IN THE DIOCESE OF NEWCASTLE

The LGBTQI+ Chaplaincy is part of a diocesan-wide commitment to foster a climate of radical Christian inclusion and welcome.

It was set up in response to the House of Bishop's apology for the way the Church has treated LGBTQI+ people, acknowledging the deep hurt and pain experience by both those who worship in our churches and those who do not.

The chaplaincy honours the personal experience of LGBTQI+ people and celebrates their contribution to ministry and mission within the Diocese of Newcastle.

We also have a team of volunteer chaplains to offer pastoral support, affirmation, accompaniment and dignity for LGBTQI+ people over the age of 18 in our diocese.
