1. RBI report finds debt fund AUM of '1.7lakh crore in stress

• The study conducted by the SEBI has revealed that '1.7-lakh crore of asset under management of open-ended debt schemes of 17 mutual funds were under stress as of September quarter.

• The analysis revealed stress in the case of 17 mutual funds and in terms of schemes, however, only 24 out of a total of 299 schemes exhibited stress, as per the Financial Stability Report. The Financial Stability Report was recently published by the RBI.

2. RBI issues guidelines on bank classification of unclaimed deposits
This move comes after RBI launched '100 Days 100 Pays" campaign in June last year, under which banks must trace and settle the top 100 unclaimed deposits of every

bank in every district.
The deadline for the scheme, which was to end on 8 September, has now been extended to 1st

April 2024.

• Under the new guidelines, RBI said banks shall undertake at least an annual review in respect of accounts where there is no customer induced transactions for more than a year. "In cases where there is no explicit mandate to renew the term deposit, the banks should review such accounts if the customers have not withdrawn the proceeds after maturity or transferred these to their savings/current account in order to prevent such deposits from becoming unclaimed," it said.

• RBI also said banks shall not classify zero balance accounts as 'inoperative' if it remains non-operative for a period of more

than two years. "Central and State governments have been expressing difficulty in crediting cheques/Direct Benefit Transfer/ Electronic Benefit Transfer/ scholarship amount in these accounts as they are also classified as inoperative due to non-operation for two years," it said.

• Banks shall ensure that amounts lying in inoperative accounts or unclaimed deposits and reactivated will be put under concurrent audit, according to the new norms. All transactions in these accounts, which are reactivated, will be monitored regularly for at least six months, at higher levels without the knowledge of the customers and dealing staff.

• The balance in savings or current accounts not operated for **10 years and term deposits not** claimed for **10 years** from the date of maturity are classified by banks as unclaimed deposits. These amounts are transferred to the depositor education and awareness (DEA) fund maintained by RBI. 3. UPI transactions hit a new record with '18.23 lakh crore in Dec; 54% higher
• The volume of UPI (Unified Payments Interface) transactions continues to rise month after month as the total monthly transaction amount touched '18.23 lakh crore in Dec last year, 54 percent higher

than the corresponding data of 2022.

• In terms of the number of transactions, the figure reached 12.02 billion, witnessing 42 percent higher than the previous year figure.

• It is noteworthy that the transaction amount had hit '17.40 lakh crore in November and '17.16 lakh crore in October.

• Also, the number of UPI transactions hit 11.24 billion in November and 11.41 billion in October.

4. HDFC Bank goes live with NPCIdeveloped UPI in secondary market platform

• HDFC Bank has executed transactions via the NPCI's UPI payments app as part of the 'UPI for secondary market' facility, which which went live.

• The move follows markets regulator Sebi allowing the facility through the UPI app developed by the National Payment Corporation of India (NPCI). Clearing corporations will directly process payouts to these clients on a T+1 basis.

• Effective January 1, Sebi and the stock exchanges permitted trading in the cash segment through block mechanism, on an optional basis, for the secondary market on the lines of Application Supported by Blocked Amount (ASBA) for primary markets where investors' funds will continue to remain in their savings account with the required funds being blocked instead of the investor having to upfront transfer the amount to the broker's account for placing trades.

During this pilot stage, investors can block funds in their bank accounts, which will only be debited by the clearing corporations after trade confirmation during the settlement period.
Initially, HDFC Bank, and ICICI Bank customers will be able to avail of this facility and HDFC Bank, HSBC, ICICI Bank, and YES Bank are acting as sponsor banks for the clearing corporation and exchanges.

5. UPI transactions cross 100-billion mark in 2023

• Transactions through the unified payments interface (UPI) platform crossed the 100 billion-mark in calendar year 2023 to close at around 118 billion, as per the data shared by the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI).

• This marks a 60 percent growth as compared to 74 billion UPI transactions recorded in 2022.





Visa, the world's largest card network, processes an average of 750 mn. transactions/day.

• UPI is expected to surpass Mastercard's daily transaction volume of 440 million sometime this year going by the 60 percent growth rate.

6. RBI proposes banks with less than 6% net NPAs to declare dividends

 The Reserve Bank of India proposed allowing banks having net non-performing assets (NPAs) ratio of less than 6 per cent to declare dividends.

• As per the prevailing norms last updated in 2005, banks need to have a NNPA ratio of up to 7 per cent to become eligible for declaration of dividends.

• RBI has proposed that the new guidelines should come into effect from FY25 onwards.

• The guidelines have been reviewed in the light of implementation of Basel III standards, the revision of the prompt corrective action (PCA) framework, and the introduction of differentiated banks, the RBI said.

• A commercial bank should have a minimum total capital adequacy of 11.5 per cent to be eligible for declaring dividend, while the same for a small finance bank and paytment banks has been set at 15 per cent, and 9 per cent for local area banks and regional rural banks, the draft circular said.

• In what can be seen as a relaxation from the existing norms, the **Reserve Bank has** proposed increasing the upper ceiling on dividend payout ratio -- which is the ratio between the amount of the dividend payable in a year and the net profit -- to 50 per cent if the net NPA is zero from the earlier ceiling of 40 per cent.

• The draft also made it clear that the Reserve Bank shall not entertain any request for "ad-hoc dispensation on declaration of dividend".

• In the case of foreign banks, the RBI has proposed that they may remit net profit or surplus (net of tax) of a quarter or a year earned in from Indian operations without the central bank's prior approval.

7. Reserve Bank of India cancels the licence of The Faiz Mercantile Cooperative Bank Ltd., Nashik, Maharashtra

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI), cancelled the licence of "The Faiz Mercantile

Cooperative Bank Ltd., Nashik, Maharashtra. • The bank does not have adequate capital and earning prospects. As such, it does not comply with the provisions of <u>Section 11(1) and</u> <u>Section 22 (3) (d) read with Section 56 of</u> <u>the Banking Regulation Act, 1949</u>.

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) also cancelled the licence of "Musiri Urban Cooperative Bank Ltd., Musiri" (Tamil Nadu). • The bank does not have adequate capital and earning prospects. As such, it does not comply with the provisions of Section 11(1) and

Section 22 (3) (d) read with Section 56 of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

The bank has failed to comply with the requirements of <u>Sections 22(3) (a), 22(3)</u>
 (b), 22(3)(c), 22(3) (d) and 22(3)(e) read with Section 56 of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

8. RBI enhances bulk deposit limit for large UCBs 6.66 times to '1 cr and above

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has decided to enhance the bulk deposit limit for large urban co-operative banks (UCBs) to '1 crore and above from the current '15 lakh and above.

• Specifically, the new bulk deposit limit applies to UCBs in the Tier 3 (with deposits more than '1,000 crore and up to '10,000 crore) and Tier 4 (with deposits more than '10,000 crore) categories.

• RBI said for all other UCBs (that is, other than scheduled UCBs in Tiers 3 and 4), the definition of bulk deposit will continue to be "single rupee term deposits of '15 lakh and above."

9. India Ratings revises PNB Housing Finance NCD ratings from AA to AA+

• PNB Housing Finance, a housing finance company, said that India Ratings and Research (Ind-Ra) has upgraded the rating of the company's non-convertible debentures (NCDs) to 'IND AA+' from 'IND AA' with stable outlook.

• Further, Ind-Ra said that NCDs limit has been split into bank loans and NCDs and 'IND AA+' rating has been assigned to the bank loans.

10. RBI grants payment aggregator licence to Tata Pay

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has granted a payment aggregator (PA) licence to Tata Payments, Tata group's digital payments app.

• This will help the firm facilitate ecommerce transactions through its platform. Tata Payments is held through Tata Digital, the group's subsidiary entity, which houses its digital businesses.

• Payment Aggregators are entities that enable ecommerce websites, mobile apps, and merchants to accept various payment instruments from customers for the completion of their payment obligations – without the need for merchants to create a separate payment integration system of their own.

11. RBI directs issuers to specify utilisation of funds raised via NCDs, CPs

• RBI has tweaked norms for the issuance of commercial papers (CPs) and non-convertible debentures of up to one year to



regulate short-term investments and ensure transparency in the market.

One of the key changes, slated to take effect from April 1 this year, was that the guidelines mandate issuers to mention the exact end use of the funds raised through the instruments.
For better transparency, issuers are now required to disclose long-term and unaccepted credit ratings in the offer document. This information helps investors make informed decisions about the risks associated with the investment, said market participants.

• The settlement period was capped at T+4, which means the transactions need to be settled within four days from the trade date. Individuals and Hindu Undivided Families (HUF) were restricted to investing a maximum of 25 per cent of their total income.

• The guidelines specify that redemptions (repayment of the invested amount) need to be made before 3 pm on the maturity date.

13. Karnataka Bank, Satin Creditcare Network sign co-lending agreement • Private sector Karnataka Bank (KBL) and Satin Creditcare Network Ltd (SCNL), a NBFC-Micro Finance Institution (MFI), have entered into a co-lending arrangement to provide financial support to Joint Liability Groups (JLG) of economically active women in both rural and semi-urban areas and to give impetus to the microcredit facilities segment of the country.

14. Fino Payments Bank applies to RBI for small finance bank license

• Fino Payments Bank has applied to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI), seeking a small finance bank license, the regulator said in a release. RBI allows payments banks without corporate lineage to apply for a small finance bank license after completing five years of business.

• Fino has around Rs 600 crore of net worth while the minimum capital requirement for small finance banks is Rs 200 crore at present.

• FINO Payments Bank Limited has commenced operations as a payments bank with effect from June 30, 2017.

• The Reserve Bank has issued a licence to the bank under <u>Section 22 (1) of the Banking</u> <u>Regulation Act, 1949</u> to carry on the business of payments bank in India.

15. SBI raises \$600 million via 5-year senior unsecured fixed rate notes

• State Bank of India (SBI)said it has concluded the issue of USD 600 million senior unsecured fixed rate notes having maturity of 5 years at a coupon of 5 per cent, payable semi-annually, under Regulation-S. • This fundraising comes on the heels of the bank concluding placement of USD 250 million senior unsecured Green floating rate notes, referred to as 'The Green Notes.'

• Under Regulation-S, offers and sales of securities that happen outside the United States are exempt from SEC registration requirements.

• This "Green Notes" issuance, maturing on December 29, 2028, is part of SBI's USD 10 Billion medium-term note program and was conducted through a private placement facilitated by its London branch.

• The Green Notes rated BBB- by S&P, were issued on a floating rate basis of 1.20 per cent above SOFR (secured overnight financing rate) and have been listed on the India International Exchange, India's largest bank said in a statement issued on January 4.

16. FIDC to prepare model code of conduct for NBFCs

• The Finance Industry Development Council (FIDC) said it will continue its endeavour to act as an industry watchdog to prevent, reduce, and correct instances of questionable business practices through persuasion and consensus-building among member NBFCs.

• The Council, which is a representative body of the RBI-registered NBFCs, underscored in its Vision document for the next two years, that it will play a significant role in ensuring a high degree of corporate governance, adherence to regulatory norms, and fair market practices among its members.

• FiDC will continue its endeavour to prepare a model code of conduct and encourage compliance among members, per the document.

• The Council observed that NBFCs have gained expertise in last-mile credit delivery.

17. Indian Bank launches 'Indian Bank One Co-Branded Credit Card'

• Indian Bank has announced its partnership with FPL Technologies to launch the 'Indian Bank one co-branded credit card' powered by Visa and RuPay.

• The partnership signifies a strategic shift as the One co-branded credit card will now be extended not just to existing Indian Bank customers but also to new customers, allowing a reach to a broader audience.

18. SBI raises \$600 million via 5-year senior unsecured bonds

• State Bank of India (SBI), India's largest lender, on January 10 said it has concluded the issuance of \$600 million senior unsecured fixed rate notes with maturity of 5 years at a coupon of 5 percent, payable semi-annually, under Regulation-S. This issuance comes after the bank concluded the placement of \$250 million senior unsecured green floating rate notes.



19. IndusInd Bank introduces the 'Samman RuPay Credit Card' exclusively for government employees.

• IndusInd Bank recently introduced the 'IndusInd Bank Samman RuPay Credit Card", equipped with UPI functionality, in partnership with the National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI).

• Tailored for government sector employees, the card is designed to offer a variety of exclusive perks, aiming to elevate their banking experience.

20. RBI waives '5 crore penalty imposed on Bank of Baroda over shortfall in soiled note remittances

• Bank of Baroda (BOB) said the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has decided to waive the '5 crore penalty that was previously imposed on it due to a shortfall in soiled note remittances.

• The penalty was attributed to a shortfall in soiled note remittances, indicating issues with the handling of notes that had undergone normal wear and tear.

• The penalties imposed by the RBI align with its Clean Note Policy, a stringent framework necessitating the immediate imposition of penalties upon identifying deficiencies in soiled note remittances or chest balances, irrespective of the quantity involved.

21. RBI imposes fine on Dhanlaxmi Bank, ESAF Small Finance Bank, Punjab and Sind Bank over non-compliances

• RBI has imposed monetary penalties against ESAF Small Finance Bank, Dhanlaxmi Bank, and Punjab and Sind Bank over various non-compliances.

• A penalty of '1.20 crore has been slapped on

Dhanlaxmi Bank for non-compliance with certain directions on 'Loans and Advances' Statutory and Other Restrictions', KYC, and certain norms related to he interest rate on deposits.

• This penalty has been imposed in exercise of powers vested in RBI conferred under the

provisions of <u>Section 47A(1)(c) read with</u> Section 46(4)(i) of the Banking Regulation Act, 1949.

 Further, a fine of 1 crore has been imposed on Punjab and Sind Bank for non-compliance with certain directions on 'Loans and Advances ' Statutory and Other Restrictions'.

• The central bank has also imposed a penalty of **29.55 lakh on ESAF Small Finance Bank** for non-compliance with its directions on 'Customer Service in Banks'.

• The RBI said that the actions against these banks were taken based on deficiencies in regulatory compliance and are not intended to pronounce upon the validity of any transaction or agreement entered into by the bank with its customers.

• Earlier on 11 January, RBI decided to waive the'5 crore penalty on state-owned lender Bank of Baroda(BOB) that was previously imposed on it due to a shortfall in soiled note remittances.

22. SBI launches Green Rupee Term Deposit • State Bank of India (SBI), the country's largest Bank has launched a special fixed deposit (FD) scheme.

• SBI Green Rupee Term Deposit (SGRTD) has been launched to mobilise funds to support environment-friendly initiatives and projects, thereby fostering the growth of a green finance ecosystem in India

About the Scheme:

• SBI Green Rupee Term Deposit scheme is open to resident individuals, non-individuals, and NRI customers.

• SGRTD offers investors the flexibility to choose from three distinct tenors: 1111 days, 1777 days, and 2222 days.

23. SpiceJet's Rs 2,242-crore fund infusion plan gets BSE nod

• SpiceJet has received a BSE nod to issue equity shares and warrants convertible into equity shares on a preferential basis as part of the company's Rs 2,242-crore fund infusion plans.

• The in-principle approval from BSE allows SpiceJet to proceed with the process of fund infusion, providing the airline with the necessary financial impetus for its growth initiatives. Ajay Singh, Chairman, and Managing Director of SpiceJet.

24. RBI releases draft norms for fintech self-regulatory organisations

• The Reserve Bank of India's (RBI's) draft norms for self-regulatory organisations for the fintech sector (SRO-FT) have proposed that such entities should have a robust IT infrastructure and the ability to deploy technological solutions within a reasonable timeframe.

• The applicant for such an entity should have sufficient net worth and demonstrate the capability of establishing the necessary infrastructure to fulfil the responsibilities of an SRO-FT effectively, RBI said.

• The draft framework said that to maintain credibility, the SRO-FT should operate independently, free from the influence of any single member or group of members.

• <u>The SRO should be set up as a not-for-</u> profit company registered under Section 8 of the Companies Act, 2013.

• The norms said the applicant should represent the fintech sector with membership across entities of all sizes, stages and activities. If representation is inadequate at the time of application, the application should include a roadmap for achieving this within a reasonable timeline.

• The draft norms left it to the sector to decide whether there should be one SRO for fintechs, or multiple SROs.

25. IndusInd Bank ties up with EazyDiner to launch credit card

• IndusInd Bank has launched the 'EazyDiner IndusInd Bank Platinum Credit Card' in association with EazyDiner. The credit

card offers an additional discount of '500 while paying through the EazyDiner App via PayEazy for both dining and take-away at select restaurants.

26. Working Group suggests tighter norms for States while giving guarantees
A Working Group constituted during the 32nd Conference of the State Finance
Secretaries held in July 2022, to prescribe a uniform guarantee ceiling for States among

others, recommended that the word

'Guarantee' should include all instruments, which create an obligation, contingent or otherwise, on part of the State Government.

• As per the recommendations, the State Governments must clearly define the purpose for which Government guarantees are issued.

• State Governments may consider fixing a ceiling for incremental guarantees issued during a year at 5% of Revenue Receipts or 0.5% of Gross State Domestic Product, whichever is less.

• The State Governments may consider charging a minimum guarantee fee for guarantees extended and additional risk premium may be charged based on the risk category and the tenor of the underlying loan," the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) said while making the recommendations public.

• As per the recommendations the State Governments should publish/disclose data relating to guarantees, as per the Indian Government Accounting Standard (IGAS).

• The RBI said that the implementation of the recommendations made by the Working Group should facilitate better fiscal management by the State Governments.

• The Working Group comprised members drawn from the Ministry of Finance, Government of India; Comptroller and Auditor General of India; and some State Governments.

• The terms of reference of the Working Group included, *inter alia*, prescribing a uniform guarantee ceiling for the States; uniform reporting framework for the guarantees given by the State Governments and assessing the adequacy of States' contribution to the Guarantee Redemption Fund.

27. Karnataka Bank and NBFC Clix Capital enter co-lending partnership

• Karnataka Bank (KBL), a leading Private Sector Bank and Clix Capital, one of India's fastest-growing new-age NBFCs, have entered into a strategic digital co-lending partnership through Yubi Co.lend Platform.

• This partnership is focused on providing loans to the Indian MSME sector which is one of the biggest contributors to India's GDP and employment growth.

28. Yes Bank deploys Veefin's SmartFin supply chain finance solution

• Yes Bank has unveiled SmartFin, an advanced digital Supply Chain Finance (SCF) platform developed in collaboration with Veefin Solutions to support Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises (MSMEs).

• The move reflects Yes Bank's commitment to fostering innovation and amplifying its digital offerings, particularly in the realm of working capital efficiencies.



• SmartFin, powered by Veefin Solutions, presents an end-to-end digital SCF platform, ushering in a new era of efficiency for businesses in the supply chain.

29. HDFC Bank seeks Singapore bank license to grow overseas

• HDFC Bank Ltd, India's biggest private sector lender, is seeking to open its first branch in Singapore, signaling its overseas ambitions after sewing up a landmark merger with mortgage financier Housing Development Finance Corp. last year.

• The bank has applied to the **Monetary Authority of Singapore** for a banking license and is awaiting approval, according to sources familiar with the matter.

• It is not clear what kind of banking license HDFC Bank is seeking in Singapore, said one of the people, who declined to be identified as the information is confidential.

• State Bank of India and ICICI Bank Ltd. hold qualifying full banking licenses, alongside eight other banks like Bank of China Ltd. and BNP Paribas SA. Such licenses are open only to foreign banks and allow them to have additional branches and/or off-premise ATMs as well as to share ATMs among themselves, according to the Association of Banks in Singapore's website.

• Besides Singapore, HDFC Bank also has presence in markets like London, Hong Kong and Bahrain.

30. Indian Stock Market Surpasses Hong Kong To Become 4th Biggest Equity Market Globally

• The Indian stock market has pipped Hong Kong to become the fourth-highest equity market globally.

The combined value of shares listed on Indian exchanges reached USD 4.33 trillion as of Monday's close, versus USD 4.29 trillion for Hong Kong, according to data compiled by Bloomberg.
That makes India the fourth-biggest equity

• That makes mula the fourth-biggest equity market globally. Its value crossed \$4 trillion for the first time on Dec. 5, with about half of that coming in the past four years.

• The top three stock markets are the U.S., China, and Japan.Currently, the US is the world's biggest market with a mcap of \$50.86 trillion, followed by China with a mcap of \$8.44 trillion and Japan at \$6.36 trillion.

• Indian stocks reached new highs in 2023 due to bullish investors and increased domestic participation.

31. Central Bank of India plans offer for sale to reduce govt's stake

 Public-sector lender Central Bank of India has approached the government with a proposal for an offer for sale (OFS) instead of a fresh issue of equity through routes like

qualified institutional placement (QIP) or a rights issue.

• It has chosen to take the OFS route to avoid dilution of its equity capital base while increasing the public float of shares.

• The government has a little over 93 per cent in the Mumbai-based bank at the end of December 2023.

• In October 2017, the government outlined a recapitalisation package of Rs 2.11 trillion for public-sector banks over FY18 and FY19. Central Bank of India received Rs 5,158 crore in FY18 and Rs 6,592 crore in FY19, Rs 3,353 crore in FY20 and Rs 4,800 crore in FY21.

• Thus, over the past few fiscal years, the government has infused Rs 19,903 crore into Central Bank of India, helping improve its capital ratios, according to rating agency CRISIL.

32. Government allows direct listing of securities by Indian companies on GIFT IFSC

The Department of Economic Affairs
 (DEA), Ministry of Finance, has amended
 Foreign Exchange Management (Non-debt
 Instruments) Rules, 2019, and notified the
 'Direct Listing of Equity Shares of
 Companies Incorporated in India on
 International Exchanges Scheme'.
 Simultaneously, the Ministry of Corporate

Affairs (MCA) has issued Companies (Listing of Equity Shares in Permissible Jurisdictions) Rules, 2024.

• These, together, provide an overarching regulatory framework to enable public Indian companies to issue and list their shares in permitted international exchanges. As of now, the framework allows unlisted public Indian companies to list their shares on an international exchange.

• SEBI is in the process of issuing the operational guidelines for listed public Indian companies. The international stock exchanges at GIFT-IFSC under the regulatory supervision of IFSCA namely, India International Exchange and NSE International Exchange have been, currently, prescribed as permitted stock exchanges under the Rules and the Scheme.

• Earlier, through the Companies (Amendment) Act, 2020, enabling provisions were included in the **Companies Act, 2013**, to allow direct listing of prescribed class (es) of securities of prescribed class (es) of public companies incorporated in India on permitted stock exchanges in permissible foreign jurisdictions or other prescribed jurisdictions. The enabling provisions of the Companies (Amendment) Act, 2020 were, accordingly, brought into force with effect from 30th October, 2023.



33. HDFC becomes 1st bank to hit 2 crore credit cards milestone

• HDFC Bank, India's largest private sector bank, said it has become the first lender in the country to achieve the milestone of 20 million credit cards in force.

• The lender forayed into the credit card business in 2001 and hit the 10-million mark in 2017.

• HDFC Bank is the largest issuer of card issuers in the country, which commands over a fourth of the overall card market.

• According to the Reserve Bank of India data for November 2023, HDFC Bank's cards in circulation stood at nearly 19.51 million as compared to 19.18 million cards in October 2023.

• HDFC Bank is followed by SBI Card, ICICI Bank, and Axis Bank, in terms of the number of credit cards issued.

34. Four companies get Sebi's nod to launch IPOs

• Entero Healthcare Solutions, JNK India, Exicom Tele-Systems and Akme Fintrade (India) have received markets regulator Sebi's approval to raise funds through initial public offerings.

• However, the Securities and Exchange Board of India has returned the IPO papers of Stallion India Fluorochemicals.

• As per the processing status of draft offer documents till January 19, the watchdog has approved the initial public offering (IPO) of the four companies.

• These four firms, which had filed their preliminary papers with the markets watchdog between June and October, obtained observation letters on January 16-19, an update with the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) showed on 26 January.

• In Sebi's parlance, obtaining observation letters means its go-ahead to launch an IPO.

35. Bank of Baroda's arm rebranded as 'BOBCARD Limited' with 'Credit Reimagined' tagline

• Bank of Baroda's wholly-owned subsidiary for cards, 'BOB Financial Solutions Limited', has been rebranded as 'BOBCARD Limited' with the tagline 'Credit Reimagined'

• It is also the merchant payment processing partner of Bank of Baroda's merchant acquiring business.

36. Yes Bank becomes first Indian bank to conduct export finance transaction on RXIL's ITFS platform

• <u>Yes Bank</u> became the first Indian bank to execute an export finance transaction on the International Trade Financing Services Platform (ITFS) of RXIL Global IFSC Limited (RXIL), a leading cross-border fintech company registered under the International Financial Services Centres Authority (IFSCA).





1. Government of India constitutes

Sixteenth Finance Commission with Dr. Arvind Panagariya as its Chairman • The Government of India, with the approval of the President of India, has constituted the Sixteenth Finance Commission, in pursuance to Article 280(1) of the Constitution.

• <u>Dr Arvind Panagariya, former Vice-</u> <u>Chairman, NITI Aayog, and Professor,</u> <u>Columbia University will be the Chairman</u>.

• Dr Arvind Panagariya, former Vice-Chairman, NITI Aayog, and Professor, Columbia University will be the Chairman. Members of the Sixteenth Finance Commission would be notified separately. Shri Ritvik Ranjanam Pandey has been appointed as Secretary to the Commission.

<u>The Sixteenth Finance Commission shall</u> <u>make recommendations as to the following</u> <u>matters, namely: —</u>

(i) The distribution between the Union and the States of the net proceeds of taxes which are to be, or may be, divided between them under Chapter I, Part XII of the Constitution and the allocation between the States of the respective shares of such proceeds;

(ii) The principles which should govern the grants-in-aid of the revenues of the States out of the Consolidated Fund of India and the sums to be paid to the States by way of grants-in-aid of their revenues under article 275 of the Constitution for the purposes other than those specified in the provisos to clause (1) of that article; and

(iii) The measures needed to augment the Consolidated Fund of a State to supplement the resources of the Panchayats and Municipalities in the State on the basis of the

recommendations made by the Finance Commission of the State.

The Sixteenth Finance Commission may review the present arrangements on financing Disaster Management initiatives, with reference to the funds constituted under the **Disaster**

Management Act, 2005 (53 of 2005), and make appropriate recommendations thereon. The Sixteenth Finance Commission has been requested to make its report available by 31st day of October, 2025 covering a period of five years commencing on the 1st day of April, 2026.

2. Govt to extend RoDTEP benefits to ecommerce exports

• Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal said that the government has decided to extend the benefits of the exportboosting scheme Remission of Duties and

Taxes on Exported Products (RoDTEP) to ecommerce exports.

• The RoDTEP scheme, which came into effect three years ago, refunds the embedded noncreditable central, state, and local levies paid on inputs to exporters.

3. GST collection in December rises 10% YoY to '1.65 lakh crore

• Central and state governments collected **'1,64,882 crore ('1.65 trillion)** in goods and services tax (GST) revenue in December, a notch below the average so far this year of **'1.66 trillion per month, but still a 10.3%** jump from a year ago.

• The Centre and states had collected around '1.5 trillion in December 2022.

4. Goldman Sachs cuts India's CAD forecast, sees improving external balances

• Goldman Sachs has lowered its projection for India's current account deficit in 2024 to 1.3% of GDP from 1.9% earlier as the US bank expects services exports to continue surprising on the upside while crude oil prices are expected to decline, improving external balances.

5. PMI Manufacturing drops to 18-month low of 54.9 in December

• India's manufacturing activities continued to expand in December 2023.

• As per data released by S&P Global, the HSBC India Manufacturing Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI) slipped to an 18month low of 54.9 in December last year from 56.0 in the previous month.

• A PMI print below 50 means contraction, while one above it indicates expansion.

• The HSBC India Manufacturing PMI is compiled by S&P Global from responses to questionnaires sent to purchasing managers by a panel of around 400 manufacturers. The panel is stratified by detailed sector and company workforce size based on contributions to GDP.

6. Ind-Ra raises India's FY24 growth forecast to 6.7 pc from 6.2 pc

• India Ratings and Research upped GDP growth estimate for current fiscal to 6.7 per cent, from 6.2 per cent, citing resilient economy, sustained government capex and prospect of a new private corporate capex cycle.

• It flagged weak global growth and trade as risks which weighed down the growth estimates, besides volatile geopolitical situation.

• The RBI also expects a sequential slowdown in the GDP growth in the remaining two quarters and expects the overall FY24 GDP to come in at 7 per cent.



7. UN report revises India's GDP projection downward to 6.2% for 2024

• The United Nations World Economic Situation and Prospects Report 2024 revised India's gross domestic product (GDP) growth estimate for the 2024 calendar year to 6.2 per cent, compared to 6.7 per cent earlier.

• Despite revising the growth estimates for 2024 downward by 0.5 percentage points, the report projects a rebound in 2025, with a GDP growth projection of 6.6 per cent.

8. World Bank keeps India's FY25 GDP growth estimate unchanged at 6.4%

• The World Bank kept its FY25 economic growth projection for India unchanged at 6.4 per cent, mainly on account of strong domestic demand, rising public infrastructure spending and strong privatesector credit growth.

However, it projected that the private consumption growth might taper off due to high food inflation and diminishing pent-up demand.
In its biannual 'Global Economic Prospects' report, the World Bank said India was

anticipated to maintain the fastest growth rate among the world's largest economies, but its post-pandemic recovery was expected to slow, with estimated growth of

6.3 per cent in FY24, before recovering gradually to 6.5 per cent in FY26. • The multilateral development bank's

forecast did not take into account the National Statistical Office's (NSO's) the first advance estimates, released, which had projected 7.3 per cent growth for India in FY24 — higher than the Reserve Bank of India's estimate of 7 per cent — assuming an investment-led recovery.

9. India's outward FDI nosedives to \$2.25 billion in December: RBI data

• India's outward foreign direct investment (FDI) commitments fell sharply to \$2.25 billion in December 2023, compared to over \$4.12 billion in December 2022.

• Sequentially, they were also down from \$4.0 billion in November 2023, according to Reserve Bank of India (RBI) data.

• Outbound FDI, expressed as a financial commitment, comprises three components: equity, loans, and guarantees.

• The equity commitments declined to \$646.7 million in December 2023 from \$1.38 billion in December 2022. It was also significantly lower than the \$1.09 billion recorded in November 2023.

• Debt commitments decreased to \$625.91 million in December 2023, down from \$1.15 billion a year ago.

• However, it was higher than \$190.05 million in November 2023. Guarantees for overseas units

declined to \$978.19 million in December 2023 from \$1.58 billion in December 2022. They were down substantially compared to \$2.72 billion in November, RBI data showed.

10. India's industrial production grew 2.4 % in Nov 2023 ; Retail inflation inches up marginally to 5.69 % in December 2023
India's industrial production grew 2.4 per cent in November 2023.

Factory output measured in terms of the Index of Industrial Production (IIP) had grown by 7.6 per cent in November 2022.
The data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO) showed that the manufacturing sector's output grew by 1.2 per cent in November 2023.

• The mining production rose 6.8 per cent during the month under review while the Power output rose 5.8 per cent.

• Retail inflation, based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI), inched up marginally to 5.69 percent in December 2023 mainly on account of higher food prices but stayed within the Reserve Bank of India's target range for a fourth consecutive month.

• Retail Inflation was at 5.55 percent in November 2023 and 5.72 percent in December 2022.

• As per the data released by the National Statistical Office (NSO), retail inflation in the food basket was at 9.53 percent in December 2023, up from 8.7 per cent in the preceding month and 4.9 percent in the same month preceding year.

• The Reserve Bank of India has been tasked by the government to ensure retail inflation remains at 4 percent with a margin of 2 percent on either side.

11. Trade deficit falls to three-month low of \$19.8 billion in December

• India's trade deficit in December narrowed to a three-month low of \$19.8 billion amid an import slowdown due to falling commodity prices.

• Merchandise exports during the month grew 0.97 per cent over a year earlier to \$38.45 billion, contrary to the trend of a slowdown so far this financial year showed data by Commerce Ministry.

• Merchandise imports, meanwhile, grew 8.45 per cent to \$58.25 billion, boosted by gold imports.

12. Mahindra Group, Ontario Teachers' cosponsor InvIT in renewable energy space • Mahindra Group and global institutional investor Ontario Teachers' Pension Plan Board have co-sponsored an infrastructure investment trust (InvIT) holding assets of 1.54 GW in the renewable energy space in India. The offer was subscribed by global and Indian investors, including Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB).



• The InvIT, Sustainable Energy Infra Trust (SEIT), is India's largest InvIT in the renewable energy space and has raised primary capital of Rs 1,365 crore as part of the initial offer of units (offer).

About Infrastructure Investment Trust

• An Infrastructure Investment Trust (InvITs) is like a mutual fund, which enables direct investment of small amounts of money from possible individual/institutional investors in infrastructure to earn a small portion of the income as return.

• InvITs work like mutual funds or real estate investment trusts (REITs) in features.

• InvITs can be treated as the modified version of REITs designed to suit the specific

circumstances of the infrastructure sector. • <u>Sebi notified the Sebi (Infrastructure</u>

Investment Trusts) Regulations, 2014 on

September 26, 2014, providing for registration and regulation of InvITs in India.

• The objective of InvITs is to facilitate investment in the infrastructure sector.

• InvITS are like mutual funds in structure. InvITs can be established as a trust and registered with Sebi.

• An InvIT consists of four elements: 1) Trustee, 2) Sponsor(s), 3) Investment Manager and 4) Project Manager.

• The trustee, who inspects the performance of an InvIT is certified by Sebi and he cannot be an associate of the sponsor or manager.

• 'Sponsors' are people who promote and refer to any organisation or a corporate entity with a capital of Rs 100 crore, which establishes the InvIT and is designated as such at the time of the application made to Sebi, and in case of PPP projects, base developer.

• Promoters/sponsor(s), jointly, have to hold a minimum of 25 per cent for three years (at least) in the InvIT, excluding the situations where an administrative requirement or concession agreement needs the sponsor to hold some minimum percent in the special purpose vehicle. In these cases, the total value of the sponsor holding in the primary special purpose vehicle and in the InvIT should not be less than 25 per cent of the value of units of InvIT on post-issue basis.

• Investment manager is an entity or limited liability partnership (LLP) or organisation that supervises assets and investments of the InvIT and guarantees activities of the InvIT.

• Project manager refers to the person who acts as the project manager and whose duty is to attain the execution of the project and in case of PPP projects. It indicates that the entity is responsible for such execution and accomplishment of project landmark with respect to the agreement or other relevant project document.

13. Fitch says India poised to remain one of fastest-growing economies in world for next few years

• Fitch Ratings has said that India is poised to remain one of fastest-growing economies in the world in next few years. The rating agency has also affirmed India's Long-Term Foreign-Currency Issuer Default Rating (IDR) at 'BBB (minus)' with a stable outlook.

• Fitch has made an upward revision to India's growth forecast for fiscal year ending March 2023, with the growth rate now seen at 6.9 percent, as compared to a forecast of 6 percent issued in May last year. The GDP growth rate will, however, ease to 6.5 percent in fiscal year 2024-25, it said.

• Fitch stated that investment is likely to remain a key growth driver, as the government's capex drive is likely to continue and private investment should accelerate gradually.

14. Indian economy expected to grow at7.3% in current fiscal, says RBI Governor atWorld Economic Forum in Davos

• RBI Governor Shaktikanta Das stressed that according to the first advance estimate, released by the National Statistical Office (NSO), India's economy is expected to grow at 7.3 percent in FY2024.

• He said this at a chat as part of World Economic Forum (WEF) in Davos, Switzerland. Mr Das said that India's growth momentum will be maintained in the future years.

• He said that durable signs of India's growth momentum being maintained are visible. He said, it is not a one-off comment but is based on a lot of 'in-house' research and analysis. Mr Das informed that after a contraction of 5.8 percent in FY2021, the Indian economy grew by 9.1 percent in FY2022 and 7.2 percent in FY2023.

• Notably, global rating agency Fitch Ratings affirmed India's Long-Term Foreign-Currency Issuer Default Rating (IDR) at 'BBB-' with a stable outlook.

15. Goods & services exports marginally up at \$765.6 bn in 2023: Govt

• The country's exports of goods and services rose marginally by 0.4 per cent to \$765.6 billion in 2023 despite global economic uncertainties, according to the commerce ministry data.

• Goods exports in the last calendar year, however, contracted by 4.71 per cent to \$ 431.9 billion while services exports are estimated to have risen by 7.88 per cent to \$ 333.8 billion.



Sectors which helped keep India's exports afloat include electronics, pharmaceuticals, cotton yarn, fabrics and made-ups; ceramic products, meat, dairy and poultry products, fruits and vegetables and information technology.
The merchandise imports also dipped by 7 per cent to \$ 667.73 billion last year as against \$ 720.2 billion in 2022.

• The latest data for the services sector released by the RBI is for November 2023. The data for December 2023 is an estimation by the ministry.

• <u>The main export destinations for India are</u> the US, the UAE, the Netherlands, Bangladesh, the UK and Germany.

Goods shipments are impacted due to the Russia-Ukraine war, the Israel-Hamas conflict and the Red Sea trade route crisis due to attacks by Yemen-based Houthis on cargo ships.
According to international trade experts, if these challenges are prolonged, it will have major implications on global trade.

• Economic think-tank Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI) said that India's exports and imports have dipped by 2.6 per cent to \$ 1609 billion in 2023 compared to \$ 1651.9 billion in 2022.

• The negative trade balance the difference between exports and imports decreased from \$ 141.3 billion in 2022 to \$ 75.2 billion in 2023.

• The data for the current fiscal shows that the goods exports during April-December 2023 dipped by 5.7 per cent to \$ 317.12 billion.

• Imports contracted by 7.93 per cent to \$ 505.15 billion, leaving a trade deficit of \$ 188.02 billion in the first three quarters as against \$ 212.34 billion in April-December 2022.

16. Direct tax-to-GDP ratio at 23-year high in FY23: CBDT

• The government's direct tax-to-GDP ratio stood at a 23-year high of 6.11% in FY23, data released by the Central Board of Direct Taxes.

The Centre's direct tax collections rose 17.8% year-on-year at Rs 16.6 trillion in FY23.
Corporate tax collections during the year stood at Rs 8.26 trillion, up 16% on year, and income tax collections stood at Rs 8.33 trillion, 19.6% higher on year.

• Direct tax buoyancy ' rate of growth of tax mop-up in comparison to nominal GDP growth', however, stood at 1.2 in FY23 as compared to 2.5 in FY22. Statistically, the buoyancy of a tax system gauges the overall responsiveness of tax revenue to variations in the GDP, and tax policies over time.

• In H1 of FY24, the direct tax buoyancy stood at 3.0, due to sharp growth in income tax collections. Income tax buoyancy came in at 3.6 and corporate tax at 2.3.

• Further, the government's direct tax collections contribution to total tax mop-up stood at a fouryear high of 54.62% in FY23 from 52.27% in FY22, the CBDT data showed.

• Also, the cost of collection with respect to direct tax mop-up reduced to the lowest in 23 years at 0.51%. In FY23, total number of income tax returns filed stood at 77.82 million as compared to 73.05 million in FY22.

17. India business growth at four-month high in January: PMI

• India's business activity expanded at the fastest pace in four months in January on stronger demand, according to a private survey that also showed input costs rising at the quickest rate since August. The findings indicate Asia's thirdlargest economy would continue to hold onto its title as the fastest growing major economy in the near-term at least.

• India will grow 6.9% in the current fiscal year, as per Reuters poll.

• HSBC's flash India Composite Purchasing Managers' Index (PMI), compiled by S&P Global, rose to 61.0 this month, its highest since September, from December's final reading of 58.5.

18. Indian Railways cuts SUV mass transport rates by 33%

• According to officials aware of the matter, the new rates for transporting SUVs is 33% lower than the existing charges for moving large passenger vehicles.

• There was a demand from automobile transporters to rationalise rates since demand for large cars has risen in the Indian market.

• SUVs have become the rage with the share of such vehicles rising to 49% in the domestic passenger vehicle market in calendar year 2023. In comparison, the share of small cars, once the dominant category, fell to about 30% in the same period.

19. Gap between credit and deposit growth widens: RBI

• The gap between credit and deposit growth as of the first fortnight of January 2024 has widened vis-a-vis the last fortnight of September 2023 even as the former continues to outpace the latter on year-on-year (y-o-y) basis, going by RBI data.

• As on January 12, 2024, credit and deposit growth stood at 19.93 per cent and 12.84 per cent y-o-y, respectively, resulting in a gap of 7.09 percentage points between the two, per RBI data on scheduled banks' statement of position in India.

• In the last fortnight of September (22nd), the gap between credit growth (19.42 per cent y-o-y) and deposit growth (12.94 per cent) was relatively lower at 6.48 percentage points.



20. Policy consistency needed to expand production choices for farmers: FinMin

• Indian farmers can be encouraged to adopt technologies and practices through policy consistency and continuity, a finance ministry review of the Indian economy said.

• That will expand their market and production choices, keeping in view ecological considerations, natural resource availability, and demand, according to the review.

• The review stressed the need for continuous innovation in crop varieties, technology adoption, and farming to meet the growing demand for a diversified and nutritious food basket.

 Meanwhile, the review said the agricultural sector, which is estimated to constitute 18 per cent of India's gross value added (GVA) in FY24 and is the bedrock of

the economy, had demonstrated remarkable tenacity and resilience by contributing significantly to economic recovery and development despite the challenges posed by the global health crisis and variability in climate conditions.

• "Agriculture grew at a higher average annual rate of 3.7 per cent from FY15 to FY23 compared to 3.4 per cent from FY05 to FY14. For the year FY23, the sector grew at 4.0 per cent as compared to the previous year," the review said.

• In FY24, the first advanced estimate estimated GVA for agriculture and allied sector at a seven-year low of 1.8 per cent due to weak kharif output and initial weakness in rabi sowing.

• Planting has been affected due to the uneven monsoon in 2023.

• "India's global dominance extends across agricultural commodities, making it the largest producer of milk, pulses, and spices worldwide. Given opportunities and an appropriate policy setting, India's farmers have demonstrated their capability to meet food demand of the rest of the world. The potential is still huge," the review said.

• The review talked of the various policy initiatives that the Narendra Modi government had initiated for farmers since 2014 and how effective they had been.

"The policy initiatives, such as Pradhan Mantri Kisan Maandhan Yojana (PM-KMY), Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samman Nidhi (PM-KISAN), and Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana (PMFBY), have played a pivotal role in providing financial and income support to farmers," the review said.
It added **PM-KISAN**, launched in 2019, supplemented the financial needs of landbolding.

supplemented the financial needs of landholding farmers by transferring Rs 6,000 per year in three equal four-monthly instalments.

• "As of December 12, 2023, over Rs 2.8 lakh crore (Rs 2.8 trillion) have been transferred to

more than 11 crore (1110 million) beneficiaries," the review said.

21. Household consumption to revive in FY25, growth at 6.3%: Standard Chartered • Standard Chartered revised its FY25 forecast to 6.3% from 6%, projecting muted inflation and higher food spending to drive growth.

• The report expects a revival in consumption to offset the impact of lower commodity prices, slower global growth, and moderation in government capex.

22. India's employable youth up from 33.9% in 2014 to 51.3% in 2024: DEA

The Department of Economic Affairs, in its January 2024 review of the economy, said there is ample scope to mainstream skilling into education curriculum and upskilling a large chunk of the existing workforce into future-relevant skills on the back of a transformative journey in skill development in India in the last decade.
According to the report, the push to mass

skilling since 2014 has begun to pay dividends. "The employable percentage of final-year and pre-final-year students increased from 33.9% in 2014 to 51.3% in 2024," it said citing the findings of the online Wheebox National Employability Test.

• Further, the across-the-board progress in skilling has manifested in India's rising position in WorldSkills Competitions, from 39 in 2011 to 11 in 2022, it said.

• "Combined with the rising enrolment in higher education (from 3.2 crore in 2013-14 to 4.1 crore in 2020-21), rising employability implies that India's young workforce is both expanding and becoming increasingly employable," it said.

• According to the report, India has 50.2% of men and 41% of women with ten or more years of schooling in the 15-49 age group.

• "There is an opportunity to make the educationskill continuum the greatest weapon in the Indian Miracle by reaching out to each of these youth who only need to attend finishing schools for employability," it said.

• Under the National Education Policy, 2020, there is a special focus on vocational education and skill development. "Integration of vocational education with general education and mainstreaming of vocational education have been identified as key reforms in the country's education system," the report said.


• As per the Periodic Labour Force Survey 2022-23, 72.6% of workers aged 15-59 years did not receive any formal or informal vocational or technical training.

5. Drinking water access have reached 72% households in India: Union minister
Union Jal Shakti Minister Gajendra Singh Shekhawat said drinking water facilities have reached 72 per cent households in the country and the remaining will be completed by December 2024.

• When the Jal Jeevan Mission started in 2019, a little over 16 per cent of the households had access to drinking water facilities.

6. Union Minister of Health & Family Welfare Dr. Mansukh Mandaviya inaugurates the country's 1st Healthy & Hygienic Food Street, 'P

• Country's 1st Healthy & Hygienic Food Street, 'PRASADAM,' inaugurated at Neelkanth Van, Mahakal Lok, in Ujjain, Madhya Pradesh.

• The Union Health Minister launched the official website for the Healthy & Hygienic Food Street initiative.

• The Union Health Minister commended the development of infrastructure and facility near food streets including training and capacity building of street food vendors on food safety and hygiene.

• Dr. Mandaviya explored the vibrant stalls at the Eat Right Millets Melas and interacted with trained food handlers as well.

7. Health Ministry notifies revised Pharma manufacturing rules under schedule M to ensure quality control

• <u>The Union Health Ministry notified revised</u> <u>rules under Schedule M of the Drugs and</u> <u>Cosmetics Rules, 1945.</u> • Schedule M prescribes the Good Manufacturing Practices (GMP) for pharmaceutical products and the revised Schedule M has been notified as rules to ensure GMP is adhered to, and requirements of premises, plant, and equipment for pharmaceutical products.

• GMP is mandatory standards which builds and brings quality into a product by way of control on materials, methods, machines, processes, personnel, and

facility/environment, etc. GMP was first incorporated in Schedule M of the **Drugs and** Cosmetics Rules, 1945 in the year 1988 and the last amendment was done in June, 2005. • The revised rules is to be implemented on the basis of company turnovers where the medium and small manufacturers include those with an annual turnover of less than '250 crore who will have to implement the revised rules within 12 months from its date of publication, whereas large manufacturers with an annual turnover of over '250 crore will be given six months to do so. The revised Schedule M has 13 parts which provide GMP guidelines for the specific requirements for manufacturing pharmaceutical drugs. The revised rules has five new categories of drugs including pharmaceutical products containing hazardous substances such as sex hormones, steroids (anabolic and androgenic), cytotoxic substances, biological products and radiopharmaceuticals.

8. India's GDP likely to grow by 7.3% in FY24: NSO data

• India's economy is projected to grow at 7.3% in the ongoing financial year, as per the initial advance estimate report released by the National Statistical Office (NSO).

• At that pace, India will retain its crown as the fastest-growing major economy, following its 7.2% GDP growth in FY2022-23.

• In nominal terms, though, the projected growth for FY24 is 8.9%.

• The government anticipates a year-on-year Gross Value Added (GVA) growth of 6.9% for fiscal year 2024, slightly lower than the 7% recorded in fiscal year 2023.

9. DGCA Implements New Rules Flight Duty Time Rules for Flight Crew

• Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has increased weekly rest periods from 36 hours to 48 hours for flight crew. As per the revised flight duty time rules issued by DGCA, night duty will now cover the period from midnight to 6 am in the morning as compared to five am earlier.

• The maximum flight time and maximum flight duty period for flight operations encroaching night have been restricted to 8 hours flight time and 10 hours flight duty



period respectively. DGCA said that the changes in the regulations have been done to address pilot fatigue, enhance overall flight safety and balance growth in aviation sector.
According to the new rules, the number of landings has been limited to only two landings as compared to maximum permissible six landings under previous regulations during night operations. DGCA has mandated that all airline operators shall submit quarterly fatigue reports after analysis, including the Action Taken on such reports. <u>Airline operators are required to comply with revised regulations latest by 1st June, this year.</u>

• DGCA further said that it aims to transition towards a new regime of Fatigue Risk Management System (FRMS) that will be a datadriven approach to enhance monitoring of flight crew fatigue. Hailing the reforms, Civil Aviation Minister Jyotiraditya M. Scindia said that the introduction of the new regulations are in line with international best practices. He said that it will ensure that India has the necessary arsenal as it prepares to clinch the largest domestic aviation market title in the future.

• Directorate General of Civil Aviation is an attached office of the Ministry of Civil Aviation.

• The Directorate General of Civil Aviation is the regulatory body in the field of Civil Aviation primarily dealing with safety issues. It is responsible for regulation of air transport services to/from/within India and for enforcement of civil air regulations, air safety and airworthiness standards.

10. ONGC starts oil production from its flagship deep-sea project in Krishna Godavari basin in Bay of Bengal
State-owned Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) has started oil production from its flagship deep-sea project in <u>Krishna Godavari basin</u> in Bay of

Bengal.
ONGC has started producing from the Cluster-2 project in KG-DWN-98/2 block and will slowly ramp up output

• The project is expected to add 7 percent to current national oil production and 7 percent to national Natural Gas production. It is situated offshore the Godavari river delta in the Bay of Bengal. It is located 35 kilometres off the coast of Andhra Pradesh in water depths ranging from 300-3,200 metres.

• The discoveries in the block are divided into three clusters -- Cluster-1, 2 and 3. Cluster 2 is being put to production first.

11. GI tags for over 17 products from Odisha, Arunachal Pradesh, West Bengal, and J&K

• The traditional Lanjia Saura paintings, the exquisitely embroidered Dongaria Kondh

shawl, the delicious Khajuri Guda from Odisha and the Handmade Carpets and Wancho Wooden Craft from Arunachal

Pradesh were among the 17 products that bagged the Geographical Indications (GI) tag. • The Lanjia Saura paintings are a style of wall mural art. Those paintings also called *ekons* or the *idital*, and have a significant spiritual importance for the tribe. The Lanjia Sauras are an indigent society today, and labour in preserving their culture – the *iditals* being an important part of it.

• The traditional knitted shawls of the hill tribe Dongaria Kondh are both unique and ancient. Their culture, tradition, faith, and beliefs, as well as the biodiversity of their forests are reflected in the shawls. Dharanipenu, the much adored goddess of the Dongaria, has a home in every village. The art and drawings made in the Dharanipenu residence are reflected in their shawls. Although the modern world has had significant impact on their traditional apparel, the Dongaria shawl continues to be popular with the tribe.

• Odisha's *Khajuri Guda* (date palm jaggery) is a natural sweetener produced from the sweet juice of palm called *neera*. The jaggery is prepared by the tribal populations, including the Lanjia Saura, of Gajapati, Boudh, Angul, and Dhenkanal districts in Odisha.

• From Arunachal Pradesh, the Wancho Wooden Craft intimately weaves into the socio-cultural fabric of the skilful Wancho of Longding and Changlong districts. This rare ethnic art has been practiced by these Wancho tribes since many a generation. It is used both to decorate their own drawing rooms and also as a gift to beloved friends. In the past, the Wanchos would make wood carvings to decorate the posts and log drums in the *paa* or *paang* (boys' dormitory) or to decorate the village chief's house.

• Apart from that, GI tag has also given tags to three products from West Bengal – the **Tangail Saree of Bengal, Garad Saree and Korial saree. Odisha's Dhenkanal Magji, a milk product and Similipal Kai Chutney also got a GI tag**. The 'Kai' is indigenous to Mayurbhanj and Keonjhar which are found in abundance in the jungles of every block areas of the districts. The Kai Chutney prepared from these Kai is the main source of protection to the health and safety measures of the local tribes. The tribes in the Mayurbhanj and Keonjhar District commonly use the chutney as a delicious food and traditional medicine to treat different aliments in their daily life.

• The Nayagarh Kanteimundi Brinjal, a vegetable crop with lots of prickly thorns on the flesh as well as the whole plant grown



in whole of Nayagarh district of Odisha also received a tag.

The other products that were given a GI tag are West Bengal's Kalonunia Rice, West Bengal's Sundarban Honey, Gujarat's Kachchhi Kharek; Jammu Kashmir's Ramban Anardana; Koraput Kalajeera Rice and the Arunachal Pradesh Adi Kekir (Ginger).
12. Launch of the Traditional Medicine Morbidity codes of Ayurveda, Siddha and Unani Chapter

• The data and terminology relating to diseases based on Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani systems will now be included in the WHOs ICD11 classification. ICD 11 TM Module 2, Morbidity Codes, World Health Organization launch event will be held in New Delhi on 10th January, 2024.

• The data and terminology relating to diseases based on Ayurveda, Siddha, and Unani systems will now be included in the ICD11 classification of WHO.

• This effort will lead to global uniformity in <u>ASU</u> (Ayurveda, Unani, and Siddha) medicine as a code of vocabulary defining diseases. The World Health Organization (WHO) has developed a classification series called International Classification of Diseases (ICDs) to classify diseases internationally.

• The global data on diseases currently available is mainly based on healthcare practices to be diagnosed through modern biomedicine. The classification of data and terminology relating to diseases based on Ayush systems such as Ayurveda, Siddha, Unani etc. is not yet included in the WHO ICD series.

• Central Bureau of Health Intelligence (CBHI) is an agency under the Ministry of Health and Family Welfare that serves as the WHO Collaboration Centre for ICDrelated activities.

• It facilitates the collection and dissemination of data on various diseases and mortality. <u>The</u> <u>Ministry of Ayush has already developed the</u> <u>Code for Ayurveda, Siddha, and Unani</u> <u>Medicine through the National Ayush</u> <u>Morbidity and Standardized Electronic</u> <u>Portal (NAMSTE).</u>

• The Ministry of Ayush in collaboration with WHO has prepared a categorization of data and terminology related to diseases based on Ayush -Ayurveda, Siddha, and Unani systems under TM2 module of ICD11 series. The Ministry of AYUSH has also signed a Donor Agreement with the World Health Organization for the same.

• Infectious diseases like Malaria and lifestyle diseases like chronic insomnia are included in this classification.

• Ayurveda, Siddhas, and Unani, Vertigo Guidance Disorder (parent name), commonly recognized by the three traditional systems, as a nervous system disorder known in Ayurveda as 'Bhramaha' siddha as 'Ajal Kirkrippu' and in Unani as 'Sadra-o-Dwar'.

13. DoT makes mandatory M2M, WPAN/WLAN registration to all entities • Department of Telecommunications (DoT), Ministry of Communications (MoC), has extended machine-to-machine (M2M) and Wireless Personal Area Network/Wireless Local Area Network (WPAN/WLAN) registration to all entities engaged in the businesses.

• All business entities including companies, government departments, organizations, partnership firms, LLPs, institutions, undertakings, proprietorship firms, societies and trusts engaged in M2M service provisioning and WPAN/WLAN connectivity provisioning are advised to register with DoT through a simple and transparent online process via SaralSanchar portal.

• **WPAN:** A small-scale wireless network that requires little or no infrastructure and operates within a short range. A WPAN is typically used by a few devices in a single room instead of connecting the devices with cables.

• WLAN: A wireless local-area network (WLAN) is a group of colocated computers or other devices that form a network based on radio transmissions rather than wired connections. A

Wi-Fi network is a type of WLAN; anyone connected to Wi-Fi while reading this webpage is using a WLAN.

• 'SARALSANCHAR'(Simplified Application For Registration and Licenses) a Web based Portal, for Issuing of various types of Licenses and Registration certificates is part of various Digital initiatives being taken by Department of Telecommunications. It is a unified portal to issue various types of Licenses and registrations in a digitized manner which will not only ensure transparency but also make the process more efficient. This will pave the way for a paperless, secure and hasslefree platform for various applicants.

• The Portal in its present form covers receipt of applications from applicants for issue of new Unified Licenses and WPC Licenses

15. Mumbai Trans Harbour Link, India's longest sea bridge, inaugurated Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the country's longest bridge over the sea, the 22 km Mumbai Trans Harbour Link, officially the Atal Setu Nhava Sheva Sea Link.

• The bridge that was first conceptualised six decades ago will cut the travel time between Sewri and Chirle to under 20 minutes.

• <u>The Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL) is</u> <u>a 22-km-long twin-carriageway six-lane</u> <u>bridge over the Thane Creek in the Arabian</u> <u>Sea, connecting Sewri in the island city of</u> <u>Mumbai to Chirle in Raigad district on the</u> <u>mainland.</u>

• The MTHL includes a 16.5 km sea link and viaducts on land at either end with a cumulative length of 5.5 km.

• The idea of a bay crossing connecting Mumbai to the mainland was first floated in 1963 by the American construction consultancy firm Wilbur Smith Associates, but no follow-up action was initiated. The plan was revived in the late 90s, and the first tenders were floated in 2006.

16. L&T wins Rs 10,000 crore electrification order for high-speed rail project

• Larsen & Toubro (L&T) announced it has secured a mega contract from an authorised Japanese agency to construct an electrification system for the Mumbai-Ahmedabad High-Speed rail project in India.

• Valued in the range of Rs 10,000 crore to Rs 15,000 crore, the project, according to company executives, is the largest single rail-electrification order in India.

• The company said this would be the first of its kind railway project in India involving the implementation of Japanese Shinkansen .

• The newly created posts are required to assist the Commission in carrying out its functions. All other posts in the Commission have already been created as per the delegated powers.

• As per provisions given in **Article 280** of the Constitution of India, the <u>President of India can</u> <u>constitute the Finance Commission and give its</u> <u>recommendations on the distribution of tax</u> <u>between the State Governments and Union</u> <u>Government and also amongst the states</u> <u>themselves.</u>

21. Centre's new guidelines bar coaching centres from enrolling students below 16 years of age

• Ministry of Education has issued 'Regulation of Coaching Centers 2024', saying that no coaching center shall enroll students below 16 years of age.

• The Guidelines stressed that student enrolment should be done only after secondary school examination. Coaching Centres have been directed not to make misleading promises or guarantee of rank or good marks to parents & students

• Education Ministry said, these guidelines prioritize mental well-being, fair practices, and inclusivity.

• The guidelines stress the need for State and UT governments to regulate these centers and refer to legal actions, such as the PIL in the Supreme Court and letters sent to states and UTs. Fair and reasonable fee, a proper grievance redressal system and infrastructure requirements are some of the rules coaching centres must follow. The Guidelines also proposes a model framework for coaching centers and outlines the procedures for registration, renewal, and cancellation of coaching center certificates, along with an appeal process.

• Coaching centres cannot engage tutors who do not have qualifications less than the graduation level.

• The Guidelines stated that the number of unregulated private coaching centers in the country continues to grow in the absence of any laid down policy or regulation.

• There are instances of such centers charging exorbitant fees from students, causing undue stress on students resulting in students committing suicides.

22. Ather Energy announces its new familyoriented electric scooter 'Rizta'

• To enhance efficiency of the Electronic Toll Collection system and provide seamless movement at the Toll Plazas, NHAI has taken 'One Vehicle, One FASTag' initiative that aims to discourage user behavior of using single FASTag for multiple vehicles or linking multiple FASTags to a particular vehicle.

• NHAI is also encouraging FASTag users to complete 'Know Your Customer' (KYC) process of their latest FASTag by updating KYC as per RBI guidelines. FASTags with valid balance but with incomplete KYC will get deactivated/blacklisted by banks post 31st January 2024.

• FASTag operated by the National Highway Authority of India (NHAI) is an electronic toll collection system.

• Laced with **Radio Frequency Identification** (**RFID**) technology, the tag is affixed on the windscreen of the vehicle and enables you to drive through toll plazas without stopping for transactions.

• NHAI launched two mobile Apps – **MyFASTag** and **FASTag Partner** to facilitate the availability of FASTags.

• The tag is valid for **5 years** from the date of issuance and comes in seven different colour codes

• <u>The National Highways Authority of India</u> (NHAI) is a government agency established



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in 1988 under the National Highways Authority of India Act, 1988.

• NHAI operates under the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways, Government of India.

• The 3-storey Mandir is built in the traditional **Nagara style Pink sandstone** from Mirzapur and the hills of Bansi-Paharpur area in Bharatpur district of Rajasthan has been used in the construction of the temple.

• It has been built at an estimated cost of Rs

1,800 crore and has an overall area of 71 acres. • The total width is 250 feet and height is

161 feet.The main temple area spans 2.67 acre. The

temple has 390 pillars, 46 doorways and 5 mandaps.

• In the main Garbh Griha, there are idols of Ram Lalla. The temple also has multiple mandaps, including Rang Mandap & Nritya Mandap.

• Devotees will enter the temple after climbing 32 steps, scaling a height of 16.11 ft from the ground before entering through Singh Dwar.

• <u>Mysuru sculptor Arun Yogiraj crafted the</u> <u>idol of five-year-old Ram Lalla, now</u> <u>installed in the `Garbh Griha'. The idol is 51</u> inches tall.

• No iron has been used in the construction of the temple. The temple is built to last at least a 1,000 years.

• The temple is surrounded by a rectangular parikrama called Parkota.

• Four temples stand on the periphery of the Parkota, of Goddess Bhagwati, Lord Shiva, Lord Surya & Lord Ganesha. A temple to Lord Hanuman is on the southern arm and one to Maa Annapurna on the northern arm.

• Each team will comprise 13-15 commandos and the competition will be held in five phases in a week, wherein the participants' skill, endurance and teamwork will be tested.

• The commandos will be judged by an expert team from the Intelligence Bureau (IB).

30. DGCA slaps Rs 1.10 crore penalty on Air India for safety violations

 Aviation regulator Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) has imposed a penalty of Rs 1.10 crore on Air India for safety violations amid a series of incidents of flight irregularities.

The safety violations took place on certain longrange terrain critical routes, the DGCA said.
More details of the penalty and the specific incident for which the penalty has been imposed are yet to be disclosed by the DGCA.

• Recently, IndiGo was fined Rs 1.20 crore as the passengers of one of its flights came out on the tarmac and started eating food. Union Minister Jyotiraditya Scindia strongly reacted to the incident and said it was unacceptable.

31. Cabinet approves setting-up of two coal gasification plants in West Bengal and Odisha with a target of 100 metric ton coal • The Government has approved that Coal India Limited (CIL) will set up two Coal Gasification Plants with a view to achieve the target of 100 MT coal gasification by the year 2030 and to fulfil India's dual objectives of self-reliance and energy independence.

Briefing media after the Union Cabinet meeting, Union Minister for Coal Pralhad Joshi said that total investment in the joint venture of CIL and GAIL for the proposed Coal-to-Synthetic Natural Gas at Sonepur Bazari Area of Eastern Coalfields Limited in West Bengal will be of 13 thousand 52 crore rupees.
Mr Joshi informed that for CIL and BHEL Joint Venture for the proposed Coal-to-Ammonium Nitrate at Mahanadi Coalfields Limited in Jharsuguda district of Odisha will be 11 thousand 782 crore rupees. He informed that by 2028 - 29 these projects will be operationalised.

• The Centre has also approved a proposal for equity investment for setting up of Coal-to-Synthetic Natural Gas Project through a Joint venture of Coal India Limited - CIL and Gas Authority of India Limited- GAIL. It has also approved for setting up of the Coal-to-Ammonium Nitrate Project through a Joint venture of CIL and Bharat Heavy Electrical Limited- BHEL.

32. Investment Forum for Advancing Climate Resilient Agrifood Systems in India Launched

• NITI Aayog, Ministry of Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare (MoA&FW), Government of India, and Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) of the United Nations jointly launched the 'Investment Forum for Advancing Climate Resilient Agrifood Systems in India' in New Delhi.

• This initiative aims to develop an investment and partnership strategy to advance climate resilient agrifood systems among the government, private sectors, and farmers' organizations and financial institutions in India.

33. India's first indigenously designed and manufactured aircraft seat launched at Wings India 2024

• In a groundbreaking event for the Indian aviation industry, Bengaluru based Engineering Company <u>Timetooth</u> has launched India's first-ever aircraft passenger seat at Wings India 2024.

• Amitav Chaudhuri, Co-Founder and Director of Timetooth said the company has launched this seat in collaboration with DGCA after identifying a gap in the Indian aviation industry.

34. ONGC receives petroleum ministry nod to form green energy subsidiary

• Oil and Natural Gas Corporation (ONGC) said it has received approval from the Petroleum and Natural Gas Ministry for the formation of a subsidiary company for green energy and gas business.

• The subsidiary will engage in businesses related to green hydrogen, hydrogen blending, renewable energy including solar, wind and hybrid, bio-fuels and bio-gas business and LNG.

• <u>The proposed name of the company is</u> <u>`ONGC Green Limited' subject to the</u> <u>approval of the Ministry of Corporate</u> <u>Affairs, Govt. of India.</u>

• ONGC board also gave its in-principle nod for the formation of a joint venture with NTPC Green Energy Limited (NGEL).

• The Board has accorded its in-principle approval for the formation of a Joint Venture Company (JVC) either directly by ONGC or through its Affiliate/Subsidiary, with NGEL – a wholly owned subsidiary of NTPC Limited, subject to necessary Government/ regulatory approval(s) including from NITI Aayog, DIPAM and Administrative Ministry

• On January 18, ONGC said its overseas investment unit ONGC Videsh received a five-year \$420 million loan from DBS Bank and Bank of Baroda.

• The new loan is the refinancing of a \$500 million loan ONGC Videsh had received in 2019 for a project in Mozambique.



35. Oil regulator PNGRB launches drive to increase piped gas adoption

• Oil regulator PNGRB has launched a twomonth long nationwide drive to increase adoption of piped natural gas as a cooking fuel in household kitchens in an attempt to cut dependence on imported fossil-fuels.

• "The Petroleum and Natural Gas Regulatory Board (PNGRB) along with city gas distribution entities will run a campaign from January 26 to March 31.

• This aims to promote the adoption of piped natural gas (PNG) among households and to expand PNG consumer base across a broader segment of the population,".

• While PNG has gained currency in the last few years after PNGRB expanded city gas networks to most parts of the country, sizable households continue to use either LPG or conventional fuels like firewood and cow dung for cooking.

While India is about 50 per cent dependent on imports to meet cooking gas LPG needs, use of conventional fuels is considered a health hazard.
Promotion of natural gas is part of the Prime Minister's vision to increase its share in India's energy basket to 15 per cent by 2030, from the current 6.2 per cent to transform the country into a gas-based economy.

• Indraprastha Gas Ltd is partnering with PNGRB for the drive in the national capital. Other CGD entities are doing the same in other cities.

36. THDC dedicates India's largest Green Hydrogen pilot project

THDC India Limited, a leading Power Sector PSU, has also established a benchmark in Green Hydrogen production, by successfully implementing India's one of the first pilot project aligned with the "National Green Hydrogen Mission" on the auspicious occasion of 75th Republic Day.

38. Centre allows woman employees to nominate son, daughter for family pension

• In a path-breaking decision with farreaching socio-economic impact, the Centre has allowed woman employees to nominate her son or daughter for family pension, instead of her husband, according to an official statement issued.

• Previously, family pension was granted to the spouse of a deceased government servant or pensioner, while other family members became eligible only after the spouse's ineligibility or demise.

• Union Minister of State for Personnel Jitendra Singh said that the Department of Pensions and Pensioners' Welfare (DoPPW) has introduced an amendment to the **Central Civil Services**

(Pension) Rules, 2021, allowing female

government employees or pensioners to grant family pension to their eligible child/children after their own demise, in place of of their spouse.

• If the female government servant or pensioner passes away during the proceedings, the family pension will be disbursed accordingly, the statement said.

• If a woman employee is survived by a widower with no eligible child, the family pension will be payable to the widower, it said.

39. Union Home Minister launches computerization scheme for offices of ARDBs, RCSs of states

• Union Home Minister and Minister of Cooperation Amit Shah launched the computerization scheme for the offices of the Registrar of Cooperative Societies (RCSs) and Agriculture and Rural Development Banks (ARDBs) of the states in New Delhi.

• It also aims to reduce transaction costs, facilitate loan distribution to farmers, and enable real-time data access for better monitoring

• The Computerization Project of Agricultural and Rural Development Banks (ARDBs) aims to computerize 1851 units of ARDBs located in 13 States and UTs and link them with NABARD through Common National Software.

• This initiative of the Ministry of Cooperation will work to enhance the operations, efficiency, accountability, and transparency of ARDB by standardising business processes through the Common Accounting System and Management Information System.



International

1. France becomes first European country to issue digital Schengen visas

• France will become the first European country to issue digital Schengen visas to visitors for the upcoming Paris Olympics.

• France has announced plans to shift entirely to online procedures for 70,0000 French Schengen Visas, in a move that aligns with the EU's digitalization plans.

France began operations of the "Olympic Consulate" system from January 1, 2024.
Last year, the European Union announced plans to turn the Schengen visa digital. In November, European Union foreign ministers adopted a change to shift the process of applying for visas to visit the Schengen area to an online platform.
Once enforced, this will eliminate the need for visa applicants to obtain a sticker in their passport, streamlining the application process and doing away with consulate or service provider appointments.

• The Schengen area includes 23 of the 27 EU member countries, along with associated neighbours Switzerland, Norway, Iceland, and Liechtenstein.

Upon approval following cross-verification with databases, applicants will be provided with a cryptographically signed barcode for either printing or storing on a device. However, individuals applying for the first time or those with new passports or modified biometric data may still necessitate an in-person appointment.
Every individual entering the European Union, regardless of possessing visas or visa waivers, will go through processing via the automated EU Entry/Exit System (EES), expected to be in operation by the conclusion of 2024. The EES will record individuals' particulars, biometric data, entry and exit dates, facilitating the monitoring of overstays and instances of refused entries.

2. Kyrgyzstan declares snow leopard national symbol

• Kyrgyzstan has officially declared the snow leopard as its national symbol, underscoring its commitment to conservation and ecological balance.

• A decree signed by President Sadyr Zhaparov of the Kyrgyz Republic, states: The snow leopard is not only a symbol of natural wealth and cultural prosperity, but also an indicator of the stability and health of the mountain ecosystem

• In ancient Kyrgyz culture, Panthera uncia, or the snow leopard, held significance as a totem animal linked to the legendary hero of the Kyrgyz people, Manas.

• Within Kyrgyz culture, the snow leopard symbolizes greatness, nobility, courage, bravery, and resilience.

Kyrgyzstan has taken a leading role in snow leopard conservation at the international level, hosting the inaugural Global Snow Leopard Forum in 2013 in the capital, Bishkek.
During this event, the Bishkek Declaration on Snow Leopard Protection was unanimously adopted. Additionally, the Global Snow Leopard and Ecosystem Protection Programme (GSLEP) was initiated with the collaboration of representatives from 12 snow leopard range countries and the global environmental community to safeguard these majestic mountain cats.

• **Snow Leopard:** Cloaked in a dense white-gray fur spotted with prominent black rosettes, snow leopards are inhabitants of high mountainous terrain. Often referred to as the 'ghosts of the mountains,' these elusive creatures effortlessly blend into their surroundings, becoming nearly indistinguishable in their natural habitat.

• Known for their climbing prowess, snow leopards navigate steep slopes with ease due to their powerful build. Their hind legs grant them the ability to leap six times the length of their bodies, while a long tail provides agility, balance, and acts as protection against the cold, wrapping around the resting snow leopard.

• The habitat of snow leopards spans the mountainous regions of 12 countries in Asia, including Afghanistan, Bhutan, China, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyz Republic, Mongolia, Nepal, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan.

• According to the World Wildlife Organization, this extensive range covers approximately 772,204 square miles, with China hosting 60% of the habitat. Notably, over 70% of the snow leopard's habitat remains unexplored.

3. World Bank raises GBP 1.5 billion in 5year sustainable development bond

• The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development (IBRD), representing the World Bank, has successfully priced a 5year bond in Great British Pound sterling (GBP) set to mature in October 2028.

• The Sustainable Development Bond aims to raise GBP 1.5 billion from investors, contributing to financing sustainable development initiatives in World Bank member countries.

4. IIT Madras to open new campus at Kandy in Sri Lanka

• Sri Lanka's Education minister Dr. Susil Premajayantha has said that a new campus of IIT Madras would be started in Kandy in Sri Lanka.

• The minister said that the proposal was part of the Budget 2024 presented by Sri Lanka President Ranil Wickremasinghe in his capacity as Finance Minister.



• IIT Madras has previously established a presence in Zanzibar.

• Earlier in December it was announced that IIT Delhi is scheduled to inaugurate a campus in Abu Dhabi, while IIT Madras has established a presence in Zanzibar, focusing

on addressing the educational needs of African countries. This initiative underscores the internationalization efforts within the Indian education sector.

5. Bhutan's Tshering Tobgay to become PM for second time

• Bhutanese voters have elected Tshering Tobgay to become Prime Minister for a second time after his party won nearly twothirds of seats, the election commission said in results released on January 10.

• Mr. Tobgay, head of the liberal People's Democratic Party (PDP), who served as prime minister of the Himalayan kingdom from 2013 to 2018, won 30 of 47 seats.

6. US and UK carry out strikes against Iranbacked Houthis in Yemen

• The US and UK militaries launched strikes against Houthi targets in Houthi-controlled areas of Yemen, marking a significant response after the Biden administration and its allies warned that the Iran-backed militant group would bear the consequences of its attacks on commercial shipping in the Red Sea. British Prime Minister Rishi Sunak.

7. Sweden set to become NATO member as Turkey approves its membership bid

• Turkey's parliament ratifies Sweden's NATO membership bid, clearing the biggest remaining hurdle to expanding the Western military alliance after 20 months of delay.

• Turkey's general assembly, where President Tayyip Erdogan's ruling alliance holds a majority, voted 287-55 to approve the application that Sweden first made in 2022. All NATO members need to approve applications from countries seeking to join the alliance.

• However, the opener has said that he will keep himself available for selection in the Champions Trophy in 2025.

• Warner is Australia's sixth-highest run scorer in the ODI format and is only second to former captain Ricky Ponting's tally for most Centuries for Australia in ODIs.

"record-breaking" \$300 million.
Backed by celebrity franchise owners and featuring the best players in international cricket, IPL has become the world's richest T20 tournament with an estimated brand value of \$8.4 billion.

• It has been a cash cow for the Indian cricket board (BCCI) with the 10-team league's 2023-27 media rights fetching \$6.2 billion.

• Tata Group has been the title sponsor of both the men's IPL and the Women's Premier League, which took off last year.

According to recent report, The total brand value of the Indian Premier League (IPL) grew a whopping 28% after the 2023 season, reaching \$10.7 billion (roughly '89,232 crore), brand valuation consultancy Brand Finance has said in a report. The brand value of India's flagship sports event has grown 433% since its launch in 2008.
The consultancy judged Mumbai Indians to be the most valuable franchise brand in

the Indian Premier League, valued at \$87 million.

• Mahendra Singh Dhoni-led Chennai Super Kings is second on the list with a brand value of \$81 million.

• Kolkata Knight Riders (KKR) and RCB follow CSK at \$78.6 million and \$69.8 million respectively.

• Gujarat Titans is the biggest gainer as far as the brand value is concerned -- it jumped from 8th position last year to 5th this time. Its brand value increased 38% this year.

Indian tennis veteran Rohan Bopanna, 43, has made history as the oldest player to reach the men's doubles tennis World No. 1 spot. Partnering with Australian Mathew Ebden, they secured a semi-final spot at the Australian Open.

Starting with a career-high No. 3 ranking, their recent win against 6th-seeded Maximo Gonzalez and Andres Molteni highlighted their teamwork.
Bopanna's consistent success, including winning the 2023 Indian Wells tournament, sets a new record, making him the oldest first-time World No. 1.



15. Australian Open: India's Rohan Bopanna and his Australian partner Matthew Ebden win Men's Doubles title

• In the men's doubles final of the Australian Open, India's Rohan Bopanna won his first Grand Slam title in men's doubles as he, along with Matthew Ebden, beat the all-Italian duo of Simone Bolelli and Andrea Vavassori 7-6, 7-5 in the Australian Open final.

• Rohan Bopanna, who made his Grand Slam debut in 2006, finally won his maiden tennis major at the 2017 French Open after clinching the mixed doubles crown with Canadian partner Gabriela Dabrowski. The win puts Rohan Bopanna in an elite list of four Indians, besides Leander Paes, Mahesh Bhupathi and Sania Mirza, to have won a Grand Slam.

• The Indian tennis star also made the mixed doubles finals of the 2018 and 2023 Australian Opens with Timea Babos and Sania Mirza, respectively, and played in the US Open 2023 men's doubles decider with Matthew Ebden. Unfortunaltely, he lost all three.

• Rohan Bopanna represented India at the London 2012 and Rio 2016 Olympics.

• With this, Ola Electric has become the first e2W (electric two-wheeler) company to be certified under the scheme, which includes several other applicants such as Hero MotoCorp, TVS Motor Company, and Bajaj Auto, etc.

3. 37 more products brought under Simplified Certification Scheme

• The Telecommunication Engineering Centre TEC of Department of Telecommunications DoT has brought 37 more products under Simplified Certification scheme SCS.

• These products include media gateway, IP security equipment, IP terminals, optical fibre or cable, transmission terminal equipment, etc. With this, the total products under SCS have now gone up to 49 from 12.

• **Presently, there are 60 telecom and networking products** that have been notified under the Mandatory Testing and Certification of Telecommunication Equipment (MTCTE) regime.

4. J&K becomes first UT to implement PM Vishwakarma Yojana

• Jammu and Kashmir has become the first Union Territory (UT) to implement the PM Vishwakarma Yojana (PMVY), an initiative that aims to empower and enhance the skills of the craftsman community, officials said. The inauguration of the training programme for the first batch of 30 trainees (Viswakarmas) in 'darzi craft' was virtually conducted.

About PM Vishwakarma :

• PM Vishwakarma, a Central Sector Scheme, was launched on **<u>17th September</u>**, **<u>2023</u>** by the Prime Minister to provide end-to-end support to artisans and craftspeople who work with their hands and tools.

• The Scheme covers artisans and craftspeople engaged in 18 trades, viz. Carpenter (Suthar/Badhai), Boat Maker, Armourer, Blacksmith (Lohar), Hammer and Tool Kit Maker, Locksmith, Goldsmith (Sonar), Potter (Kumhaar), Sculptor (Moortikar, stone carver), Stone breaker, Cobbler (Charmkar)/ Shoesmith/Footwear artisan, Mason (Rajmistri), Basket/Mat/Broom Maker/Coir Weaver, Doll & Toy Maker (Traditional), Barber (Naai), Garland maker (Malakaar), Washerman (Dhobi), Tailor (Darzi) and Fishing Net Maker.BENEFITS TO THE ARTISANS AND CRAFTS PERSONSThe Scheme envisages provisioning of the following benefits to the artisans and crafts persons: • **Becognition**: Becognition of artisans and

• **Recognition**: Recognition of artisans and craftspeople through PM Vishwakarma certificate and ID card.

• **Skill Upgradation**: Basic Training of 5-7 days and Advanced Training of 15 days or more, with a stipend of Rs. 500 per day.

• **Toolkit Incentive**: A toolkit incentive of upto Rs. 15,000 in the form of e-vouchers at the beginning of Basic Skill Training.

• **Credit Support**: Collateral free 'Enterprise Development Loans' of upto Rs. 3 lakh in two tranches of Rs. 1 lakh and Rs. 2 lakh with tenures of 18 months and 30 months, respectively, at a concessional rate of interest fixed at 5%, with Government of India subvention to the extent of 8%. Beneficiaries who have completed Basic Training will be eligible to avail the first tranche of credit support of upto Rs. 1 lakh. The second loan tranche will be available to beneficiaries who have availed the 1st tranche and maintained a standard loan account and have adopted digital transactions in their business or have undergone Advanced Training.

• Incentive for Digital Transaction: An amount of Re. 1 per digital transaction, upto maximum 100 transactions monthly will be



credited to the beneficiary's account for each digital pay-out or receipt.

The scheme encompasses five ongoing subschemes namely Atmosphere and Climate Research-Modelling Observing Systems and Services (ACROSS), Ocean Services, Modelling Application, Resources and Technology (O-SMART), Polar Science and Cryosphere Research (PACER), Seismology and Geosciences (SAGE) and Research, Education, Training and Outreach (REACHOUT).

6. Ministry of Education launches PRERANA program

The VAIBHAV fellows are expected to collaborate with their Indian counterparts and help initiate research activities in the host institution in the cutting-edge areas of Science and Technology.

• It is a vital component in the country's efforts to reduce dependence on fossil fuels and combat climate change. Rooftop solar energy holds great promise for consumers, as it has the potential to contribute significantly to overall power cost reduction and enhance energy security.

13. Pradhan Mantri Suryoday Yojana: REC Ltd made nodal agency; to lend Rs 1.2 lakh cr

1. Slight Declines In Insurance Penetration, Female Policyholders' Proportion: IRDAI Report 2022-23

• Despite IRDAI's goal of 'Insurance for All' by 2047, life insurance penetration dropped marginally to 3 per cent in 2022-23 from 3.2 per cent in the previous year.

• India's overall insurance penetration reduced to 4 per cent in 2022-23 from 4.2 per cent in 2021-22, indicating a developmental slowdown in the sector.

• Despite IRDAI's goal of 'Insurance for All'

by 2047, life insurance penetration dropped marginally to 3 per cent in 2022-23 from 3.2 per cent in the previous year.

• Non-life insurance penetration remained stagnant at 1 per cent.

• India's overall insurance penetration reduced to 4 per cent in 2022-23 from 4.2 per cent in 2021-22, indicating a developmental slowdown in the sector.

• While insurance density, measured as premiums collected per capita, saw a slight increase in life insurance from USD 69 to USD 70, non-life insurance density remained unchanged. Overall, insurance density rose marginally from USD 91 to USD 92 in 2022-23.

2. India's mineral production up 13.1% in October 2023

• The union ministry of mines has said India's mineral production index for October 2023 was 13.1% higher than in the same month last year.

Citing provisional statistics from the Indian Bureau of Mines (IBM), it said cumulative growth for April-October was 9.4% year-on-year.
production of lignite, copper concentrate, bauxite, chromite and phosphorite declined in October. Pralhad Joshi, Union minister of Parliamentary Aairs, Coal and Mines.

• The production level of important minerals such as iron ore (up by 66.8%), manganese ore (up by 33.1%), gold (up by 19.6%), coal (up by18.5%), limestone (up by 14%), zinc concentrate (up by 10%), utilised natural gas (up by 9.9%), magnesite (up by 6.7%), lead concentrate (up by 4.7%) and crude petroleum (up by 1.3%) had all improved, with iron ore in particular up in value from '3,518 crore to '8,411 crore.

4. Indian fintech funding witnessed a decline of 63% in 2023: Report

• The FinTech sector in India has witnessed a downward trend as it received funding of \$2 billion in 2023, a decline of around 63% and 73% compared to previous years, according to a report by data intelligence platform Tracxn. The financial technology sector has raised \$5.4 billion in 2022 and \$8.4 billion in 2021.
However, India ranked third globally in terms of FinTech startup funding last year, strengthening its position as a significant player on the global stage, despite the challenges posed by factors including increasing borrowing costs and macroeconomic conditions, among others.

• Alternative Lending, Payments, and BankingTech were the top-performing segments in the Indian FinTech sector, while the Peak XV Partners, Y Combinator, and LetsVenture were the top investors in the space.

• Bengaluru emerged as the leader in total FinTech funding raised in 2023, followed by Mumbai and Jaipur.

• Also, there are only two companies 'Zaggle' and 'Veefin' that announced IPOs in 2023 as compared to five in 2022.

5. 52% drop in toy imports in 8 years,
239% jump in exports: Commerce Ministry
The Indian toy industry witnessed growth in FY2022-23 in comparison to FY2014-15, with a decline in imports by 52 per cent, and a rise in exports by 239 per cent.

• These observations were noted in a case study on "Success Story of Made in India Toys", which was conducted by the IIM Lucknow at the behest of Department for Promotion of Industry and Internal Trade (DPIIT). DPIIT works under Ministry of Commerce and Industry.

The government has implemented several interventions and initiatives, including:

• Formulation of a comprehensive National Action Plan for Toys (NAPT) having 21 specific action points, and implemented by 14 central ministries/departments, with DPIIT as the coordinating body.

• Basic Customs Duty (BCD) on toys (HS code 9503) was increased from 20 per cent to 60 per cent in February 2020, and subsequently to 70 per cent in March 2023.

• Directorate General of Foreign Trade (DGFT) has mandated sample testing of each import consignment to curb the import of sub-standard toys.

• A Quality Control Order (QCO) for toys was issued in 2020, with effect from January 1, 2021.

• Special provisions were notified by the Bureau of Indian Standards (BIS) on December 17, 2020, to grant licences to micro-sale units manufacturing toys without a testing facility for one year and without establishing an in-house testing facility, which was further extended by three years.

• BIS has granted more than 1200 licences to domestic manufacturers and more than 30



licences to foreign manufacturers for the manufacture of toys with BIS standard Marks. • Cluster-based approach adopted to support the domestic toy industry. The Ministry of Micro, Small and Medium Enterprises (MSME) is supporting 19 toy clusters under the Scheme of Funds for the Regeneration of Traditional Industries (SFURTI), and the Ministry of Textiles is providing designing and tooling support to 13 toy clusters.

• Several promotional initiatives have also been undertaken to promote indigenous toys and encourage innovation, including The Indian Toy Fair 2021, Toycathon, etc.

6. India beats Taiwan in MSCI EM index weightage to be second after China
In terms of weightage, India now ranks second behind China in the MSCI Emerging Markets index, solidifying its reputation as one of the most promising emerging markets in the world to invest in.

India's weightage has now surpassed that of Taiwan. India's MSCI Emerging Markets index surged from 7% to 17.1% in eight years.
A report by Nuvama suggests India could exceed a 20% weight in the MSCI EM Index by early 2024 due to ongoing institutional investments and steady FII participation.
China's weight in the MSCI EM index has decreased to 26.6% from 33.5% in the year-ago period. On the other hand, Taiwan, South Korea and Brazil have seen marginal increases over the last one year.

• In 2023, 17 new Indian stocks were inducted in the MSCI Standard Index increasing the stock count to 131. In 2022 nine new Indian stocks were inducted.

• In October 2020, India's MSCI EM pack share was at 8%. It had now nearly doubled fuelled by factors like the introduction of a standardised Foreign Ownership Limit (FOL) in 2020, robust performance in Indian equities (especially in the Midcap segment), and weaker performance in other emerging market packs, especially China.

7. SBI Research report reveals significant decline in individual income inequality in the country in past 8 years

• Individual income inequality has significantly declined during FY14-FY22 because of a 'great migration' at the bottom of the pyramid, even as individual's weighted mean income has risen from '3.1 lakh to '11.6 lakh during FY14-FY21, according to SBI's economic research department (ERD).

• <u>Soumya Kanti Ghosh, Group Chief Economic</u> <u>Adviser, SBI</u>

• <u>Gini coefficient</u> estimated using ITR (Income Tax Return) data of taxable income of individuals

show that individual income inequality has significantly declined from 0.472 to 0.402 during FY14-FY22, per a ERD report.

• <u>This co-efficient measures inequality on a</u> <u>scale from 0 to 1, with higher values</u> <u>indicating higher inequality.</u>

• Based on trends in ITR filing, the ERD assessed that 36.3 per cent of individual ITR filers belonging to lowest income in FY14 have left the lowest income group and shifted upwards, resulting in 21.1 per cent more income for such individuals during FY14-FY21.

• Further, the income disparity of people earning less than '3.5 lakh have declined from 31.8 per cent to 15.8 per cent during FY14-FY21, signifying share of this income group in total income in comparison to their population has increased by 16 per cent.

The ERD said top 2.5 per cent of taxpayer's contribution in income has declined from 2.81 per cent to 2.28 per cent during FY14-FY21
Based on the trends, SBI's ERD has projected the weighted mean income for FY22 to come in the range of '12.5 lakh to '13 lakh.

• The report emphasised that the oft repeated conundrum debating a K-shaped recovery postpandemic seems at best flawed, prejudiced, illconcocted and fanning interests of select quarters to whom India's remarkable ascendance, signaling more the renaissance of the new global south, is quite unpalatable.

• A K-shaped recovery is **one in which the performance of different parts of the economy diverges like the arms of the letter "K."** In a K-shaped recovery, some parts of the economy may experience strong growth while others continue to decline.

• Peter Atwater, a lecturer at Virginia-based William and Mary University, coined the term 'K-shaped recovery'. It implied stacked inequity on one side and stacked privilege on the other.

8. Chennai the Top Big Indian City for Women, South Fares Better Than North: Report

• Of the biggest cities in India ' those with a population of more than one million people ' Chennai is the most conducive for women in the workforce, a study has found.

• Pune comes next, followed by Bengaluru, Hyderabad and Mumbai.

• <u>The national capital, Delhi, ranked 14th on</u> <u>this list.</u>

• Only 10 state capitals feature in the list of top 25 cities.

• The study, conducted by talent strategy consulting firm Avtar, analyses cities on five metrics – ease of living, safety, women's representation rate and women's empowerment initiatives.

9. Vedanta's Hindustan Zinc Ranks No. 1 in S&P Global Corporate Sustainability Assessment 2023

• Vedanta's Hindustan Zinc (HZL), the world's largest zinc, lead, and silver producer, has secured the coveted first position in the S&P Global Corporate Sustainability Assessment 2023 in the metals and mining sector.

• With an impressive score of 85, Hindustan Zinc stands out as the top-ranked company among the 238 global peers in the sector.

• Vedanta Limited, the parent company secured the third position globally, moving up three ranks with a notable score of 80.

10. Uttar Pradesh among top three states for MSMEs with 9% national share: CBRE-CREDAI report

• India's most populous state Uttar Pradesh has emerged among the top three states as a significant contributor to the MSME sector, with a 9 per cent share in total registered MSMEs in the country, according to a report by realty consulting firm CBRE South Asia and real estate developers association <u>CREDAL</u>

• Rajasthan with 16 lakh and Gujarat with 15.96 lakh MSMEs were the other top destinations for registered units in the country.

• According to the official data from the MSME Ministry, 2.21 crore MSMEs are registered (excluding registrations via the Udyam Assist Portal) under the ministry, as of January 8, of which 38.09 lakh with a 17.2 per cent share were from Maharashtra followed by 22.32 lakh with a 10 per cent share from Tamil Nadu and 20.95 lakh with a 9.4 per cent share from Uttar Pradesh.

11. Global unemployment seen inching up to 5.2% in 2024, says UN labour body ILO
The International Labour Organization (ILO) has projected a modest rise in the global unemployment rate to 5.2% in 2024, citing an increase in joblessness across advanced economies.

• According to ILO's 2024 **World Employment** and Social Outlook report released on January 10, anticipated rise would result in the global unemployment rate inching up from 5.1% recorded in 2023.

12. World Bank retains India growth forecasts for FY24 and FY25
The World Bank in its Global Economic Prospects report retained India's economic growth forecast at 6.3% for the current financial year, and 6.4% for the next, citing slow post-pandemic recovery.

• Global GDP is likely to grow 2.4% in 2024, it said.

• That compares to 2.6% in 2023, 3% in 2022 and 6.2% in 2021 when there was a rebound as the pandemic ended.

13. World's Most Powerful Passports: 6 Countries In Top Spot, India Ranks 80th • France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Singapore, and Spain start 2024 with the world's most powerful passport, allowing visa-free entry

powerful passport, allowing visa-free entry to 194 global destinations, according to the latest Henley Passport Index.

• <u>The ranking is based on data from the</u> <u>International Air Transport Association</u> (IATA).

• For the past five years, Japan and Singapore have consistently dominated the No. 1 spot. However, this quarter's ranking showcases European nations jumping up the tanks. Finland and Sweden tied with South Korea in second place, offering visa-free access to 193 destinations. Austria, Denmark, Ireland, and the Netherlands secure the third position, providing passport holders access to 192 destinations.

• India's passport ranked 80th spot in the list, with citizens allowed to travel to 62 countries without a visa, including popular tourist destinations like Indonesia, Malaysia, and Thailand.

• India shares its current rank with Uzbekistan while neighboring Pakistan is positioned at 101st.

• South Korea, Sweden, and Finland all climbed one spot to take joint second place, with access to 193 locations. Austria, Denmark, Ireland, and the Netherlands shared third place, allowing travel to 192 places.

• The United Arab Emirates was the fastest climber over the past decade, jumping to 11th place and offering access to 183 destinations without a visa. And China, up two spots this year to land in 62nd place, has visa-free access to 85 destinations — almost twice as many as 10 years ago.

14. Election disruption from AI poses the biggest global risk in 2024, Davos survey warns

• The <u>World Economic Forum's 'Global Risks</u> <u>Report 2024,'</u> released, ranked AI-derived misinformation and disinformation ' and its implications for societal polarization ' ahead of climate change, war and economic weakness in its top 10 risks over the next two years.

• As around half of the world's adult population heads to the polls in a bumper year of elections, concern over the role of artificial intelligence in disrupting outcomes has

topped the list of the biggest risks for 2024, according to a new report.

• The WEF report, which was also produced in collaboration with Zurich Insurance Group, surveyed over 1,400 global risk experts, policymakers and industry leaders in September 2023 about their biggest global concerns.

• The report's authors said the combined risks are "stretching the world's adaptative capacity to its limit," and called on leaders to focus on global cooperation and building guardrails for the most disruptive emerging risks.

• **Top 10 global risks-** The most cited risks for the next two years were, in order:

misinformation and disinformation, extreme weather events, societal polarization, cyber insecurity and interstate armed conflict. Also in the top 10 were lack of economic opportunity, inflation, involuntary migration, economic downturn and pollution.

• Extreme weather events, critical change to earth systems, biodiversity loss and ecosystem collapse, natural resource shortages and misinformation and disinformation were named as the most likely risks over the next 10 years. Adverse outcomes from AI technologies was also named as a longer-term concern.

• The *Global Risks Report* is an annual study published by the World Economic Forum ahead of the Forum's Annual Meeting in Davos, Switzerland.

16. India ranked 35th for leveraging future possibilities; UK on top

• India has been ranked 35th on a global index of countries best placed for leveraging future possibilities while the UK topped the list.

• The Future Possibilities Index (FPI), a flagship global future trends study released by Newsweek Vantage and Horizon Group on sidelines of the

World Economic Forum Annual Meeting, has Denmark, US, the Netherlands & Germany in in the top 5.

• Among large emerging markets, China is placed highest at 19th this year, followed by Brazil at 30th, India (35th) and South Africa (50th).

• These six global transformational trends are Exabyte Economy (advanced digital technologies), Wellbeing Economy (health prevention and wellness), Net Zero Economy (reduction of carbon emissions), Circular Economy (recycling and reuse), BioGrowth Economy (food and agriculture innovations), and Experience Economy (consumption of experiences instead of physical goods).

17. India on top for trust in biz, NGOs; 4th for media, 5th in govt: Report

• India tops the charts in terms of trust in businesses and NGOs, but it is fourth in terms of trust in media and fifth for the government, an annual trust barometer showed.

The <u>Edelman Trust Barometer 2024,</u> released here ahead of the World Economic <u>Forum Annual Meeting</u>, put Saudi Arabia on the top for trust shown by their people in the government and China for trust in media
In terms of trust shown in one's employer, Indonesia emerged at the top followed by India at the second place.

• The 24th annual survey, which covered over 32,000 respondents across 28 countries, showed developing countries having a lead over developed ones in terms of overall trust perception of their respective populations.

• On the overall index, prepared on the basis of average per cent trust in NGOs, business, government and media, India moved to second place from fourth in 2023, while China retained its top spot.

• The UK replaced South Korea as the least trusted nation. The survey also showed less trust for companies headquartered in global powers.

18. Apple reclaims most valued brand title; Tata only Indian brand in top 100

• Technology companies continue to be the most valued brands globally, with the top five most valued companies from the technology sector, according to Brand Finance 2024.

• Samsung has entered the top five most valued brands globally.

• Apple secured the first position after falling to the second spot in 2023.

• Apple's brand value increased by \$219 billion to \$517 billion.

Apple has maintained its position as the dominant player in the premium smartphone market, holding a 71 per cent value share.
From an Indian perspective, Tata Group

was the only Indian brand among the top



100 most valued brands. Tata improved its ranking from 69th in 2023 to 64th in 2024. The total value of Tata Group stood at \$28.63 billion.

• Brand Finance research found significant gains among brands that have heavily invested in artificial intelligence, seeing NVIDIA (brand value up 163 per cent to \$44.5 billion) become the world's fastest-growing brand. Microsoft (brand value up 78 per cent to \$340.4 billion) also saw an impressive brand value increase, rising two spots to second place.

• Deutsche Telekom (brand value up 17 per cent to \$73.3 billion) has claimed the title as the world's most valuable

telecommunications brand, surpassing Verizon (brand value up 6 per cent to \$71.8 billion). Ranked ninth globally, Deutsche Telekom also leads as the most valuable European brand.

• Tesla (brand value down 12 per cent to \$58.3 billion) has dropped out of the top 10, falling to 18th place in the ranking.

• Tesla has been harmed by its large exposure to the Chinese electric vehicle market, and BYD (brand value up 20 per cent to \$12.1 billion) has now overtaken Tesla to become the world's largest electric vehicle maker.

• While Tesla's brand strength remains high overall, rated AAA-, Brand Finance research shows a significant fall in reputation. Tesla's close association with Elon Musk, a controversial leadership figure, creates added reputational risk for the brand

19. Apple dethrones Samsung as top phone maker for first time since **2010**

• Apple Inc.'s iPhone dethroned Samsung Electronics Co. devices to become the bestselling smartphone series over the course of 2023, the first time South Korea's largest company has lost the top spot since 2010.

• The iPhone accounted for a fifth of the global market with close to 235 million shipments last year, research firm IDC estimates.

• Samsung, whose shipments slumped doubledigits to 226.6 million, came in second, ahead of Chinese device makers like Xiaomi Corp.

20. Global Firepower Ranking 2024: India has the fourth most powerful military behind China; Pakistan on 9th

• <u>The US maintains its position as the</u> <u>world's most powerful military force, as per</u> <u>the Global Firepower rankings for 2024</u>.

• This comprehensive assessment evaluates the military strength of 145 countries, providing insights into their capabilities. In a global context, Russia and China follow closely behind, securing the second and third positions. **India claimed 4th spot.**

• Global Firepower utilizes a meticulous approach, considering around 60 factors, to determine the military strength of nations.

• The factors include the number of troops, military equipment, financial stability, geographic location, and available resources.

• The Power Index score, with 0.0000 considered 'perfect,' serves as a benchmark. According to the rankings, the United States leads with a score of 0.0699, trailed by Russia (0.0702) and China (0.0706). India, with a Power Index score of 0.1023, secures its position as the fourth most powerful military globally.

• Top 10 Powerful Militaries

• The top 10 countries with the most powerful militaries include the United States, Russia, China, India, South Korea, United Kingdom, Japan, Turkiye, Pakistan, and Italy. Each of these nations has undergone scrutiny based on Global Firepower's comprehensive evaluation.

Bottom 10 Least Powerful Militaries

• Conversely, the countries with the least powerful militaries, as per the rankings, are Bhutan, Moldova, Suriname, Somalia, Benin, Liberia, Belize, Sierra Leone, Central African Republic, and Iceland. These rankings highlight the diverse spectrum of military capabilities across the globe.

21. Tata Consultancy Services is world's 2nd most valuable IT services brand • Accenture, Tata Consultancy Services (TCS), and Infosys have continued to up

This is despite disruptions caused by newer technologies and a tepid growth environment.
Accenture remains the world's most valuable IT services brand, with a brand value of \$40.5 billion, representing a 1.6% increase from the previous year, according to an ET report quoting Brand Finance 2024 report.

TCS, a leading Indian IT company, secured the second spot with a remarkable 11% rise in its brand value, reaching \$19.2 billion. In absolute figures, the increase in brand value was the most significant among global IT majors, rising almost \$2 billion, compared to last year's \$17.2 billion. TCS attributed this growth to its investments in AI-readiness and commitment to sustainability.
However, Wipro, backed by Azim-Premji, witnessed a decline in brand value by 7.6% to \$6.2 billion.

• Infosys, on the other hand, has maintained its position as the fastest-growing IT services brand over the past five years and maintained its third spot on the ranking. With a brand value of \$14.2 billion, Infosys ranks 145th among the world's most valuable brands. Salil Parekh, CEO of Infosys, was recognized as the number one IT Services CEO for 2024.



• HCL Tech, the third-largest Indian IT firm, experienced the fastest growth, with a 16% increase, retaining its eighth position this year. The valuation reached \$6.5 billion, marking a year-on-year rise of \$1 billion.

22. IESA launches new report on semiconductor and ESDM policies in India • The <u>India Electronics and Semiconductor</u> <u>Association (IESA)</u> launched a report that examined the policies and incentives offered by the Centre and 14 states on the Semiconductor and ESDM (Electronics System Design and Manufacturing) sector.

• Of these, 4 states (Gujarat, Odisha, Tamil Nadu, and Uttar Pradesh) have already come up with a specified Semiconductor Policy.

• The Ministry of Education has released the All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE) 2021-2022 which said that female enrolment in Higher Education increased to 2.07 crore in 2021-22 from 1.57 crore in 2014-15 (an increase of 50 lakh students, 32 per cent increase).

• As per the All India Survey on Higher Education (AISHE), the enrolment of SC students is 66.23 lakh in 2021-22 as compared to 46.07 lakh in 2014-15 (an increase of 44 per cent).

More about the Survey:

• The survey also showed that the total enrolment in higher education has increased to nearly 4.33 crore in 2021-22 from 4.14 crore in 2020-21. There has been an increase of around 91 lakh in the enrolment from 3.42 crore (26.5 per cent) in 2014-15.

"The enrolment of SC Female students has increased to 31.71 lakh in 2021-22 from 29.01 lakh in 2020-21 and 21.02 lakh in 2014-15. There has been an increase of 51 per cent since 2014-15. The enrolment of ST students has increased to 27.1 lakh in 2021-22 from 16.41 lakh in 2014-15 (an increase of 65.2 per cent).
The enrolment of OBC students has also increased to 1.63 crore in 2021-22 from 1.13 crore in 2014-15. There is a notable increase in OBC student enrolment since 2014-15 of around 50.8 lakh," the Ministry said quoting the survey. • As per the Survey, the Minority Student enrolment has increased to 30.1 lakh in 2021-22 from 21.8 lahks in 2014-15 (an increase of 38 per cent).

• Female Minority Student enrolment has increased to 15.2 lakh in 2021-22 from 10.7 lakh in 2014-15.

• Notably, the total Student Enrolment in North East States is 12.02 lakh in 2021-22 as compared to 9.36 lakh in 2014-15.

• The female enrolment in North East States is 6.07 lakh in 2021-22, higher than the male enrolment of 5.95 lakh.

"As per response in AISHE 2021-22, about 78.9 per cent of the total students are enrolled in undergraduate level courses and 12.1 per cent are enrolled in postgraduate level courses.
Among Disciplines at the undergraduate level in AISHE 2021-22, enrolment is highest in Arts (34.2 per cent), followed by science (14.8), Commerce (13.3) and Engineering and Technology (11.8).

Among streams at postgraduate level in AISHE 2021-22, maximum students are enrolled in Social Science (21.1 per cent) followed by science (14.7)," the survey stated.
Government Universities constituting 58.6 per cent of total Universities, contribute 73.7 per cent of total enrolment, and Private Universities account for 26.3 per cent of total enrolment.
"The total number of Universities / University level institutions registered is 1,168, Colleges 45,473 and Standalone Institutions 12,002. In all, 341 Universities/University level institutions have been established since 2014-15.

• 17 Universities (of which 14 are State Public Universities) and 4,470 Colleges are exclusively for women," the survey said.

• As per the survey, the total number of faculty/teachers in 2021-22 is 15.98 lakh, of which about 56.6 per cent are male and 43.4 are female.

• "Female faculty/teachers have increased to 6.94 lakh in 2021-22 from 5.69 lakh in 2014-15 (an increase of 22 per cent since 2014-15). There is a marginal betterment of female per 100 male faculty from 75 in 2020-21 to 77 in 2021-22," it added.

24. India home to 718 snow leopards;
Ladakh highest with 477: SPAI report
Environment minister, Bhupender Yadav released the report, Status of Snow
Leopards in India during the National Board for Wildlife meet held in Delhi.

• There are around **718 snow leopards in the country**, the first ever population estimation exercise of the vulnerable species by the Snow Leopard Population Assessment in India (SPAI) Program has found.



• The snow leopard is designated in the 'vulnerable' category by the IUCN

• During the assessment conducted from 2019 to 2023, a total of 241 unique snow leopards were photographed.

• Based on the analysis, Ladakh has the highest estimated population of the animal (477) followed by Uttarakhand (124), Himachal Pradesh (51), Arunachal Pradesh (36), Sikkim (21), and Jammu and Kashmir (9).

The study covered approximately 120,000 sq km of snow leopard habitat across the trans-Himalayan region, including Ladakh, J & K, Himachal Pradesh, Uttarakhand, Sikkim, and Arunachal Pradesh; surveyed 13,450 km of trails.
The estimation of snow leopard population is important because of the species' role as an apex predator in the Himalayan ecosystem. As an apex predator, it exerts top down regulation of prey populations, thereby influencing the ecological equilibrium of its habitat.

• The species is found in 12 countries, Afghanistan, Bhutan, China, India, Kazakhstan, Kyrgyzstan, Mongolia, Nepal, Pakistan, Russia, Tajikistan, and Uzbekistan, and its global population is estimated at 3020 to 5390, according to the Global Snow Leopard and Ecosystem Protection Program.

25. IMF upgrades India's GDP growth rate
to 6.7 percent for current financial year
International Monetary Fund (IMF) has
increased its GDP growth estimate for India
to 6.7 percent for the current financial year.

• It is 40 basis points higher than its previous forecast of 6.3 percent. In its latest World Economic Outlook report, IMF also raised India's upward medium-term GDP growth to 6.5 percent, for 2025 and 2026

• The IMF said results are reflecting a strong public investment, and positive labor market outcomes. The IMF said India will narrowing its current account deficit projection for financial year 24 from 1.8 percent of GDP to 1.6 percent. The agency said India continues to be the fastest-growing economy among the major economies of the world. In Financial Year 23, India's GDP had expanded by 7.2 percent over the previous year.

26. India ranks 93 in Global Corruption Index

• Transparency International unveiled the 2023 Corruption Perceptions Index (CPI), disclosing a list of the world's most corrupt countries.

• In the CPI, **India secured the 93rd position with a score of 39**, according to the Transparency International report.

India's overall score remained relatively stable, as it was 40 in 2022, securing the 85th position.
Meanwhile, Pakistan, with a score of 29, and Sri Lanka (34) grappled with their respective debt burdens and ensuing political instability, the report said.

• Among India's neighbours, Afghanistan and Myanmar scored 20, China scored 42, Japan scored 73 and Bangladesh scored 24.


• For the sixth consecutive year, Denmark secures the top position on the index with a score of 90 due to its "well-functioning justice systems".

• Following closely, Finland and New Zealand hold the second and third positions with scores of 87 and 85, respectively.

• This year, the top 10 countries on the index include Norway (84), Singapore (83), Sweden (82), Switzerland (82), the Netherlands (79), Germany (78), and Luxembourg (78).

• Taking the bottom spots in the index are Somalia (11), Venezuela (13), Syria (13), South Sudan (13), and Yemen (16). These countries are all affected by protracted crises, primarily armed conflicts.

• Nicaragua (17), North Korea (17), Haiti (17), Equatorial Guinea (17), Turkmenistan (18), and Libya (18) are the subsequent lowest performers on the index.

1. Global Family Day 2024

2. World Day of War Orphans | 6th January

• The World Day of War Orphans was founded by the French organisation SOS Enfants en Detresses.

• The organisation works to help children in distress.

3. Pravasi Bharatiya Diwas | 9 January
Pravasi Bharatiya Divas, also known as Non-Resident Indian Day, is celebrated on January 9 to mark the contribution and achievements of the overseas Indian community to the development of India.

• The day also commemorates the return of Mahatma Gandhi, the greatest Pravasi, from South Africa to India in 1915, who led India's freedom struggle and changed the lives of Indians.

• Pravasi Bharatiya Divas was first celebrated in 2003.

• Its format was later revised in 2015 to celebrate the event once every two years and to hold theme-based conferences during the intervening period with participation from overseas diaspora experts, policy-makers, and stakeholders.

• The theme of Pravasi Bharatiya Divas is chosen to reflect the current priorities and concerns of

the Indian diaspora. <u>The theme of Pravasi</u> Bharatiya Divas 2021 was "Contributing to Atmanirbhar Bharat" and 2023 was "Diaspora: Reliable Partners for India's Progress in Amrit Kaal"

4. World Hindi Day | 10 January

• World Hindi Day is being observed on 10 January.

• The day is commemorated every year with the objective to promote use of Hindi language abroad.

• On this day in 2006, the First World Hindi Conference was held in Nagpur with the aim to promote the language worldwide and since then, every year 10th January is being observed as the World Hindi Day.

• Election Commission of India is a permanent Constitutional Body. The Election Commission was established in accordance with the Constitution on 25th January 1950. The Commission celebrated its Golden Jubilee in 2001.

• Originally the commission had only a Chief Election Commissioner. It currently consists of Chief Election Commissioner and two Election Commissioners.

• For the first time two additional Commissioners were appointed on 16th October 1989 but they had a very short tenure till 1st January 1990. Later, on 1st October 1993 two additional Election Commissioners were appointed. The concept of multi-member Commission has been in operation since then, with decision making power by majority vote.

Appointment & Tenure Of Commissioners
 The President appoints Chief Election

• The President appoints Chief Election Commissioner and Election Commissioners. They have tenure of six years, or up to the age of 65 years, whichever is earlier. They enjoy the same status and receive salary and perks as available to Judges of the Supreme Court of India. The Chief Election Commissioner can be



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removed from office in like manner and on like grounds as a judge of the Supreme Court.

12. International Day of Clean Energy | 26 January

• The International Day of Clean Energy on 26 January was declared by the General Assembly as a call to raise awareness and mobilize action for a just and inclusive transition to clean energy for the benefit of people and the planet.

1. ISRO launched XPoSat aboard PSLV-C58

• Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) has successfully launched X-ray Polarimeter Satellite (XPoSat) aboard Polar Satellite Launch Vehicle PSLV-C58.

• This mission marks India's first dedicated scientific endeavour to study the polarisation of cosmic X-rays from celestial sources.

<u>The satellite was launched from Satish Dhawan</u> <u>Space Centre in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh</u>.
Ten other scientific payloads were also launched along with XPoSat.

• This mission marks India's first dedicated scientific endeavour to study the polarisation of cosmic X-rays from celestial sources.

• Following the launch of XPoSat, India has become the second country in the world after the United States to send a specialised astronomy observatory to study black holes and neutron stars in our galaxy.

• The mission life of the primary payload XPoSat is about five years.

2. Google DeepMind introduces mobile ALOHA humanoid system

 Stanford University has introduced Mobile ALOHA, a robotic system that advances the capabilities of bimanual mobile manipulation through low-cost whole-body teleoperation.
 This innovation, which builds upon Google DeepMind's existing ALOHA system, brings mobility and dexterity to the forefront of robotic learning.

 This robotics technology addresses the limitations of traditional imitation learning from human demonstrations, which often focus on tabletop manipulation without the necessary mobility and dexterity for real-world applications.

• DeepMind Technologies Limited, doing business as Google DeepMind, is a British-American artificial intelligence research laboratory which serves as

a subsidiary of Google. Founded in the UK in 2010, it was acquired by Google in 2014

3. IITs Madras, Kanpur find way to recycle waste material from iron ore mining
Researchers at the Indian Institutes of Technology Madras and Kanpur have developed a process to convert waste produced from iron ore mining into an environment-friendly material that can be reused by industry.

• This project is of importance to India as while processing iron ore, particles smaller than 0.15 mm generated and are discarded as waste known as slime.

• <u>The researchers collaborated with NMDC</u> <u>and JSW Steel</u> to transform slime into iron-rich materials suitable for blast furnace charging through a microwave-assisted beneficiation process.

• The process is economical as the microwave selectively interacts with iron oxides or carbon mix, leaving out other impurities (like silica, alumina, phosphorus oxides) while also rapidly heating the material compared to conventional routes, saving a significant amount of energy and emissions.

• IITs Madras and Kanpur undertook a project under **IMPRINT INDIA (Impacting Research Innovation and Technology),** an initiative of the union education ministry.

4. Software giant Microsoft adds AI button to keyboards to summon chatbots
Microsoft introduces an AI button on PC keyboards to launch its AI chatbot, in partnership with OpenAI, capitalizing on generative AI technology.

• <u>The button will be added to laptops by third-</u> party manufacturers, replacing the right "CTRL" key or menu key.

The keyboard redesign will be Microsoft's biggest change to PC keyboards since it introduced a special Windows key in the 1990s.
Microsoft's four-squared logo design has evolved, but the key has been a fixture on Windows-oriented keyboards for nearly three decades.

• The newest AI button will be marked by the ribbon-like Copilot logo and be located near the space bar.

• On some computers it will replace the right CTRL key, while on others it will replace a menu key.

• Microsoft is not the only company with customised keys. Apple pioneered the concept in the 1980s with its Command key marked by a looped square design (it also sported an Apple logo for a time). Google has a search button on its Chromebooks and was first to experiment with an AI-specific key to launch its voice assistant on its now-discontinued Pixelbook.

5. Google DeepMind Rolls Out Mobile ALOHA, An Open Source Humanoid • Google DeepMind and Stanford University have leveraged cutting-edge technology to revolutionise household tasks.

• Together, they have unveiled Mobile ALOHA, an innovative and affordable open-source hardware system designed for bimanual teleoperation, specifically aimed at enhancing capabilities in cooking and cleaning.

6. ArcelorMittal partners with IIT Madras to create Asia's first Hyperloop facility • ArcelorMittal has announced that it has established a partnership with Indian Institute of Technology Madras (IIT Madras) and is working closely with IIT



<u>Madras' Hyperloop Technology teams '</u> <u>Avishkar Hyperloop, student team and TuTr</u> <u>Hyperloop</u>, a start-up incubated at IIT Madras, which are developing cost-effective Hyperloop technologies for passenger and cargo mobility.

• ArcelorMittal and AM/NS India are providing foundational steel materials, as well as engineering, design and project management expertise to support the creation of India's and Asia's first Hyperloop test track at IIT Madras' 163-acre Discovery Campus at Thaiyur, on the outskirts of Chennai.

• In July 2023, ArcelorMittal announced that its XCarb Innovation Fund was launching an accelerator programme to fund and support the next wave of breakthrough ideas on decarbonisation emerging from India.

• Launched in 2021, the XCarb Innovation Fund invests in companies developing technologies that hold the potential to accelerate the steel industry's transition to carbon neutral steelmaking.

7. Aditya L1 reaches destination, successfully enters halo orbit

• The Indian Space Research Organisation (Isro) successfully placed Aditya L1, the country's first space-based solar observatory, into a halo orbit around its intended destination: the Sun-Earth Lagrangian Point L1.

• After a 1.5-million km journey the spacecraft was placed in a halo orbit around L1 following a firing manoeuvre which was carried out by ISRO scientists and engineers at the ISRO Telemetry Tracking and Command Network (ISTRAC) in Bengaluru.

• The orbit of Aditya-L1 spacecraft is a periodic halo orbit which is located roughly 1.5 million km from earth on the continuously moving Sun-Earth line with an orbital period of about 177.86 earth days.

This halo orbit is a periodic, three-dimensional orbit at L1 involving Sun, Earth and a spacecraft.
This specific halo orbit is selected to ensure a mission lifetime of 5 years, minimising station-keeping manoeuvres and thus fuel consumption and ensuring a continuous, unobstructed view of the Sun.

8. In a first, India to launch GSAT-20 satellite on SpaceX Falcon 9 rocket • NewSpace India Ltd (NSIL), the ISRO's commercial arm, announced its plan to launch communication satellite GSAT-20 onboard Elon Musk-owned SpaceX's Falcon-9 rocket.

• GSAT-20 (renamed as GSAT-N2) is a high throughput Ka-band satellite. Ka-band satellites deliver high-speed broadband internet connectivity and digital video and audio transmission.

9. LG unveils world's 1st wireless transparent OLED TV

• LG Electronics has unveiled the world's first wireless transparent TV.

• Called LG Signature OLED T, the TV has a glass for a display that looks as if it disappears when turned off. The TV has a self-lit pixel technology that enables it to maintain the picture quality and it has a 4K resolution.

• OLED (Organic Light Emitting Diodes) is a flat light emitting technology, made by placing a series of organic thin films between two conductors. When electrical current is applied, a bright light is emitted. OLEDs are emissive displays that do not require a backlight and so are thinner and more efficient than LCD displays (which do require a white backlight).

• LG Electronics Inc. is a South Korean multinational electronics company headquartered in Yeouido-dong, Seou<u>l</u>, South Korea.

10. Microsoft launches AI Odyssey to skill 1 lakh developers in India in AI Tech
Microsoft has launched an initiative, AI Odyssey, that aims to skill one lakh developers in India in the latest AI technologies and tools.

• The month-long program is open to all AI enthusiasts in India, regardless of experience level or background. The program has two levels that participants need to complete by January 31, 2024.

11. China launches new satellite 'Einstein Probe' shaped like a lotus to observe violent cosmic phenomena

• Einstein Probe (EP), uses new X-ray detection technology inspired by the functioning of a lobster eye & was launched by a Long March-2C carrier rocket from the Xichang Satellite Launch Centre in China's Sichuan Province.

• It a new astronomical satellite shaped like a lotus launched to observe mysterious transient phenomena in the universe that flicker like fireworks.

• Weighing about 1.45 tonnes and as large as a full-size SUV, the satellite is shaped like a lotus in full bloom and features 12 petals and two stamens, state-run Xinhua news agency reported.

• The 12 'petals' are 12 modules consisting of wide-field X-ray telescopes (WXT), while the two 'stamens' consist of two modules of follow-up X-ray telescopes (FXT).

• These telescopes form a space observatory which is aimed at helping scientists capture the first light stemming from supernova explosions, search for and pinpoint X-ray signals accompanying gravitational wave events, and discover dormant black holes and other faint



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transient and variable celestial objects at the far reaches of the universe.

12. Gen AI gives a new lease of life to old favourite Chandamama stories

• As many as 10,000 volunteers, mostly from different engineering colleges, have helped a small team of techies build a repository of stories in Telugu for a Small Language Model (SLM).

• As it gets the feed (digital text), the SLM model ' AI Chandamama Kathalu ' has started learning.

• While GenerativeAI models such as ChatGPT and Bard were built on Large Language Models (LLMS) and can churn out lengthy output, the SLMs can generate focused and smaller amounts of content.

• Students from 30 engineering colleges participated in a four-hour hackathon that witnessed uploading of 40,000 pages of stories from Chandamama. This dataset has just been released for the public.

13. Pixxel opens new spacecraft manufacturing facility in Bengaluru Bengaluru-based space data company Pixxel inaugurated its first spacecraft manufacturing facility in Bengaluru.

• The new facility holds significance as it targets to launch six satellites this year and 18 more by 2025, further advancing its mission of building a 'health monitor' for the planet.

• The facility was inaugurated by S. Somanath, chairman of ISRO.

• <u>Pixxel has launched three of its satellites -</u> <u>Shakuntala, D2, and Anand - in</u> <u>collaboration with ISRO and Elon Musk's</u> <u>SpaceX.</u>

• The Bengaluru startup further plans to launch Firefly, a constellation comprising six highresolution hyperspectral satellites, in June. This would be followed by the so-called Honeybees constellation, another satellite constellation that will improve image resolution and the wavelength range of Pixxel's satellites.

• Additionally, Pixxel will also be rolling out its geospatial analytics platform, Aurora, by June 2024.

• The company's satellites are used in the environment, agriculture, and mining sectors to detect oil spills, vegetation, and other geographical issues, respectively.

• Pixxel has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Ministry of Agriculture to provide hyperspectral imagery.

14. ISRO develops second-generation distress alert transmitter for fishermen
ISRO has developed a second-generation 'Distress Alert Transmitter' (DAT), incorporating advanced satellite communication and navigation capabilities that allow fishermen at sea to send

emergency messages from fishing boats and get acknowledgement in real time.

The DAT has been operational since 2010 and more than 20,000 of them are currently in use,
The messages are sent through a

communication satellite and received at a central control station (INMCC: Indian Mission Control Centre) where the alert signals are decoded for the identity and location of the fishing boat, according to an ISRO statement.

• The extracted information is forwarded to Maritime Rescue Co-ordination Centres (MRCCs) under the Indian Coast Guard (ICG).

15. PM Modi inaugurates new state-of-theart campus of Boeing India Engineering and Technology Center at Bengaluru

• Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated the new state of the art Boeing India Engineering and Technology Center and launched the Boeing Sukanya programme in Bengaluru.

• The state-of-the-art BIETC is built with an investment of '1,600 crore.

• It is located in a 43-acre campus, and is the American aerospace major's largest such investment outside the U.S.

• Boeing's relationship with India goes back to the 1940s when the Indian Air Force enlisted two Boeing aircraft-- the T-6 Texan, or Harvard Advanced Trainer, made by North American Aviation, and the C-47 Skytrain military transport, a military variant of the DC-3, made by McDonnell Douglas.

16. Gurgaon-based ACME signs pact with Japan's IHI to supply green ammonia
Gurgaon-based ACME Group signed an offtake term sheet for the supply of green ammonia from its project in Odisha to IHI Corporation, a Japanese integrated heavy industry company.

• The term sheet covers the supply of 0.4 million metric tons per annum (MMTPA) of green ammonia from Phase-1 of ACME's Gopalpur on a long-term basis.

• The green hydrogen and ammonia project of ACME in Odisha has a planned capacity of 1.2 MMTPA to be developed in phases, and the first production is likely to be expected by 2027.

17. Japan craft made successful pin-point Moon landing, space agency says

• Japan's "Moon Sniper" craft made a pinpoint lunar landing despite last-minute engine problems, the space agency said as it released the first images from the mission.

• The touchdown made Japan only the fifth nation to achieve a soft lunar landing, after the United States, the Soviet Union, China and India.

• The unmanned Smart Lander for Investigating Moon (SLIM) -- dubbed the "Moon Sniper" for its



precision technology -- had the goal of touching down within 100 metres (330 feet) of a specific landing spot on a crater.

• Two previous Japanese lunar missions -- one public and one private -- have also failed. In 2022, the country unsuccessfully sent a lunar probe named Omotenashi as part of the United States's Artemis 1 mission.

• In April, Japanese startup ispace tried in vain to become the first private company to land on the Moon, losing communication with its craft after what it described as a "hard landing".

18. Bhavish Aggarwal's AI startup Krutrim turns unicorn after raising \$50 mn

• Krutrim, an artificial intelligence (AI) venture co-founded by Bhavish Aggarwal of Ola, announced that it has achieved unicorn status ' a term used to describe startups valued at \$1 billion or above ' following its inaugural funding round.

• The round, which saw participation from notable investors, such as Matrix Partners India, garnered investments worth \$50 million in equity at a valuation of \$1 billion.

• With this, Krutrim claimed the distinction of being India's first AI company to reach unicorn status and also the title of the country's fastest unicorn. Krutrim, which translates to "artificial" in Sanskrit, was launched in April 2023 by Aggarwal and Krishnamurthy Venugopala Tenneti, a board member of ANI Technologies that owns Ola and Ola Electric.

• The AI startup is the third venture helmed by Aggarwal to achieve a \$1 billion valuation, after mobility firm Ola and electric vehicle manufacturer Ola Electric.

• The funds raised will be used to expedite the company's "mission to transform the AI landscape, foster innovation, and extend its global footprint".

19. ISRO's unique & inexpensive space platform POEM-3 achieves all payload objectives

• ISRO said its space platform, POEM-3, has successfully achieved all its payload objectives. POEM-3 (the PSLV Orbital Experimental Module-3) uses the spent PS4 stage of the PSLV-C58 rocket that launched XPoSat on January 1 this year.

• ISRO said POEM-3 flew with nine payloads from Vikram Sarabhai Space Centre, Physical Research Laboratory, academia, and space start-ups.

• By the 25th day in orbit, POEM-3, which the space agency described as a unique and inexpensive platform, completed 400 orbits.

• Over this period, each payload was put into operation, as planned and performance was demonstrated.

• <u>POEM-3 is a three-axis-attitude controlled</u> <u>platform with power generation and</u>

telecommand and telemetry capabilities, for supporting payloads, it was noted.

• It is predicted that POEM-3 will continue orbiting for approximately 73 more days before re-entering the Earth's atmosphere.

20. CoRover.ai unveils BharatGPT a GenAI as a Service

 CoRover.ai, a Human-Centric conversational AI platform unveils India's first indigenous Generative AI LLM, BharatGPT.

• The platform, which aims to cater to over 130 crore users, was showcased at the 2023 Global Partner Artificial Intelligence Summit in New Delhi.

• BharatGPT integrates voice modality in more than 12 Indian languages and text modality in 22 languages, in collaboration with the National Hub of Language Technology (NHLT).

• The NHLT is a key component of Digital India's efforts, tasked with executing the National Language Translation Mission (NLTM) under the ministry of electronics and information technology (MeitY).

21. NASA Unveils Aircraft That Can Travel Faster Than Speed Of Sound.

• As NASA's newest X-plane, the X-59 is designed to break the sound barrier without the thunderous sonic booms that typically occur when aircraft go supersonic.

• Instead, the Quesst will make a much quieter "thump," similar to the sound of a car door slamming as heard from indoors. Its predicted top speed is 1.4 times the speed of sound or 1,488 kilometres per hour.

• NASA's Quesst mission, which aims to provide information to assist regulators in re-evaluating regulations that forbid commercial supersonic flying over land, is centred around the X-59.

22. CMFRI to develop lab-grown fish meat for the first time in India

• An Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) institute has signed a first-of-its-kind agreement in India with a start-up to develop lab-grown fish meat.

• The Kochi-based Central Marine Fisheries Research Institute (CMFRI) has entered into a collaborative research agreement with Neat Meatt Biotech, a start-up working on cultivated meat.

• Lab-grown meat or alternative proteins is gradually attracting big investments globally. As of 2020, around \$3.1 billion capital was invested in the smart proteins sector, according to reports.

• Some studies suggest that the niche market is projected to reach \$290 billion by 2035. Major agencies also predict that it would make up 4 to 60 per cent of the world meat market by 2040.



As per the MoU signed by CMFRI director A Gopalakrishnan and co-founder and CEO of the Neat Meatt Biotech Sandeep Sharma, CMFRI will carry out research on early cell line development of high-value marine fish species like king fish, pomfret and seer fish in the initial phase.
CMFRI will also handle genetic, biochemical, and analytical work related to the project. Neat Meattwill lead the optimization of cell growth media, development of scaffolds or microcarriers for cell attachment, and scaling up production through bioreactors.

• <u>The ICAR-Central Marine Fisheries Research</u> <u>Institute was established by Government of India</u> <u>on February 3rd1947 under the Ministry of</u> <u>Agriculture and Farmers Welfare and later it</u> <u>joined the ICAR family in 1967.</u>

• The Headquarters of the ICAR-CMFRI is located in Kochi, Kerala.

• India and the UAE enjoy strong bonds of friendship which are founded on millennia-old cultural, religious and economic intercourse between the two regions.

• According to the Ministry of External Affairs, potential areas of bilateral cooperation in the defence field are the production and development of defence equipment; joint exercises of armed forces, particularly naval exercises; sharing of information on strategy and doctrines; technical cooperation in respect of Intermediate Jet Trainer etc.

• Indian Air Force said, employing terrain masking enroute, the exercise also dovetailed a training mission of the Garud Commandos.

3. Navy gets first India-made long endurance Drishti 10 Starliner drone Admiral R Hari Kumar unveiled the indigenous Drishti 10 Starliner drone for the Indian Navy at Adani Defence's drone unveiling ceremony.

• The Drishti 10 Starliner is an advanced Intelligence, Surveillance and Reconnaissance (ISR) platform boasting a 36-hour endurance, 450kg payload capacity and clearance to fly in both segregated and unsegregated airspace.

Adani Defence has built India's first unmanned aerial vehicles manufacturing facility, and the first private sector small arms manufacturing facility.

It is currently setting up the country's first comprehensive aircraft MRO or maintenance, repair and overhaul facility to ensure safety and airworthiness as per to international standards.

• It is the Indian version of the original Hermes StarLiner.

5. 'Ugram': DRDO launches indigenous assault rifle for armed forces

• Ugram, a state-of-the-art assault rifle of the 7.62 x 51 mm calibre, was launched by the Defence Research and Development Organisation (DRDO).

• Ugram, which means ferocious, has been developed and manufactured DRDO's Pune-based facility Armament Research and Development Establishments (ARDE)along with Hyderabadbased Dvipa Armour India Private Limited. Ugram weighs less than four kilograms and has an effective range of 500 metres.

• Ugram, which means ferocious, has been developed and manufactured in collaboration with a private firm. It is designed for the operational requirements of armed forces, paramilitary and state police forces.

• Ugram weighs less than four kilograms and has an effective range of 500 metres. It has been designed based on the General Staff Qualitative Requirements (GSQRs) of the Indian Army, according to ARDE scientists.

• Having a 20-round magazine, the rifle has a rivet-free design and is capable of firing in both single as well as full auto mode.

• Indian Army will observe 2024 as the 'Year of Technology Absorption' as it's trying to gradually mature into a modern force that will have a new operational philosophy for induction of drones & counter-drones systems right across infantry, artillery and armoured battalions, and establish Command Cyber Operations Support Wings, besides bridging other conventional asymmetries

7. 20th India-Japan Coast Guard exercise The 20th joint exercise between the Coast Guard of India and Japan took place off the coast of Chennai.

• Exercise CYCLONE is designed to develop bilateral military cooperation and strengthen bond between two armies through conduct of discussions and rehearsal of tactical military drills.

11. INDIAN ' KYRGYZSTAN JOINT SPECIAL FORCES EXERCISE KHANJAR COMMENCES IN HIMACHAL PRADESH

• <u>The 11th edition of India-Kyrgyzstan Joint</u> <u>Special Forces</u> <u>Exercise KHANJAR</u> has <u>commenced at the Special Forces Training</u> <u>School in Bakloh, Himachal Pradesh.</u>

• The exercise is scheduled to be conducted from 22nd January to 3rd February 2024. It is an annual event conducted alternatively in both the countries.

• The Indian Army contingent comprising 20 personnel is being represented by troops from The Parachute Regiment (Special Forces) and the Kyrgyzstan contingent comprising 20 personnel is represented by Scorpion Brigade.

• Aim of the exercise is to exchange experiences and best practices in Counter Terrorism and Special Forces Operations in Built-up Area and Mountainous Terrain under Chapter VII of United Nations Charter. The exercise will emphasise on developing Special Forces skills, advanced techniques of insertion and extraction.

• The exercise will provide an opportunity for both the sides of fortify defence ties while addressing common concerns of international terrorism and extremism. The exercise will also accord opportunity to showcase capabilities of cutting edge indigenous defence equipment besides achieving shared security objectives and foster bilateral relations.

12. Indian Army launches 'Operation Sarvashakti' to thwart Pak's attempts to revive terrorism in Kashmir

• In a major step towards thwarting Pakistan's attempts to increase terrorist activities in Jammu and Kashmir, <u>the Indian</u> <u>Army is launching Operation Sarvashakti</u>, where the security forces will be targeting the terrorists operating on both sides of the Pir Panjal mountain ranges in the Union Territory.

• The operations are expected to be on the lines of Operation Sarpvinash, which was launched in 2003 to eliminate terrorists from the same areas in the South of Pir Panjal range.

13. EX- DESERT KNIGHT

• On 23 Jan 2024, the Indian Air Force (IAF) conducted Exercise Desert Knight along with French Air and Space Force (FASF) and United Arab Emirates (UAE) Air Force.

• While the French participation included the Rafale fighter aircraft and a Multi Role Tanker Transport, the UAE Air Force fielded the F-16.

• These aircraft operated from the Al Dhafra air base in the UAE.

• The IAF contingent comprised of Su-30 MKI, MiG-29, Jaguar, AWACS, C-130-J and Air to Air Refueller aircraft. The exercise in Indian FIR was conducted over the Arabian Sea, with IAF aircraft operating from bases within India.

• The main focus of Exercise Desert Knight was on enhancing synergy and interoperability between the three Air Forces.

• The interactions during the exercise facilitated the exchange of operational knowledge, experiences and best practices amongst the participants. Such exercises are indicative of the growing diplomatic and military interactions in the region, apart from showcasing the prowess of the IAF.

14. Defence ministry inks Rs 1,070 cr contract with Mazagon Dock for 14 FPVs
Ministry of Defence (MoD) signed a contract with Mazagon Dock Shipbuilders Ltd (MDL), Mumbai for acquiring 14 Fast



Patrol Vessels (FPVs) for the Indian Coast Guard (ICG).

The value of the contract is Rs 1,070 crore.

• These multi-role FPVs will be indigenously designed, developed and manufactured by MDL under the 'Buy (Indian-IDDM)' acquisition category and will be delivered.

Ammunition cum torpedo cum missile (ACTCM) barges

• The launch of the fifth "Ammunition Cum Torpedo Cum Missile Barge" was carried out at the MSME shipyard Suryadipta Projects Pvt Ltd, Thane.

• The contract for building 11 ACTCM barges was signed between the MoD and Suryadipta Projects on March 5, 2021. These barges are essential for carrying out the navy's logistical and operational commitments by facilitating transportation, embarkation and

disembarkation of articles/ammunition to the navy's warships, while they are in harbour.

• <u>The inaugural edition of India-Saudi Arabia</u> Joint <u>Military Exercise 'SADA TANSEEQ'</u>

<u>commenced at Mahajan, Rajasthan. The</u> <u>Exercise is scheduled to be conducted from</u> <u>29th January to 10th February 2024.</u>

• The Saudi Arabian contingent comprising 45 personnel is being represented by Royal Saudi Land Forces.



1. Franz Beckenbauer football player passed away at 78 in Germany

• **Franz Beckenbauer**, widely regarded among the **greatest football player** of all time, has died at the age of 78 in Germany. Known in football-obsessed Germany as 'the Kaiser' meaning 'the Emperor'. He collected 103 caps for West Germany, winning the 1972 European championship and then the World Cup on home soil.

• Franz Beckenbauer's Bayern Munich team was the best club side in the world during the mid-1970s, winning three successive European Cups and three successive Bundesliga titles, and Beckenbauer himself was twice named European Footballer of the year.

• In 2016 he was fined by FIFA's ethics committee for failing to co-operate with an inquiry into corruption over the awarding of the 2018 and 2022 World Cups.

2. Music maestro Ustad Rashid Khan dies at 55 in Kolkata

• **<u>Classical singer Ustad Rashid Khan</u>**, aged 55, passed away in a city hospital after valiantly battling cancer for over four years.

• Possibly the last living legend of Rampur Sahaswan gayaki (style of singing), Rashid Khan (pictured) was recognised as the 31st generation of Sangeet Samrat Mian Tansen, as detailed on his official website.

• Apart from Padma Shri in 2006 and Padma Bhushan awards in 2022, Rashid Khan was conferred with the West Bengal government's state honour, Bangabhusan, in 2012. 3. Renowned classical singer Prabha Atre, doyen of Kirana Gharana, dies at 92

• **Renowned classical singer Dr Prabha Atre** passed away following a cardiac arrest at her residence in Pune at the age of 92 early on January 13. Atre, who represented the Kirana Gharana of the Hindustani classical music, had been honoured with all three of Padma awards by the Indian government.

• Atre established the Swarmayee Gurukul to teach students all over the world in both traditions – 'guru-shishya parampara' and institutional.

• She strongly felt that it was important to bridge the gap between these two systems.

She was awarded the Padma Vibhushan, the nation's second-highest civilian honour, in January 2022. She was earlier honoured with the Padma Shri award in 1990 and the Padma Bhushan in 2002. She was also awarded the Sangeet Natak Akademi Award in 1991.
Dr Nitya Anand, man who discovered India's first oral contraceptive pill 'Saheli', dies at 99

• <u>Dr Nitya Anand, who discovered India's first oral contraceptive pill 'Saheli'</u>, passed away after a prolonged illness at SGPGIMS Lucknow on Saturday. He was 99. Anand was also the former director of the Central Drug Research Institute (CDRI) from 1974 to 1984. He was with CDRI since its inception in 1951.

• He was the brain behind the discovery of Centchroman', popularly known as 'Saheli.' It was the world's first and only non-steroidal, non-hormonal, once-a-week oral contraceptive pill. It was launched by then Prime Minister Rajiv Gandhi in 1986.

• In 2016, Saheli was incorporated in the National Family Programme of India.

• In 2012, he was awarded the Padma Shri by the Indian government.

5. First hockey Olympian of Chandigarh dies at 48

• Chandigarh's first hockey Olympian, Sukhbir Singh Gill passed away at the age of 48.

• Sukhbir Singh Gill, who represented the Indian men's hockey team at the Sydney 2000 Olympics and the 2002 Hockey World Cup in Kuala Lumpur.

• He also helped the Indian team to a gold medal finish at the 2001 Men's Hockey Champions Challenge in Malaysia.



Insurance

1. LIC trims stake in BHEL to 9.617%

• Life Insurance Corporation of India's has reduced its shareholding in Bharat Heavy Electricals Ltd to 9.617 per cent from 11.701 per cent.

• In a disclosure to the exchanges, LIC said it sold the shares at an average price of '79.58 through secondary market between June 2019 and December 2023.

2. IRDAI eases norms for investment in infrastructure by insurers

• The Insurance Regulatory and Development Authority of India (IRDA) has done away with the current practice of according a case to case basis approval for investments in Infrastructure Development Fund (IDF) by the insurers.

• This will give insurers a free hand to insurers in investing in IDF which is of course subjected to a general set of norms.

Previously, insurers were permitted to invest in IDFs backed by the central government on a case-by-case basis. The regulator has done away with the requirement for case-by-case approval for IDF as a measure to encourage investments by insurers in the sector and to increase the ease of doing business.
This is in the wake of the Reserve Bank of India's (RBI's) decision to enable IDF-NBFCs to play a

greater role in financing the infrastructure sector.

• According to recent regulation by IRDAI, insurers are allowed to make investments in IDF-NBFCs which are registered with the RBI and have a minimum credit rating of AA or its equivalent by a Credit Rating Agency registered with the Securities and Exchange Board of India (Sebi) to be eligible for the investment.

• These debt securities will have a residual tenure of not less than five years.

3. India insurance sector growth pegged at 7.1% in 2024-28: Swiss Re

• India's insurance sector is projected to record the fastest growth among the G20 countries with the total premium expected to rise at an average rate of 7.1 per cent in real terms during 2024-28.

• In comparison, the growth rate for the global insurance market will be around 2.4 per cent, said a report by Swiss Re Institute.

In the time period, the life insurance business is expected to record 6.7 per cent growth backed by rising demand for term life cover by the middle-income group and increased adoption of insurtech.
Meanwhile, the non-life segment is estimated to grow by 8.3 per cent owing to economic growth, improvement in distribution channels, government support and a favourable regulatory environment with health premiums forecasted to rise by 9.7 per cent.

• India's economic outlook also remains positive with average annual real gross domestic product (GDP) growth estimated to be 6.4 per cent between 2024 and 2028.

• <u>According to Swiss Re, the overall insurance penetration in 2023-24 is expected to be at 3.8</u> per cent in India and 6.5 per cent globally.

• Penetration for life insurance in India for the year is projected to be at 2.9 per cent, and for non-life at 1 per cent.

4. LIC launches Jeevan Dhara II plan

• State-owned Life Insurance Corporation of India (LIC) announced the launch of the nonparticipating product Jeevan Dhara-II.

 According to the exchange filing, the product, which will be available from 22 January 2023, is a nonlinked, non-participating, individual savings deferred annuity plan.

• In November, LIC had launched a new non-linked, non-participating individual savings whole life insurance product - Jeevan Utsav.

The minimum entry age for the product is 20 years.

• <u>The annuity is guaranteed from inception, offering 11 annuity options to the policyholders,</u> and they have the flexibility to choose between regular and single premiums.

• It offers a higher annuity rate at higher ages and life cover is available during the deferment period.

• The available deferment period is from 5 years to 15 years in the case of regular premium and from 1 year to 15 years for single premium.



India & World

1. France, Germany to provide 100 mln euros finance for AMRUT mission • France-based development agency AFD and Germany's KfW Bank are in talks with India to provide financing of 100 million euros to fund the country's urban

infrastructure plan, AMRUT mission.

• This follows the countries' recent collaboration on the City Investments to Innovate, Integrate and Sustain (CITIIS) 2.0 program.

• <u>AMRUT stands for Atal Mission for</u> <u>Rejuvenation and Urban Transformation.</u>

• It is a four-year initiative focused on urban renewal and sustainable waste management, to which they have contributed 100 million euros each.

• The program envisages to support competitively selected projects which promote circular economy with focus on integrated waste management at the city level, climate-oriented reform actions at the state level, and institutional strengthening at the national level.

• The Union Cabinet had approved the plan in May 2023.

• France's AFD was part of the CITIIS 1.0 program, which began in 2018. It has also provided technical expertise to the government's Smart Cities Mission in Nagpur, Pondicherry and Chandigarh, besides financing metro projects in Bengaluru, Pune, Surat, Nagpur and Kochi.

2. India, Pakistan exchange list of nuclear installations under 1988 bilateral pact
India and Pakistan exchanged a list of their nuclear installations under a bilateral pact signed in 1988 and came into force in 1991 that prohibits the two countries from attacking each other's atomic facilities.

• This is the 33rd consecutive exchange of such lists between the two countries, the first one having taken place on January 1, 1992.

• <u>The agreement—signed on December 31,</u> 1988, and came into force on January 27,

1991—mandates both the two countries to inform each other of nuclear installations and facilities to be covered under the agreement on the first of January of every calendar year.

3. Adidas to set up its first Asia GCC outside China in Tamil Nadu

• Adidas is setting up its first and only global capacity centre (GCC) in Asia outside China in Chennai, to focus on 'key processes'.

• The athletic footwear and apparel giant's move reinforces the recent boom of multinationals investing in India in large numbers to set up their GCCs to harness the abundant software skills in the country.

• The German corporation headquartered in Herzogenaurach, Bavaria, will set up its Global

Business Services (GBS) hub with Akhil Kapoor leading operations.

4. Cabinet approves MoU between India, Guyana on cooperation in hydrocarbons • Union Cabinet, chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, has approved the signing of a MoU between the <u>Ministry of Petroleum</u> and Natural Gas, India & the Ministry of <u>Natural Resources, Guyana</u>, on cooperation in the hydrocarbon sector.

• Also, it will include cooperation in the area of clean energy, including biofuels as well as the renewables sector, including solar energy.

Guyana, Capital: Georgetown.

• The Guyanese dollar is the official currency of Guyana.

• As per OPEC World Oil Outlook 2022, Guyana is projected to see a significant ramp-up in production, with liquids supply growing from 0.1 million barrel per day in 2021 to 0.9 mb/d in 2027.

• Further, as per the BP Statistical Review of World Energy 2022, **India is the world's 3rd largest energy consumer**, **the 3rd largest consumer of oil the 4th largest refiner** and the fastest-growing major economy with rising energy needs.

• The BP Energy Outlook and International Energy Agency estimate that India's energy demand would grow at about 3 per cent per annum till 2040, compared to the global rate of 1 per cent. Further, India is likely to account for approximately 25-28 per cent of the global energy demand growth between 2020-2040.

5. India, Nepal Ink Agreement on Export of 10,000 MW of Electricity

• Nepal's Energy secretary Gopal Sigdel & his Indian counterpart Pankaj Agrawal signed the bilateral agreement in the presence of Jaishankar & Nepal's Minister for Energy, Water Resources, & Irrigation.

• During Pushpa Kamal Dahal's first foreign visit in his third stint as Nepal's prime minister last June, Prime Minister Narendra Modi had announced that they had initiated an agreement for New Delhi to import 10,000 MW of electricity over a decade.

6. Denmark announces alliance on green fuels in India

• <u>Denmark has announced its Green Fuels</u> <u>Alliance India (GFAI)</u> initiative to boost



collaborative efforts between the two countries in the sustainable energy solutions sector and advance their joint global goal towards carbon neutrality.

• The new alliance is a strategic initiative poised to play a pivotal role in advancing the green fuels sector, including green hydrogen.

It aims to achieve it by fostering innovation, collaboration, and partnerships between Danish industries and their counterparts in India.
GFAI's primary objective is to promote sustainable energy growth in India by establishing an ecosystem that encourages collaboration among businesses, government entities, research institutions, and financial stakeholders from both the Indian and Danish sectors.

7. NPCI expands UPI's linkage with Singapore's PayNow

• <u>India and Singapore</u> last year linked their respective digital payments systems, Unified Payments Interface (UPI) and PayNow.

• The National Payments Corporation of India (NPCI) has now announced that this facility is live on BHIM (Bharat Interface for Money), PhonePe and Paytm.

• It added that more Third-Party Application Providers (TPAPs) and bank apps such as Bank of Baroda, Bank of India, Canara Bank, Central Bank of India, Federal Bank, HDFC Bank, IDFC First Bank, IndusInd Bank, Karur Vysya Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank, Punjab National Bank, South Indian Bank, and UCO Bank are expected to be added to the linkage soon.

India Signs Agreement for Lithium Exploration & Mining Project in Argentina • <u>Ministry of Mines, Government of India has</u> <u>achieved a significant milestone with the</u> <u>signing of an agreement between Khanij</u> <u>Bidesh India Limited (KABIL) and the stateowned enterprise of Catamarca province of</u> <u>Argentina</u> CATAMARCA MINERA Y ENERGTICA SOCIEDAD DEL ESTADO (CAMYEN SE) at Catamarca, Argentina today i.e., on 15th January, 2024.

This is the first ever lithium exploration and mining project by a Government Company of India. KABIL will start exploration and development of 5 lithium brine blocks viz
Cortadera-I, 2. Cortadera-VII, 3. Cortadera-VIII, 4. Cateo-2022-01810132 and 5. Cortadera-VI covering an area of about 15,703 Hectare, located in the Catamarca province of Argentina.
KABIL is also preparing to set up a branch office at Catamarca, Argentina. The project cost is about 200 crores.

• <u>Supported by the Bill and Melinda Gates</u> <u>Foundation, the alliance will be housed and</u> <u>anchored by the CII Centre for Women</u> <u>Leadership. The World Economic Forum has</u> <u>come on board as a 'Network Partner' and Invest</u>

India as an 'Institutional Partner'. 11. India To Include Persian As One Of 9 Classical Languages

• In a significant move to deepen cultural ties, <u>External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar</u> <u>announced that the Government of India</u>



<u>has decided to include Farsi (Persian) as</u> one of the nine classical languages in India under the New Education Policy.

• This recognition reflects a commitment to fostering greater understanding and appreciation of Farsi's rich heritage within the India.

• Tamil was the first language in India to be accorded classical language status in 2004. Sanskrit, Kannada, Malayalam, and Odia are the other languages that have been declared classical languages in India by the central government.

• "In addition to these classical languages Pali, Persian, and Prakrit; and their works of literature too must be preserved for their richness and for the pleasure and enrichment of posterity," according to India's National Education Policy-2020.

• <u>Currently there are six languages that</u> <u>enjoy the 'Classical' status in India:</u>

• Tamil (declared in 2004), Sanskrit (2005), Kannada (2008), Telugu (2008), Malayalam (2013), and Odia (2014).

All the Classical Languages are listed in the Eighth Schedule of the Constitution. The Eighth Schedule to the Constitution consists of the following 22languages:-(1) Assamese, (2) Bengali, (3) Gujarati, (4) Hindi, (5) Kannada, (6) Kashmiri, (7)Konkani, (8) Malayalam, (9) Manipuri, (10) Marathi, (11) Nepali, (12) Oriya, (13)Punjabi, (14) Sanskrit, (15) Sindhi, (16) Tamil, (17) Telugu, (18) Urdu (19) Bodo,(20) Santhali, (21) Maithili and (22) Dogri .Of these languages, 14 were initially included in the Constitution. Sindhi language was added in 1967. Thereafter three more

languages viz., Konkani, Manipuri and Nepali were included in 1992. Subsequently Bodo, Dogri, Maithiliand Santhali were added in 2004.

12. Switzerland and India reach deal on FTA after 16 years of negotiations

 Switzerland and India have reached consensus on a free-trade agreement after 16 years of negotiations, Swiss Economy Minister Guy Parmelin said.

• The agreement will create jobs for the young population of India, and secure employment in Switzerland,

13. Cabinet approves Protocol for establishment of joint Economic and Trade Committee between India and Dominican Republic • The Union Cabinet chaired by Prime Minister Shri Narendra Modi approved the proposal for signing of a protocol for establishment of <u>Joint Economic and Trade</u> <u>Committee (JETCO) between the</u> <u>Department of Commerce, Ministry of</u> <u>Commerce and Industry of the Republic of</u> <u>India and the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of</u> <u>the Dominican Republic.</u>

• The establishment of JETCO will facilitate mitigating challenges in export of Indian products of mutual dialogue and pave the way for boosting exports of pharmaceuticals, automobiles and engineering goods manufactured in India leading to more foreign exchange earnings for a Atmanirbhar Bharat.

• AIIB aims to support the development of InvITs as an infrastructure asset class in India. The successful listing of SEIT contributes to the capital-raising track record and is a testament to establishing and validating InvITs as a long-term financing channel in India.

1. Reliance Industries becomes first in India to use chemical recycling for Circular Polymers

• Reliance Industries Limited (RIL), operator of the world's largest integrated refining and petrochemical complex, has become the first Indian company to chemically recycle plastic waste-based pyrolysis oil into International Sustainability & Carbon Certification (ISCC)-Plus certified Circular Polymers.

• RIL's Jamnagar refinery became the first refinery to get this.

• RIL shipped its first batch of ISCC-Plus certified Circular Polymers, named CircuRepol[™] (Polypropylene) and CircuRelene[™] (Polyethylene).

2. 2023 recorded hottest year ever as Earth nears critical 1.5C limit

• Last year was the planet's hottest on record by a substantial margin and likely the world's warmest in the last 100,000 years, the European Union's Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S) said.

• Since June, every month has been the world's hottest on record compared with the corresponding month in previous years.

• <u>C3S confirmed 2023 as the hottest year in global temperature records going back to 1850.</u> When checked against paleoclimatic data records from sources such as tree rings and air bubbles in glaciers, Buontempo said it was "very likely" the warmest year in the last 100,000 years.

• On average, in 2023 the planet was 1.48 degrees Celsius warmer than in the 1850-1900 pre-industrial period, when humans began burning fossil fuels on an industrial scale, pumping carbon dioxide into the atmosphere.

• Countries agreed in the 2015 Paris Agreement to try to prevent global warming surpassing 1.5C (2.7 degrees Fahrenheit), to avoid its most severe consequences.

• The world has not breached that target - which refers to an average global temperature of 1.5C over decades - but C3S said that temperatures had exceeded the level on nearly half of the days of 2023 set "a dire precedent".

• The world's CO2 emissions from burning coal, oil and gas hit record levels in 2023.

• Last year, the concentration of CO2 in the atmosphere rose to the highest level recorded, of 419 parts per million, C3S said.

• It was also the first year in which every day was more than 1C hotter than pre-industrial times. For the first time, two days - both of them in November - were 2C warmer than in the pre-industrial period, C3S said.

3. Himalayan Wolf Classified as 'Vulnerable' on IUCN Red List

• The Himalayan Wolf (Canis lupus chanco), a prominent lupine predator found across the Himalayas the taxonomic status of which was a puzzle till late, has been assessed for the first time in the International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN)'s Red List.

• The animal has been categorised as <u>'Vulnerable' on the IUCN Red List</u>. The assessment was done on June 27, 2023.

About IUCN:

• Established in 1964, **The International Union for Conservation of Nature's Red List of Threatened Species** has evolved to become the world's most comprehensive information source on

the global conservation status of animal, fungi and plant species.

• The IUCN Red List Categories and Criteria are intended to be an easily and widely understood system for classifying species at high risk of global extinction. It divides species into nine categories: **Not Evaluated**, **Data Deficient**, **Least Concern**, **Near**

• All states / Union Territories & all scheduled commercial banks, Urban Local Bodies (**ULB**s), RRBs and Cooperative Banks are expected to be onboarding the PAiSA portal by December 2018.

• The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has approved the proposed acquisition of <u>100%</u> shareholding of GVK Power (Goindwal Sahib) Limited by Punjab State Power Corporation Ltd.

• The PSPCL, a fully owned entity of the Punjab government, is set to acquire 100% shareholding of the power generation company.

• The Punjab State Power Corporation

Ltd, is a fully owned undertaking of the Government of Punjab.

• The erstwhile Punjab State Electricity Board (PSEB), was a statutory body formed on 01st February, 1959 under the Electricity Supply Act, 1948.

• The PSEB was "unbundled" by the Government of Punjab vide Notification No. 1/9/08-EB(PR)196 dated 16th April, 2010 into two separate entities – Punjab State Power Corporation Limited (PSPCL) and Punjab State Transmission Corporation Limited (PSTCL).

• The GVK Power (Goindwal Sahib)

Limited, is incorporated in December 1997, is a wholly owned subsidiary of GVK Energy Limited which in turn is the subsidiary of GVK Power and Infrastructure Limited. It is engaged in power generation through a 540 coal based thermal power plant.

3. Canada-based Brookfield Asset Management to buy ATC India in \$2 bn deal • Canada-based Brookfield Asset Management will acquire the Indian business of American Tower Corporation (ATC) for an enterprise value of <u>Rs 16,628</u> <u>crore (\$2 billion)</u>, the company said.

• After its third acquisition in India's telecom sector in four years, Brookfield is set to become the largest manager of telecom towers in the country.

• The deal will see Data Infrastructure Trust (DIT), an infrastructure investment trust sponsored by an affil-iate of Brookfield Asset Management, acquire 100 per cent of equity interests in ATC India. DIT currently houses Brookfield's telecom tower businesses in India through Summit Digitel and Crest Digitel.

• "The acquired sites are expected to diversify DIT's revenues and increase touch points with all mobile network operators in India," Brookfield said.

4. LIC to acquire 10% stake in National Housing Board-promoted company
Life Insurance Corporation of India said its board has approved acquiring up to <u>10 per</u> <u>cent</u> in a company promoted by the National Housing Bank.

• In a regulatory filing, LIC said the board has cleared the proposal to invest in a new company, promoted by the NHB, for residential mortgagebacked securities, through equity contribution up to 10 per cent of share capital.

• RMBS are basically debt-based assets backed by the interest paid on residential loans. RMBS are bonds which are secured against a large pool of residential mortgages (home loans).

• RMBS are generally considered to be a safer investment than some other asset types.

5. Tata Consumer signs pacts to buy Capital Foods, Organic India

• Tata Consumer Products Ltd (TCPL) announced that it has signed definitive agreements to <u>fully acquire Capital Foods</u>, owner of Ching's Secret and Smith & Jones, and Organic India, the Fabindia-backed organic teas and health products maker.

• TCPL will pay an enterprise value on a no cashno debt basis of '5,100 crore for 100% stake in Capital Foods.

• TCPL said the takeover of Organic India will cost '1,900 crore.

• Sunil D'Souza, MD & CEO, Tata Consumer Products.

6. Reliance Industries sells REC Solar Norway to Elkem ASA for \$22 million
REC Solar Holdings AS, a step-down wholly-owned subsidiary of Reliance Industries Ltd (RIL), has informed that it has, on January 14, 2024, entered into a share purchase agreement with Elkem ASA for the sale of its <u>100 per cent equity</u> stake in REC Solar Norway AS for an aggregate cash consideration of USD 22 million.
Founded in 1904, Elkem ASA is a silicon-based material provider.



7. Competition Commission of India approves amalgamation of Shriram GI Holdings Private Limited with Shriram General Insurance

• The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has approved the proposed amalgamation of Shriram GI Holdings Private Limited with Shriram General Insurance Company Limited.

• The proposed combination relates to the amalgamation of Shriram GI Holdings Private Limited (SGIH) with Shriram General insurance Company Limited (SGIC) (Proposed Combination).

• The competition watchdog also granted its approval to the proposal for the merger of Shriram LI Holdings Pvt Ltd with Shriram Life Insurance Company Ltd. Shriram Life Insurance Company is jointly promoted by Shriram Group and South Africa-based financial services firm Sanlam Group.

• Both Shriram GI Holdings and Shriram LI Holdings undertake the business of investments.

8. DMI group acquires BNPL startup ZestMoney in a distress sale deal

• DMI Group, a pan-India financial services platform, said it has acquired the beleaguered 'buy now pay later' (BNPL) ZestMoney (Zest) platform.

• DMI, which has raised over \$1.5 billion of equity investment and is supported by global institutional investors and international banks, didn't reveal the value of the transaction.

9. Sony scraps \$10 bn Zee merger deal; seeks \$90 million in termination fees After two years of hectic negotiations, Sony Pictures Networks India (SPNI) issued a termination notice to Zee Entertainment Enterprises Limited (ZEEL) on their merger agreement.

• The wholly-owned subsidiary of Sony Group Corporation of Japan has also sought <u>\$90 million</u> in termination fees from ZEEL.

• The merger would have created a \$10 billion entertainment giant with a market share of 25 per cent among general entertainment channels. Deal Timeline-

• The CCI said Puran Associates, MB Finmart, VIC Enterprises and Milky Investment & Trading Company, which jointly hold 21.25% of REL, have proposed to acquire a majority shareholding of up to 53.94% (assuming full acceptance in the open offer process by the public shareholders).

11. CCI approves JSW's acquisition of up to 38% stake in MG Motor India

• The Competition Commission of India (CCI) has given its approval for Sajjan Jindal-promoted JSW Group's proposed acquisition of up to <u>38 per cent</u> stake in MG Motor India.

"The Acquirer is a newly incorporated entity and is not engaged in any activities as on date.
It is a wholly owned subsidiary of JSW International Tradecorp Pte. Limited and belongs to JSW Group," the CCI stated.

12. Nazara Tech's Nodwin Gaming to acquire 100% stake in Comic Con India • Nodwin Gaming, a subsidiary of Nazara

Technologies, on 24 Jan 2024, announced that it will acquire a <u>100 per cent stake</u> in Comic Con India at a valuation of Rs 55 crore.

• Comic Con India is famous for hosting multiple pop cultural festivals in India.

• In the announcement, Nazara Tech said that the acquisition will take place through a combination of cash and share swaps from Jatin Varma and Karan Kalra, the founders of Comic Con India. Varma and Kalra will, however, continue to operate the business as a part of Nodwin Gaming.

• Comic Con India was founded in 2011 and holds festivals across cities throughout the year. After the acquisition, the company will expand the number of festivals across the country and increase its penetration to other countries as well.

• The proposed combination relates to the acquisition of 100% of the Wistron Infocomm Manufacturing (India) Private Limited's (Target) equity share capital from SMS Infocomm



(Singapore) Private Limited and Wistron Hong Kong Limited by Tata Electronics Private Limited (Acquirer).

• The Acquirer is a greenfield venture of Tata Sons Private Limited. It manufactures smartphone enclosures (i.e. the frame of the phone on which other components/subassembles of a smartphone are assembled), a high precision component for smartphones.

• The Target is an electrical and electronics manufacturing company engaged in electronic manufacturing services (i.e., contract manufacturing of electronics) for smartphones in India, at its plant in Karnataka. It was

• The shareholders of Fincare will be allotted shares in the merged entity, post the Proposed Combination.

AU is also licensed to transact business under AD-II bank category (foreign exchange).
AU is also engaged in provision of ancillary functions such as distribution of insurance and investment products such as mutual funds, and portfolio management services. Fincare is a banking company and provides deposit services (such as savings account, current account, fixed deposits, recurring deposits), lending services (including retail and microfinance loans), and digital banking services.

15. LIC gets nod from RBI to raise HDFC Bank stake to 9.99%

 HDFC Bank announced that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has granted approval for the Life Insurance Corp. of India (LIC) to acquire an additional <u>4.8% stake</u> in the country's largest private sector lender.
 <u>LIC currently holds a 5.19% stake in HDFC</u> Bank.

• According to a stock exchange filing by HDFC Bank, the RBI has advised LIC to complete the acquisition of the additional HDFC Bank shares within a year. However, LIC must ensure that its overall holding in the bank does not exceed 9.99% of the paid-up share capital or voting rights of the bank at any given time.

 The central bank's approval is contingent on LIC's compliance with various regulations, including the <u>Banking Regulation Act, 1949</u>, RBI's Master Direction and Guidelines on Acquisition and Holding of Shares or Voting Rights in Banking Companies, the <u>Foreign</u> <u>Exchange Management Act, 1999</u>, and regulations issued by the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI).

• Under the RBI regulations, any entity seeking to acquire a substantial shareholding in a bank, defined as an aggregate holding of 5% or more of the paid-up share capital or voting rights, must obtain prior approval from the regulator.

Agri-Business

1. India's lentil production set to touch all-time high: Govt

India is likely to emerge as the world's largest producer of masoor (lentil) in the 2023-24 crop year (July-June) with the projected output of around 1.6 million tonne (MT).
If the projection comes true, the country's lentil output would be highest since the 2027-18 crop year when it produced 1.62 MT of pulse variety. In the 2022-23 crop year, lentil output was 1.55 MT.
Canada is the largest producer currently.

1. FASTags with incomplete KYC to get deactivated by banks after Jan 31: Govt

• To enhance the efficiency of the electronic toll collection system and provide seamless movement at the toll plazas, National Highways Authority of India (NHAI) has taken the <u>'One</u> <u>Vehicle, One FASTag' initiative</u>, which aims to discourage using a single FASTag for multiple vehicles or linking multiple FASTags to a particular vehicle.

• FASTag uses the Radio Frequency Identification Technology (RFID).

• FASTags with a valid balance but an incomplete KYC will get deactivated or blacklisted by banks post-January 31, the Ministry of Road Transport and Highways said.

• NHAI is also encouraging FASTag users to complete the 'Know Your Customer' (KYC) process of their latest FASTag by updating KYC as per RBI guidelines.

• To avoid inconvenience, users must ensure that the KYC of their latest FASTag is complete. FASTag users must also comply with 'One Vehicle, One FASTag' and discard all the earlier issued FASTags through their respective banks.

• Only the latest FASTag account shall remain active, as previous tags will be deactivated or blacklisted after January 31, 2024. For further assistance or queries, FASTag users can reach out to the nearest toll plaza or toll-free customer care number of their respective banks.

 Arunachal Pradesh's Pakke Paga Hornbill Festival gears up for its 9th Edition
 The 9th edition of the <u>Pakke Paga Hornbill</u> <u>Festival (PPHF)</u>, a state festival of Arunachal Pradesh, will take place at

Seijosa in the Pakke Kessang district from January 18-20, 2024.

• The festival focuses on wildlife conservation, with a particular emphasis on hornbills. This year, the festival's theme is Domutoh Domutoh, Paga hum Domutoh.

• Four species of the birds — Wreathed, Great Indian, Oriental Pied and the endangered Rufous-necked — are found in the Pakke Tiger Reserve (PTR) of Arunachal Pradesh.

• The area is also home to the Nyishi, the largest tribal group in Arunachal Pradesh. The first-ever PPHF was held on January 16-18, 2015.

• The aim was to recognise the role played by the Nyishi in conserving hornbills in PTR.

• The Nyishi had formerly hunted hornbills and used their bills to craft traditional headgear. They had later turned hornbill conservationists.

• South Korean firm has been allotted 30 acres of land and the work will start in the next two-three months. The company will need 6-7 months to set up the plants. Simmtech is the world's biggest manufacturer of semiconductor substrates.

• The company has been given subsidy under SPECS (Scheme for Promotion of Manufacturing of Electronic Components and Semiconductors (SPECS) by the centre as well as state government.

Gujarat

1. Gujarat govt signs deals worth \$86 billion ahead of investment summit

• India's Gujarat state signed initial investment agreements worth 7.17 trillion Indian rupees (\$86.07 billion) with 58 companies operating in sectors such as energy, oil and gas, and chemicals.

• Gujarat has been signing these agreements ahead of its biennial Vibrant Gujarat Global

Summit, which is scheduled to take place in state capital Gandhinagar from Jan. 10 to Jan. 12.

2. First 'Made In India' Memory chip is expected to be produced in Gujarat in 2024, says Union Minister Ashwini Vaishnav
• Union Electronics and IT Minister Ashwini Vaishnav said the first 'Made In India' Memory chip is expected to be produced in Gujarat this year.

Addressing a seminar on Semiconductors and Electronics at the Vibrant Gujarat Global Summit in Gandhinagar, the Minister said Micron's investment in Gujarat will pave the way for creating a Semiconductor ecosystem in India.

• In November 2023, Idaho-headquartered semiconductor major Micron Technology's made its largest ever investment in Sanand, Gujarat, will make India a global hub for semiconductor manufacturing,

• With a total proposed investment of \$2.75 billion — it is the largest so far under the India Semiconductor Mission (ISM).

• While Micron has committed \$825 million, the rest will be covered by state and central government subsidies.

• <u>Kachchhi Kharek</u>, the indigenous variety of dates of Kutch, has become the second fruit of Gujarat to get a geographical indication (GI) tag from the Controller General of

• Jubilant farmers of the semi-arid district have hailed the decision.

With this, fresh dates of Kutch become the second fruit from Gujarat to get a GI tag.
In 2011, <u>Gir kesar mango</u> – grown in present-day Junagadh, Gir Somnath and Amreli districts of Saurashtra – was given the GI tag.

• The same year, Bhalia wheat grown in Bhal region abutting central Gujarat and Saurashtra regions of Gujarat was also awarded the tag. Jharkhand

1. Jharkhand govt brings down age for enrolling in pension scheme to 50

• The Jharkhand cabinet has recently approved the proposal of including all women, tribals and Dalits above 50 in its old-age pension scheme.

• Earlier, those above 60 years used to get the benefit of the scheme, under which Rs 1,000 is provided to each beneficiary per month.

• The cabinet gave its nod to the amendment in the <u>Mukhya Mantri Rajya Vridhavastha</u> Pension Yojana.

It is an important amendment, which will allow all women and people of ST and ST category above 50 years to be covered under the scheme.
A total of 35.68 lakh people already get the benefit of the scheme.

• Twenty-five other proposals were also approved by the cabinet, including the distribution of 'Matri Kit' to pregnant women, the kit, worth around Rs 1,500, will have 14 materials, including a mosquito net, a cotton saree, a cotton towel and a toothpaste.

• "Six lakh pregnant will be benefited by it. Rs 22.5 crore has been estimated for it in the current financial year,'.

• The cabinet also gave its nod for the appointment of Yogendra Prasad as the chairman of the State Backward Commission for three years.

Karnataka

1. Siddaramaiah launches 'Yuva Nidhi' scheme for unemployed youth in Karnataka's Shivamogga

• Karnataka Chief Minister Siddaramaiah launched the fifth and final poll guarantee of the Congress--<u>'Yuva Nidhi' scheme</u>--at Freedom Park in Shivamogga.

• The scheme offers unemployment assistance to graduates and diploma holders who got their degrees in the academic year 2022-23.

• The government has promised to give Rs 3,000 per month to degree holders and Rs 1,500 per month to diploma holders who were unable to get a job in the past six months and are not pursuing higher studies.

• The ruling government has already launched four of the five guarantees, which are 'Shakti', providing free rides to Karnataka women in nonluxury government buses, 'Anna Bhagya' offering 10 kg rice to BPL families, 'Gruha Jyoti' giving free electricity up to 200 units to household users, and 'Gruha Lakshmi' promising Rs 2,000 a month to women heads of families having APL/BPL ration cards.

1. Kerala launches K-Smart tech solution to streamline local self-government services • Kerala Chief Minister Pinarayi Vijayan has launched <u>K-SMART</u> (Kerala Solutions for Managing Administrative Reformation and Transformation), the first of its kind project in the country aimed at making available all services of local self government institutions over a uniform digital platform.

• K-SMART ensures easy access of most vital services to the common public.

2. Sh. Gadkari unveils Rs 1,464 crore highway projects in Kerala

• Union Minister for Road, Transport and Highways, Nitin Gadkari has inaugurated and laid the foundation stone of 12 National Highway projects in Kerala with an investment of over Rs 1,464 crore.

• The total highway length of 105 km is poised to generate substantial employment opportunities, both directly and indirectly, fostering socio-economic growth in Kerala.

3. Artificial reef project inaugurated in Kerala capital

 Seven products from Odisha, ranging from the <u>Similipal Kai</u> chutney made with red weaver ants to the embroidered
 <u>Kapdaganda shawl</u>, have bagged the coveted Geographical Indication (GI) tag in recognition of their exclusivity to the state.
 With these new entrants, the total number of GI-registered products in Odisha rose to 25. Geographical Indications of goods refer to the place of origin of a product.

• The new items include the Odisha Khajuri Guda, Dhenkanal Magji, Similipal Kai Chutney, Nayagarh Kanteimundi brinjal, Dongria Kondh embroidery shawl, Koraput Kalajeera rice and the paintings of Lanjia Saora.

2. Odisha clears JSW's Rs 40,000 cr proposal to set up EV manufacturing units • The Odisha government approved 14 proposals including the JSW Group's plan to set up electric vehicles and component manufacturing units in Cuttack and Jagatsinghpur districts with an investment of <u>Rs 40,000 crore</u>, a senior official said.

• The JSW Group has proposed to set- up an EV & EV battery manufacturing project at Naraj, Cuttack.

• The company is also planning to set up an original equipment manufacturing (OEM) plant for EVs and components in the same facility in two phases, he said, adding, that JSW is planning to invest Rs 25,000 crore in the state, generating employment for more than 4,000 people through this facility.

• The state cabinet also approved the scheme 'Coffee Plantation for Sustainable Livelihoods (CPSL)' to promote coffee plantation in six districts of Odisha with a total outlay of Rs 1,144 crore.

Punjab

1. Nitin Gadkari inaugurates, lays foundation stones of 29 highway projects worth Rs 4,000 cr in Punjab

• Union Minister for Road Transport & Highways, Nitin Gadkari, inaugurated and laid foundation stones of 29 national highway projects worth Rs 4,000 crore in Punjab.

• The projects included Ladhowal bypass in Ludhiana, six-lane flyover and two-lane road over bridge in Ludhiana, four laning of Jalandhar-Kapurthala section, and three bridges on the Jalandhar-Makhu road.

Tamil Nadu

1. PM Modi inaugurates new terminal building at Tiruchirappalli airport

Prime Minister Narendra Modi inaugurated new terminal building at Tiruchirappalli International Airport in Tamil Nadu.
The new terminal building has been developed at a cost of more than Rs 1100 crore.

• The two-level new international terminal building has the capacity to serve more than 44 lakh passengers annually and about 3500 passengers during peak hours.

 Tiruchirappalli International Airport is the second-largest airport in terms of international passenger traffic after Chennai in Tamil Nadu. Prime Minister Modi also dedicated to the nation multiple railway projects worth crores. These include the doubling of the 41.4 km Salem-Magnesite Junction-Omalur-Mettur Dam section; the doubling of the rail line section of 160 km from Madurai-Tuticorin; and three projects for rail line electrification: Tiruchchirappalli-Manamadurai-Virudhunagar; Virudhunagar-Tenkasi Junction; Sengottai-Tenkasi Junction; Tirunelveli- Tirunelveli- Tiruchendur. The rail projects are tipped to help improve the rail capacity to carry freight and passengers and contribute to economic development and employment generation in Tamil Nadu.

2. Tata Power Company to invest nearly Rs 70,000 crore in Tamil Nadu

• In what may well be the largest single investment by **Tata Power Company in any** state, the power major is all set to invest around <u>Rs 70,000 crore</u> to come up with a 10 gigawatt (GW) solar and wind units in Tamil Nadu over a period of five to seven years.

• TP Solar's manufacturing plant is expected to start commercial production of cells and modules by FY25.

3. Vietnam's VinFast unveils \$2 billion investment for integrated electric-vehicle manufacturing facility in Tamil Nadu
The company has earmarked an initial investment of \$500 million, the EV giant said in a statement, for the first phase of



the project, spanning five years in Thoothukudi.

• VinFast also stated that it anticipates its Indian EV project to evolve into a "first-class EV production hub" in the region, with an annual capacity of up to 150,000 vehicles.

• VinFast recently named its founder and biggest financial backer, Pham Nhat Vuong, as chief executive as it plans an ambitious overseas expansion and ramps up sales via dealerships. Hereplaces Le Thi Thu Thuy.

4. SIPCOT and Singapore Govt Collaborate for India's First Net-Zero Estate

• A comprehensive framework for <u>India's</u> <u>first Net Zero Industrial Park</u>, as a result of the collaborative efforts of the Tamil Nadu and Singapore governments, is likely to be finalised in the next one year.

• The framework will guide the establishment of a net-zero industrial park, which SIPCOT has plans to design and build in the North of Chennai.

Uttar Pradesh

1. UP govt to build a 1472-acre pharma park in Lalitpur, Bundelkhand

• The Uttar Pradesh government plans establishing a pharma park in Lalitpur, Bundelkhand, covering 1472 acres across five villages.

• <u>The identified villages for the survey include</u> <u>Saidpur (426 acres), Gadolikala (249 acres),</u> <u>Largan (239 acres), Karounda (116 acres), and</u> <u>Rampur (441 acres).</u>

The plan is guided by <u>Uttar Pradesh State</u> <u>Industrial Development Authority (UPSIDA)</u>.
The plan, guided by Uttar Pradesh State Industrial Development Authority (UPSIDA), will unfold in two phases, with an initial focus on immediate development efforts covering 300 acres of land.

• UPSIDA is also taking steps to expedite development projects at Site-1 and Site-2 in Orai, along with the Plastic City project in Dibiyapur.

• The Plastic Park, spread across 274.4 acres, encompasses industrial units, residential areas,

and basic infrastructure. UPSIDA is actively seeking agencies to provide layout guide maps, sectoral maps, and gantry signage boards.

2. 100 new biogas plants soon to be established in UP: Hardeep Puri

• Union Petroleum Minister Hardeep Singh Puri announced the establishment of 100 new biogas plants in Uttar Pradesh.

• A new compressed biogas plant was inaugurated in Budaun, with the foundation stone being laid for new plants in eight other districts. The Budaun plant, developed on 50 acres with an investment of about Rs 135 crore, will produce 14 tonne of compressed biogas.

Lakshadweep

1. PM Modi inaugurates and lays foundation of projects worth Rs 1,156 crore in Lakshadweep

• PM Modi inaugurated and laid the foundation for various projects worth Rs 1,150 crore in the Union Territory of Lakshadweep.

• This includes the Kochi-Lakshadweep Islands Submarine Optical Fibre Connection (KLI - SOFC) project.

• PM also inaugurated the Low Temperature Thermal Desalination plant at Kadmat, which will produce 1.5 lakh litres of clean drinking water every day. The current Administrator of the union territory of Lakshadweep is Praful Khoda Patel.

Additionally, he dedicated to the nation the Functional Household Tap Connections (FHTC) in all households on the Agatti and Minicoy islands.
Other projects launched by Modi include

the solar power plant at Kavaratti, the firstever battery-backed solar power project in Lakshadweep.

• He also laid the foundation stone for the renovation of the primary health care facility in Kalpeni and the construction of five model Anganwadi centres (Nand Ghars) in the five islands of Androth, Chetlat, Kadmat, Agatti and Minicoy.

Commerce ministry sets up task force to resolve trade barrier issues for exporters The commerce ministry has set up a task force to identify and resolve trade barriers being faced by exporters.

• The ministry is also looking at improving mutual recognition agreements (MRAs) with different countries so that product standards are as per the requirements of the importing countries.

• Indian exports that routinely face high barriers include chillies, tea and basmati rice.

• According to a report by the economic think tank Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), India needs to act in a fast-track manner for the removal of non-trade barriers in countries such as the US, China and Japan.

• It has asked for upgrading domestic systems, in cases where Indian products are rejected due to quality issues; and retaliating if unreasonable standards or rules continue to obstruct exports from New Delhi.

• Indian exports that routinely face high barriers include chillies, tea and basmati rice.

• Most non-tariff measures are created by countries with an aim to protect human, animal or plant health and environment.





Important CA

1. Indore, Bhopal, Udaipur selected for Wetland City Accreditation scheme under the Ramsar Convention

• MoEF&CC has submitted three nominations from India for Wetland City Accreditation of Indore (Madhya Pradesh), Bhopal (Madhya Pradesh) & Udaipur (Rajasthan) under the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands.

• The wetlands situated in and around these cities provide a plethora of benefits to its citizens in terms of flood regulation, livelihood opportunities, and recreational values.

• These are the first three Indian cities for which nominations have been submitted for WCA based on the proposals received from respective State Wetlands Authorities in collaboration with the Municipal Corporations.

• Sirpur Wetland (Ramsar site in Indore), Yashwant Sagar (Ramsar site closer to Indore), Bhoj Wetland (Ramsar Site in Bhopal), and several Wetlands (Lakes) in and around Udaipur are lifelines to these cities.

The three nominated cities include:

• **Indore**: Founded by Holkars, Indore is the cleanest city in India and the recipient of India's Smart City Award 2023 for its best sanitation, water and urban environment. Sirpur Lake, a Ramsar Site in the city, has been recognised as an important site for water bird congregation and is being developed as a Bird Sanctuary. A strong network of more than 200 wetland mitras is engaged in bird conservation and sensitising local community to protect Sarus Crane.

• **Bhopal**: One of the cleanest cities in India that has proposed conservation zones around the wetlands in its draft City Development Plan 2031. Bhoj Wetland, Ramsar Site is the city's lifeline, equipped with the world-class wetlands interpretation centre, Jal Tarang. Additionally, the Bhopal Municipal Corporation has a dedicated Lake Conservation Cell. A network of more than 300 wetland mitras is engaged in wetland management and conservation of Sarus Crane.

• **Udaipur**: Located in Rajasthan, the city is surrounded by five major wetlands, namely, Pichola, Fateh Sagar, Rang Sagar, Swaroop Sagar, and Doodh Talai. These wetlands are an integral part of the city's culture and identity, help maintain the city's microclimate, and provide a buffer from extreme events.

Wetland City Accreditation (WCA):

• Recognizing the importance of wetlands in urban and peri-urban environments and to take appropriate measures to conserve and protect these wetlands, the Ramsar Convention during COP12 held in the year 2015 approved a voluntary Wetland City Accreditation system under Resolution XII.10 which recognizes cities which have taken exceptional steps to safeguard their urban wetlands.

• The Wetland City Accreditation scheme aims to further promote the conservation and wise use of urban and peri-urban wetlands, as well as sustainable socio-economic benefits for local populations.

• Additionally, the Accreditation seeks to encourage cities that are close to and dependent on wetlands, primarily Wetlands of International Importance, but also wetlands with other conservation category status, to develop and strengthen a positive relationship with these valuable ecosystems.

• To be formally accredited, a candidate for the Wetland City Accreditation should satisfy the standards used to implement each of the six international criteria mentioned Operational Guidance for WCA of the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands.

• This voluntary scheme provides an opportunity for cities that value their natural or human-made wetlands to gain international recognition and positive branding opportunities for their efforts in demonstrating strong positive relationships with wetlands.

2. In 9 years, 248mn pulled out of multidimensional poverty: Niti Aayog paper
As many as 248.2 million Indians are projected to have come out of multidimensional poverty between 2013-14 and 2022-23, according to the latest <u>NITI</u> <u>Aayog discussion paper titled</u>
'Multidimensional Poverty in India since 2005-06'.

More Finding from the Paper:

• The paper estimated that the share of the multidimensional poor in India's population declined sharply to 11.28 per cent in 2022-23 from 29.17 per cent in 2013-14. In 2019-21, it stood at 14.96 per cent.

• The paper also showed that the pace of decline in poverty headcount ratio using the exponential method was much faster between 2015-16 and 2019-21 (10.66 per cent annual rate of decline) compared with



the 2005-06 to 2015-16 period (7.69 per cent annual rate of decline). "All 12 indicators of MPI have recorded significant improvement during the entire study period," the NITI Aayog said. The discussion paper by the central government think-tank interpolated and projected the poverty headcount ratio for the year 2013-14 using the National Family Health Survey-3 (NFHS-3) data. Similarly, the headcount ratio for the year 2022-23 was interpolated on the basis of the rate of decline seen between NFHS-4 (2015-16) and NFHS- 5 (2019-21). The multidimensional poverty index (MPI) identifies and captures overlapping deprivations in health, education, and living standards that are represented by 12 SDG-aligned indicators, such as nutrition, child and adolescent mortality, maternal health, years of schooling, school attendance, cooking fuel, sanitation, drinking water, electricity, and housing. Earlier, poverty estimates predominantly relied on income as the sole indicator. Among states, Uttar Pradesh registered the biggest decline in the number of poor, with 59.4 million people coming out of multidimensional poverty in the past nine years. It was followed by Bihar (37.7 million), Madhya Pradesh (23 million), and Rajasthan (18.7 million). The report also noted that initiatives like 'Poshan Abhiyan' and 'Anaemia-mukt Bharat' significantly enhanced access to healthcare facilities, leading to a substantial decrease in deprivation,

whereas the targeted public distribution system under the National Food Security Act covered 813.5 million beneficiaries, providing food grains to rural and urban populations.

3. RBI proposes tighter norms for deposittaking housing finance companies
Deposit-taking housing finance companies (HFCs) will have to maintain 15 per cent

liquid assets against public deposits held by them, up from a stipulated 13 per cent.

• The Reserve Bank of India (RBI) has proposed enhanced requirements of liquid assets as part of steps to harmonise regulations for housing finance and non-banking financial companies (NBFCs).

• <u>Deposits taking HFCs will get time till</u> <u>March 2025 to meet the enhanced liquid</u> <u>asset norms.</u>

• RBI eleased a draft circular on 'Review of regulatory framework for HFCs and harmonisation of regulations applicable to HFCs and NBFCs'.

• Prominent deposit-taking HFCs include LIC Housing Finance, PNB Housing Finance and Can Fin Homes.

• Currently, HFCs accepting public deposits are subject to more relaxed prudential parameters on deposit acceptance as compared to NBFCs.

• The regulatory concerns associated with deposit acceptance are the same across all categories of NBFCs.

• Hence, it has been decided to move HFCs towards the regulatory regime on deposit acceptance as applicable to deposit-taking NBFCs, RBI said in a communication to HFCs and NBFCs.

• RBI also tightened the leverage ratio for raising funds via deposits.

• Ceiling on the quantum of public deposits held by HFCs, subject to meeting prudential norms and minimum investment grade credit rating, will stand reduced from 3 times to 1.5 times of netowned funds. This will come into effect from the date of this circular, RBI said.

• Deposit-taking HFCs holding deposits in excess of the revised limit will not accept fresh deposits or renew existing deposits till the time the quantum of public deposits is below the revised limit. However, the existing excess deposits will be allowed to run off till maturity, RBI added.

• <u>Currently, HFCs are allowed to accept or</u> renew deposits repayable after one year or more but not more than 10 years from the date of acceptance or renewal of such deposits.

• <u>Henceforth, deposits accepted or renewed</u> <u>by HFCs shall be repayable after one year or</u> <u>more but not later than five years.</u>

• Existing deposits with maturities above five years will be repaid according to their existing repayment profile.

• RBI has permitted HFCs to hedge the risks arising out of their operations like in case of NBFCs.

• Further, HFCs have been allowed to diversify their activities in certain fee-based functions without risk participation like in case of NBFCs, subject to compliance to regulatory norms.

Top performer states during the year were Maharashtra, Odisha, Punjab, Rajasthan and Telangana, according the Ministry of Commerce & Industry.
Andhra Pradesh, Assam, Madhya Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh and Uttarakhand have been awarded the Leader status while Bihar and Haryana got 'aspiring leader' award

• Under Emerging Ecosystems category, Chhattisgarh, Delhi and Jammu and Kashmir got the award.

• In category B states (population less than 1 crore), best performance award has been given to Himachal Pradesh and top performers are Arunachal Pradesh, Meghalaya; Leader - Goa, Manipur, Tripura; Aspiring leader - Andaman and Nicobar Islands, Nagaland and Emerging Ecosystems - Chandigarh, Dadra and Nagar Haveli and Daman and Diu, Ladakh, Mizoram, Puducherry and Sikkim.

• This edition's ranking exercise saw the highest-ever participation with 33 States and UTs participating. A 'National Report' encompassing the full exercise, along with a 'Compendium of Best Practices' and individual 'State Report' for all participating states was also launched, celebrating the spirit of entrepreneurship in India with a total of 31 States/UTs having formulated State Startup Policies. Moreover, in this fourth edition of States Ranking, 3102 startups received funding worth INR 392 crore. 95 Capacity Building and Knowledge Exchange Workshops were organised from August 2021 to December 2022. For the purpose of evaluation, the States and UTs were divided into two categories with category A including States and UTs with a population of more than 1 crore, and category B including States and UTs with a population of less than 1 crore. Gujarat, Karnataka, Kerela, Tamil Nadu were the Best Performers in category A, while Himachal Pradesh emerged as the Best Performers in category B.
The governments of Maharashtra, Odisha, Rajasthan, Telangana, Punjab emerged as top performers in Category A, while Arunachal

Rajasthan, Telangana, Punjab emerged as top performers in Category A, while Arunachal Pradesh and Meghalaya championed as top performers in Category B.

 Some achievements, efforts & initiatives from these states are highlighted in Annexure C.

5. India climbs eight places to 127 in global gender index, says WEF report • India has ranked at 127 out of 146 countries in terms of gender parity -- an improvement of eight places from last year -- according to the World Economic Forum's annual Gender Gap Report, 2023.

• The World Economic Forum (WEF) ranked India at 135 out of 146 countries in the Global Gender Gap Index in the report's 2022 edition.

• India has improved by 1.4 percentage points and eight positions since the last edition, marking a partial recovery towards its 2020 parity level, the report stated.

• The country has attained parity in enrolment across all levels of education, it said.

• India has closed 64.3 per cent of the overall gender gap, the report said.

• However, it underlined that India has reached only 36.7 per cent parity on economic participation and opportunity.

More Finding from the Paper: • The index ranked India's neighbours Pakistan at 142, Bangladesh at 59, China at 107, Nepal at 116, Sri Lanka at 115 and Bhutan at 103.



Iceland is the most gender-equal country in the world for the 14th consecutive year and the only one to have closed more than 90 per cent of its gender gap, according to the report.
In India, while there has been uptick in parity in wages and income, the share of women in senior positions and technical roles have dropped slightly since the last edition, the report pointed out.

• On political empowerment, India has registered 25.3 per cent parity, with women representing 15.1 per cent of parliamentarians -- the highest for the country since the inaugural report in 2006.

• Out of the 117 countries with available data since 2017, 18 countries -- including Bolivia (50.4 per cent), India (44.4 per cent) and France (42.3 per cent) -- have achieved women's representation of over 40 per cent in local governance.

• For India, the 1.9 percentage point improvement in sex ratio at birth has driven up parity after more than a decade of slow progress, the report said.

• However, it also said that for Vietnam, Azerbaijan, India and China, the relatively low overall rankings on the Health and Survival sub-index is explained by skewed sex ratios at birth.

• Overall, the Southern Asian region has achieved 63.4 per cent gender parity, the second-lowest of the eight regions.

• The score in South Asia has risen by 1.1 percentage points since the last edition on the basis of the constant sample of countries covered since 2006. The improvement is partially attributable to the rise in scores of populous countries such as India, Pakistan and Bangladesh.

• In terms of the share of women in ministerial positions, 75 countries have 20 per cent or less female ministers.

• Populous countries such as India, Turkey and China have less than seven per cent women ministers while those like Azerbaijan, Saudi Arabia and Lebanon have none.

• Overall, the report said gender parity globally has recovered to pre-Covid levels but the pace of change has stagnated as converging crises slow progress.

• While no country has yet achieved full gender parity, the top nine countries have closed at least 80 per cent of their gap.

• The report found that the overall gender gap has closed by 0.3 percentage point from last year.

• The overall progress in 2023 is partly due to the improvement in closing the educational attainment gap, with 117 out of the 146 indexed countries now having closed at least 95 per cent of the gap. • The Global Gender Gap Report, now in its 17th edition, benchmarks the evolution of gender-based gaps in four areas: economic participation and opportunity; educational attainment; health and survival; and political empowerment. It is the longest-standing index which tracks progress on closing these gaps since its inception in 2006. It also explores the impact of recent global shocks on the gender gap crisis in the labour market.

ICRA revises up bank credit growth estimate to 15% from 13% for FY24 • <u>Ratings agency ICRA has revised upwards</u> its projection of bank credit growth in FY24 to 14.9-15.3 per cent, estimated at an incremental growth of '20.4-20.9 lakh crore, from the earlier projection of 12.8-13 per cent equating to a growth of '17.5-17.8 lakh crore.

• This will be the highest ever incremental bank credit growth and would surpass the previous high of '18.2 lakh crore (YoY growth of 15.4 per cent) in FY23.

• ICRA said, adding that corporate bond issuances are also expected to touch a record high of '9.6-9.9 lakh crore in FY24, higher than '8.7 lakh crore in FY23.

• Bond issuances are seen at '9.6-9.9 lakh crore in FY24 and '10.0-10.5 lakh crore in FY25 against '8.7 lakh crore in FY23. Corporate bond outstanding, estimated at '44.7 lakh crore as of December 2023, is seen growing 5-7 per cent on year to '45.2-45.5 lakh crore by March 2024 and '47.7-48.5 lakh crore by March 2025.

However, challenges in deposit mobilisation could temper bank credit expansion to 11.7-12.6 per cent or '19-20.5 lakh crore in FY25, it said.
Incremental bank credit growth touched nearly '16.9 lakh crore in the nine-month period ended December 2023, far outpacing the '14.1 lakh crore expansion in the previous year. The rise has been driven by 33 per cent growth in retail and 23 per cent in the NBFC segment as of November 18, 2023.

• AUM growth for NBFCs has also been revised to 14-16 per cent for FY24, against the earlier



estimate of 13-15 per cent. This is expected to moderate to 13-15 per cent in FY25.

Aryna Sabalenka crushes Zheng Qinwen 63, 6-2 to defend Australian Open title. She
became the first woman to do so in more
than a decade .

• The 22-year-old fourth seed rallied from two sets down to register a convincing win against Medvedev and lift his maiden major trophy at the Australian Open.

• With his win, Sinner became the first Italian man to win a Slam since Adriano Panatta in 1976. The World No. 4, who lost just one set en route to the final, ended Novak Djokovic's 33match winning streak at the Australian Open in the semi-final.

• Sinner is just the second player to rally from two sets down in the Australian Open final and lift the trophy. The other was Rafael Nadal, who defeated Medvedev from a two-sets-to-love deficit in 2022.

• The 25-year-old Belarusian defending champion and world number two Aryna Sabalenka defeated Chinese 12th seed Zheng Qinwen 6-3, 6-2 to win the Australian Open women's singles title in Melbourne today. Sabalenka took just 33 minutes to race through a 6-3 win in the first set at Melbourne Park.

• This is Sabalenka's second Grand Slam title while Zheng was gunning for a first. Sabalenka became the first woman to defend the Australian Open title since 2013.

• <u>The twelve component parts of this</u> nomination are, Salher fort, Shivneri fort, Lohgad, Khanderi fort, Raigad, Rajgad, Pratapgad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala Fort, Vijay durg, Sindhudurg in Maharashtra and Gingee Fort in Tamil Nadu.

• These components, distributed across diverse geographical and physiographic regions, showcase the strategic military powers of the Maratha rule.

• The Maratha Military Landscapes of India, which developed between 17th and

19th centuries, represent an extraordinary fortification and military system envisioned by the Maratha rulers.

• This extraordinary network of forts, varying in hierarchies, scales and typological features, is a result of integrating the landscape, terrain and physiographic characteristics distinctive to the Sahyadri mountain ranges, the Konkan



Coast, Deccan Plateau and the Eastern Ghats in the Indian Peninsula.

• There are more than 390 forts in Maharashtra out of which only 12 forts are selected under the Maratha Military Landscapes of India, of these eight forts are protected by the Archaeological Survey of India.

 These are Shivneri fort, Lohgad, Raigad, Suvarnadurg, Panhala fort, Vijaydurg, Sindhudurg and Gingee fort whereas Salher fort, Rajgad, Khanderi fort and Pratapgarh are protected by the Directorate of Archaeology and Museums, Government of Maharashtra. In the Maratha Military Landscapes of India Salher fort, Shivneri fort, Lohgad, Raigad, Rajgad and Gingee fort are hill forts, Pratapgad is hill-forest fort, Panhala is hill-plateau fort, Vijaydurg is coastal fort whereas Khanderi fort, Suvarnadurg and Sindhudurg are island forts.
 The inception of the Maratha Military ideology dates back to 17th Century during the reign of the Maratha King Chbatrapati Shivaji Maharaji

• In Maharashtra there are six World Heritage Sites, five cultural and one natural these are, Ajanta Caves (1983), Ellora Caves (1983), Elephanta Caves (1987), Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus (formerly Victoria Terminus) (2004), Victorian Gothic and Art Deco Ensembles of Mumbai (2018) and western Ghats of Maharashtra, Karnataka, Tamil Nadu and Kerala is serial property in natural category (2012). The Maratha Military Landscapes of India included in the Tentative List of World Heritage sites in 2021 is the sixth cultural property nominated for inclusion in the World Heritage List from Maharashtra.

• Marking a significant improvement in women-led development, the report noted that under PM Jan Dhan Yojana, the proportion of women having a bank account has increased from 53 percent in 2015-16 to 78.6 percent in 2019-21.

• It further added, Female Labour Force Participation rose from 23.3 percent in 2017-18 to 37 percent in 2022-23.

• Highlighting the enhancement in the education levels of women, the review said that the female gross enrolment ratio in senior secondary education rose from 24.5 percent in 2005 to 58.2 percent in 2022.

• Delineating the pivotal role of India's robust Digital Public Infrastructure, the report noted that the transformation in the authentication ecosystem has reduced the cost of conducting e-KYC from a thousand rupees to five rupees. 
