

In this week's challenge we are leaving the blocks behind and will be using them in the background of our quilt.Using Serpentine lines as an allover filler may seems a little far-fetched, but the truth is that it gives your quilt a gorgeous texture and helps you manage large areas.

Quilting the Allover Serpentines:

- This design works within a defined area that includes at least two boundaries. This could be the sides of a quilt, in between the seams of a block, or even two other quilting designs.
- Allover serpentines allow you to break larger areas into manageable chunks, making it a fun design to quilt no matter what type of machine you have.
- If you want the waves to have a more consistent look, you can mark out the wavy lines beforehand.
- Try changing the direction of the lines or varying the widths for different effects.



Your Challenge:

If you're quilting along with me on the custom Echoes and Curves panel, quilt the allover serpentine lines in the area highlighted in red on the quilt.

Optional Challenge:

• Designate a few of the shapes in the area to highlight with echoing, then fill in the rest of the area with the allover serpentines.




The Allover Serpentine design can help you show off your favorite portions of a quilt.
