Dear CLCP members and friends,

In line with the more general letter sent about the discerned priorities of CLCP and in line with the spirit of transparency, we are writing to inform you about the financial situation of the Christian Life Community in the Philippines and requesting you to discern how you could support the direction of CLCP financially.

#### Meeting the Challenges of the Pandemic

We have completed a process of taking stock of our financial situation in light of the unprecedented disruptions caused by the COVID19 pandemic. During this period our financial situation faced significant challenges caused by disruptions in our main operational sources of income - retreats/recollections, mass/prayer card sales, utilization of the Horacio dela Costa Formation Center.

In response to this, the previous Leadership Community made decisive actions to ensure our financial viability. These include increased optimization of our CLC Center Team to allow the team to operate at the same level of service without replacing Center Team members who have resigned. Moreover, in order to not add further financial strain on CLC members and communities during the pandemic, the previous Leadership Community focused its fund-raising efforts on a few large donors instead of raising funds from the general membership base. These few large donors made up to P5M of donations which allowed the CLCP to stay afloat financially during the past three years. The result has been a relatively stable aggregate financial situation.

### Large Earmarked Donations

This stable aggregate picture masks a challenge with relying on large donors. These donations have been earmarked for specific purposes. P3M was earmarked for operations and improvement of the Horacio dela Costa Formation Center and was used to fund renovations of the retreat house and to subsidize the operational costs during the pandemic. P1M was earmarked for Community Development and was used to fund various activities including our participation in World Youth Day/Magis and the World Assembly. P1M was earmarked for Formation and was used to seed the Formation Support Fund which will contribute to CLCP's objective to allow financially-challenged members to participate in the SpEx and allow CLCP to support formation activities for the poor.

To further improve our financial controls, the Leadership Community recently promulgated a new Funds Policy which clearly outlined the various Funds within CLCP, how revenue sources are allocated and how each fund can be disbursed. The funds are:

- 1. General Operations Fund (GO)
- 2. Formation Institute Fund (FF)
- 3. Formation Support Fund (FS)
- 4. Community Development Fund (CD) includes World CLC dues and activities
- 5. CLC Center Fund (CC)
- 6. Horacio de la Costa Formation Center (HDLCFC) Fund (HDC)
- 7. Apostolate and Social Development Fund (ASD)
- 8. Prayer Apostolate Fund (PA)

## The Challenges of 2023

In 2023, we have seen a marked increase in our revenues from our traditional operational sources of incomes. Mass/prayer card sales have increased though not to the levels prior to the pandemic. The Formation Institute has been successfully running retreats and recollections and has been sustaining itself. Finally, the Horacio dela Costa Formation Center is once again welcoming guests.

However, these increases in our revenues have been offset by large expenses. As of Q3 2023, we have a net loss of close to P1.5M which we expect to grow to P2M by the end of the year.

These net losses are driven by large expenses. These include:

 Up to P1.2M in losses from HDC covered by the last tranche of the donation for HDC covering renovations and operational expenses. No further major renovations are expected so HDC is expected to be break-even (at least before depreciation) moving forward.

- 2. Full utilization of the P1M donation for the Community Development Fund which was used for CommDev and Youth Development Team activities, and for our World CLC dues. This year, a large outlay took place due to the participation in World Youth Day and the World Assembly. The fact that the Community Development Fund is nearly depleted is also of concern since this is where we will take our various programs to grow and strengthen our community.
- 3. We have disbursed P84,000 worth of formation subsidies to CLC members and partners out of the P1M fund. The Leadership Community is committed to generously supporting the formation of our members.
- 4. We spent around P1M for General Operations expenses, primarily salaries and office overhead. This is a continuation of the drawing-down from the General Operations Fund throughout the pandemic. We expect the General Operations Fund to be fully depleted by the middle of next year.
- 5. The Formation Institute and the Prayer Apostolate are relatively profitable in 2023. CLC Center is breakeven before depreciation.
