Easterling led Dayton with eight tackles and his forced fumble early in the third guarter helped Dayton secure a 14-10 victory against Eastern Illinois, Saturday, On the first play from scrimmage following Dayton's go-ahead scoring drive, Easterling forced a fumble from a EIU wide receiver and it was recovered by Dayton. The Flyers scored on the ensuing drive to extend their lead to 14-3. After Dayton forced a three-and-out on the next EIU drive following its second touchdown, Easterling returned the punt 29 yards to set Dayton up at the EIU 31-yard line, leading to a Dayton field goal for a 17-3 advantage. Meanwhile, Morehead State faces a former PFL member in #19/21 Austin Peay... Marist (at Columbia) and Valparaiso (hosting Dartmouth) will help a pair of lvy League members kick off their season... Elsewhere, Butler (at Taylor) and Presbyterian (at Campbell) will face regional foes to cap Week 3 action.

#### **WEEK 2 LEADS**

The PFL went 7-3 in Week 2 with the three losses coming on the road to nationally-ranked FCS foes... Dayton scored on each of its first three possessions to start the second half and downed Eastern Illinois, 17-10... Louis Hyde hit a 32-yard field goal with 59 seconds left, helping St. Thomas win in its Division I debut, 12-9 at Michigan Tech... Mark Pappas threw a career-high five touchdowns, including four to start the game, as Morehead State swamped Point University (Ga.), 62-9... Ren Hefley threw for four touchdowns and 309 yards, leading Presbyterian to a 68-3 victory against Fort Lauderdale... Butler broke out to a 28-7 halftime lead and never looked back en route to a 49-24 victory... Ave Maria scored the game's first touchdown but Stetson scored the next six touchdowns to post a 49-16 victory... Davidson fended off Shaw's fourth-quarter comeback bid, holding on for a 28-26 victory... North Dakota State used big plays and a stout defense to down Valparaiso, 64-0... UC Davis scored the first 36 points and downed San Diego, 53-7... Montana State scored the game's first 24 points to down Drake, 45-7.

#### **WELCOME BACK FLYERS. TOMMIES. & RED FOXES**

Dayton, St. Thomas and Marist saw their 2020 seasons wiped out in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and all three saw their Week 1 contests canceled as the pandemic continued to affect schedules into the 2021 season. Dayton finally took the field in Week 2 for their first game in 658 days while St. Thomas ended a 665-day break from the field with its Week 2 road game. Marist took its off week in Week 2 and will see action (hopefully) in Week 3, bringing an end to its own 665-day hiatus.

#### **BLUE HOSE OFF TO FLYING START. EAGLES IN PURSUIT**

After scoring a FCS record 84 points in its 2021 season opener, Presbyterian stacked up a 68-point performance against Fort Lauderdale in Week 2, giving the Blue Hose the FCS' No. 1 and No. 3 single-game point totals through two weeks. Morehead State has the FCS' No. 8 total with 62 points in a Week 2 win against Point (Ga.).

#### WHOLE LOTTA OFFENSE TOO

As would be expected with the previous note. Presbyterian also holds two of the Top 10 offensive vard marks in the FCS, including its FCS-leading 814-yard outing in the season-opener. But PFL teams have posted five of the FCS's 500-plus yard performances through two weeks with Stetson, Butler and Drake joining Presbyterian.

### **WEEK 1 RECAP**

Three PFL teams picked up victories during the season's opening week, each claiming a home victory. Drake began the season with a Thursday victory against West Virginia Weslevan, limiting the Bobcats to three points. Presbyterian had the most fantastic of starts as quarterback Ren Hefley set a NCAA FCS record with 10 touchdown passes and the Blue Hose scored 84 points against St. Andrews. Stetson also picked up a season-opening win with quarterback John Seeter passing for four touchdowns in his debut. Elsewhere, Morehead State BJ Byrd finished with 127 receiving yards at nationally-ranked James Madison, joining Presbyterian's Jalyn Watcher (156 yards) and Matthew Rivera (137) as 100-yard receivers in Week 1. On the ground, Stetson's Jalen Leary (103 yards) and Drake's Cross Robinson (100 yards) were the lone 100-yard rushing performances.

#### STETSON, PRESBYTERIAN NEW COACHES WIN DEBUTS

Both Presbyterian and Stetson underwent coaching changes during the summer. Stetson named former defensive coordinator Brian Young as its 10th head coach and he led the Hatters to a season-opening win against Wagner. Meanwhile, Presbyterian turned to Kevin Kelley as its 16th head coach following an 18-year career at Pulaski Academy in Little Rock and he promptly took Presbyterian to a smashing seasonopening win against St. Andrews.



#### PRESEASON TEAMS

The Pioneer Football League named 38 studentathletes to its Preseason All-PFL Teams, including 29 returning First Team All-PFL selections.

Returning players named to the league's 2020-21 All-PFL Teams were placed automatically on the 2020 Preseason All-PFL team in order of head coaches voting. In addition, the 2021 preseason team includes student-athletes from the University of Dayton and Marist College who would have appeared on the 2020 Preseason All-PFL Team.

#### PRESBYTERIAN'S HEFLEY SETS FCS, & PFL RECORDS, EARNS NATIONAL AWARD

Blue Hose quarterback Ren Hefley began the 2021 season in rarefied air, completing 38-of-50 passes for a PFL-record 576 yards and an FCS record 10 touchdowns, leading Presbyterian to an 84-43 victory against NAIA foe St. Andrews. He earned Stats Perform FCS National Offensive Player of the Week honors for his performance.

#### THIRTY-SEVEN PFL ATHLETES WITH A DIPLOMA IN HAND AS SEASON STARTS

The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame released a list of 3,284 student-athletes who have already earned their undergraduate degrees and will be playing college football this fall while pursuing second diplomas, including 37 Pioneer Football League student-athletes. This season marks the fourth year the NFF has compiled the list of graduated players.

#### DAYTON'S EASTERLING NAMED TO BUCHANAN AWARD WATCH LIST

Dayton defensive back Brandon Easterling was one of 35 FCS athletes named to the initial Buck Buchanan Award Watch List in August. Easterling, who was a 2019 FCS All-American by HERO Sports, the Walter Camp Foundation, the Associated Press and STATS FCS. He led FCS in solo tackles (7.5) and was second in total tackles (12.7) while also nabbing nine turnovers (six interceptions, three fumbles) were the most in FCS football in 2019. Easterling also was named to the Stats Perform Preseason All-American teams as a third-team selection.

#### DAYTON'S COOK NAMED TO PAYTON AWARD WATCH LIST

Dayton running back Jack Cook was one of 35 FCS offensive players named to the initial Walter Payton Award Watch List in August. A First Team All-PFL selection in 2019 after finishing second in rushing (112.9), he also led qualified PFL rushers in yards per carry (7.4). Cook led the FCS in all-purpose yardage (204.3 yards a game). Cook is a two-time CoSIDA Academic All-American, and a 2021 team captain.

#### FOSTER, NIESNER NAMED TO FCS PUNTER OF THE YEAR WATCH LIST

The Augusta Sports Council named Valparaiso's Ben Niesner and Morehead State's Andrew Foster to the FCS Punter of the Year Watch List in August. Niesner nearly set the PFL punting average record last season, averaging 43.58 yards per punt. Foster averaged 41.4 yards per punt last season, the third consecutive year he has averaged more than 40 yards per punt.

#### **DAVIDSON PICKED TO WIN PFL**

Defending champion Davidson College was the choice to win the league's 2021 title in the league's Preseason Coaches' Poll, voted by each of the league's head coaches. Davidson, which won its first PFL title last season, received eight of the 11 first-place votes and received both a second-place and third-place vote. San Diego, the preseason pick each of the past nine preseason coaches' polls, received the three remaining first-place votes and was picked second on each of the other seven ballots.

Drake and Dayton rounded out the top four with 67 and 62 points, respectively. Presbyterian, which will make its first run at the league title this season, got 59 points and a fifth-place nod from the league's head coaches. Valparaiso (55 points) and Morehead State (51) followed in sixth and seventh place. St. Thomas was picked to finish eighth (36 points) in its first PFL season. Marist and Stetson followed in a tie for ninth place (35 points each) with Butler (15) rounding out the 11-team poll.

#### 36 PFL STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED TO 2021 NFF HAMPSHIRE HONOR SOCIETY

The National Football Foundation & College Hall of Fame (NFF) announced the members of the 2021 NFF Hampshire Honor Society, which is comprised of college football players from all divisions of play who each maintained a cumulative 3.2 GPA or better throughout their college careers. Thirty-six Pioneer Football League student-athletes, representing six schools, qualified for membership in the society's 15th year.

#### RECORD-BREAKING 634 NAMED TO SPRING 2021 PFL ACADEMIC HONOR ROLL

For the second time in Pioneer Football League history, it named more than 600 student-athletes to its annual academic honor roll. The league recognized a record-breaking 634 student-athletes to the Spring 2021 PFL Academic Honor Roll. Five PFL members set individual records for student-athletes recognized: Drake University (78), Marist College (61), Morehead State University (59), the University of San Diego (58), and Stetson University (70). In addition, the University of Dayton led all league members with 81 student-athletes recognized, the third time in its history more than 80 student-athletes were recognized.

#### PFL'S 29TH CAMPAIGN

The 2021 season marks the 29th year for the Pioneer Football League – the nation's only non-scholarship, football-only NCAA Football Championship Subdivision conference. The league will feature 11 teams – tied for most in league history – each playing an eight-game schedule to determine the league champion and recipient of the automatic bid to the 2021 NCAA FCS Championship.

### **QUICK FALL BITES**

An exciting fall 2021 PFL campaign awaits with 11 league members scheduled to participate in the league's 29th year. New members Presbyterian and St. Thomas join as full members eligible for the 2021 title along with the nine existing league members. Perennial title favorites Dayton and Marist return after opting out from the spring 2021 season. Davidson will seek to retain its newly earned championship with Morehead State, San Diego, and Valparaiso looking to challenge for that title after finishing just one loss behind the champion last spring. Butler, Drake and Stetson also will look to use their spring experience to make a move forward this fall.
