On April 11 and 12, LSC-Online hosted its inaugural and international <u>Online</u> <u>Teaching & Learning Summit</u>. This virtual event featured faculty and staff from all across the Lone Star College System, with just under 600 attendees from six different countries, and over 30 sessions across two days. Attendees had a wealth of options related to instructional technology, pedagogy and best practices, and student services and support. Topics included AI detection, student engagement, accessibility, testing integrity, and virtual reality. The keynote speaker was Dr. Kasonde Musoma, who <u>went viral</u> in 2017 for holding a baby while teaching his class so that a single mother could attend. He was later dubbed "The Professor of Kindness."

D2L Live Assistance via Al Virtual Assistant

Last year, we introduced D2L's Al-powered Virtual Assistant, accessible through the "Get Help" button in the bottomright corner anywhere inside D2L. We're excited to share that D2L has recently expanded the functionality of this tool, making it even easier to get live help by adding the ability to contact D2L's Helpdesk Support directly in the Virtual Assistant.

Previously, sending an email or chatting with the D2L Helpdesk was done through the D2L support website, but now the process has been streamlined by moving their contact point to right inside the D2L Virtual Assistant. Now, if the Virtual Assistant can't fully address your query, no worries. You can either fill out a form in the Virtual Assistant which sends an email to the D2L Helpdesk for further support, or, for immediate assistance, you can start a live chat with a D2L Helpdesk agent. The chat will also open right inside

the D2L Virtual Assistant, removing the need to visit a separate website.

Summer Happenings in D2L and Beyond

The summer is usually a busy time for LSC-Online because that's when existing features often get updates and new features are turned on. Here are some of the highlights of what's happening this summer:

SMS Notifications Retiring

In July, D2L will retire its SMS notification service. Going forward, students will be encouraged to use the <u>Pulse app</u> for D2L notifications. By making this switch, they will continue to stay informed about course updates, deadlines, and other important information, all conveniently accessible on their mobile device.



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WebEx Changes with CirQLive

Starting in August, when you kick off your first Webex session through D2L, Webex will now prompt you to authorize CirQLive MEETS with your account. This authorization will stay active for three months from the last session held. And don't worry, if you take a breather from MEETS for more than three months, you'll just need to authenticate with Webex again to dive back into the action! This change will not impact students.

ReadSpeaker Available in SoftChalk

ReadSpeaker, a powerful text-to-speech solution, will be available in SoftChalk content starting this Summer.

Already integrated into D2L, <u>Readspeaker</u> makes it easy to meet accessibility standards, in addition to supporting the entire student population and improving learning outcomes for all learners. It also offers students the ability to download an audio version of the document as an .mp3 file for use on all devices.

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Condense a Long Course Down for Summer

Ack! You've just been told that you have to teach a summer, 6-week course... but all you have are your regular 16week courses! How are you supposed to squeeze all that instructional content down into 6 weeks?

Don't panic, you can do this. Here are a few ideas to get you started:

- 1. Identify your learning outcomes (LO). You probably have these already, taken directly from the course catalog.
- If necessary, break these down to objectives. LOs can be quite narrow (ex. Describe the structure of cell membranes and the movement of molecules across a membrane) but are often fairly broad (ex. Identify the principles of inheritance and solve classical genetic problems). From BIOL 1406 "Biology I for Science Majors"
- Identify your learning materials (textbook chapters, online resources, labs) that directly address these outcomes. Be brutal. Leave out the "nice to know" content, winnow it down to the "need to know" topics.
- 4. Create your primary summative assessments based upon the instructional topics.
- 5. Make a course calendar. This step is critical! Your course calendar serves multiple purposes:
 - It provides your students with a map of when readings, labs, activities, and assessments start and are due.
 - It provides you with the information you need to set start dates and due dates on your learning items and assessments in D2L.
 - It serves as a guide for designing your course.
- Create your content modules in D2L. For a short course like this, I recommend structuring your course by the week, to help keep your students on track.
- If applicable, copy your long course into the short course shell; move the course contents to their proper locations.
- 8. Otherwise, begin placing your learning materials in the content modules.

In accordance with Office of the General Counsel policy, LSC-Online will purge data for the earliest courses still present in D2L. The purge process will result in the complete deletion of course data.

Starting on May 22, all courses from 2016 will be purged.

If you have 2016 course data that has not been backed up, please do so as soon as possible. You can either <u>export your content to a .zip file</u> or create a sandbox and <u>copy the content to it</u>.
