our recent panel cards we made in this live stream. Someone mentioned this might make a great scrapbook layout and so our scrapbook page was started!

I will be using 12 x 12 card stock as a base to glue panels on to, and a page I can cut into a paneled layer on the base. I want to panel a very large image, I will be digging into my craft stash and looking for a fun full page I can use with paneling. Be sure to watch my video I will share here, that way you can start to imagine what card stock you have that will look amazing.

Seeing as I have not made one of these pages before I thought I would do a mock up of what you might want to look for, this is just a sample image!

You may notice I am slicing the background and the cut apart in this idea. Also, it isn't to scale! It's just an idea of what we will do.
