Streamlined D2L Grading

Have you ever wanted a list of ungraded student submissions from all your courses combined? It's here and it's called Quick Eval! This long-requested tool makes it easy to just focus on grading. Access Quick Eval on the main D2L homepage by clicking on the Faculty Tools menu on the navbar and selecting Quick Eval. By clicking on the column header, you can sort submissions by student, activity name, course, or submission



date. Use the filter options to show only the items you want to see. If you can't find the submission you are looking for, try using the search box. To start grading, simply click on the student's name, and you'll be taken to the evaluation screen for that submission.

The types of work displayed are assignments, discussions, and quizzes that are not set to be graded automatically. All work must be associated to a gradebook item. Work that is not displayed includes group discussions and assignments, quizzes that have been set to be graded immediately, and items from an inactive/ended course.

Qwickly Attendance



There's a new tool in D2L that makes taking and tracking attendance a snap: Qwickly Attendance. You can access Qwickly in your course by clicking Course Activities on the navbar and choosing Qwickly Attendance.

You can take attendance manually using an attendance list on screen or allow students to check in on their own device, complete with a PIN and countdown timer. Custom attendance statuses can be created,

Communication Breakdown!



Too often, on student evaluations, "communication" is listed as the weakest link in an online course. Even in a face-to-face class, lack of communication often generates the most problems, whether in the message delivery or the reception. Everyone benefits from efforts to improve communication.

Minimum communication requirements should be clearly stated in the syllabus including:

- Instructions for communication with instructor.
- Reasonable expectations for responses from the instructor.

To improve communication, many instructors use a Course Questions discussion topic. The instructor asks that all questions about course expectations and content should be posted in the Course Questions discussion and that email should only be used if questions are of a personal or private nature.

The benefits include:

- Every student can see questions and answers, reducing duplication of effort.
- Students may answer each other's questions, so many times the instructor just needs to reply with "Thanks!"
- Often there are only a few emails from students all semester.

Instituting this policy has diminished the email load for these instructors and allowed them more time to devote to giving quality feedback on assignments.

Quality Matters



What's the deal with Quality Matters? For those who don't know, Quality Matters (QM) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to quality assurance in online and hybrid courses. Lone Star College subscribes to Quality Matters, which gives us access to various QM resources and workshops, one of which is called "Applying the Quality Matters Rubric" (APPQMR). You may have seen this workshop advertised in emails from Organizational Development or your campus Professional Development staff. It introduces

participants to Quality Matters, the QM Rubric, and applying the rubric to an online course.

Since we renewed our subscription during the 2017-2018 academic year, over 165 Lone Star College employees have completed the APPQMR workshop with 80 employees completing the workshop this past year.

Now, with the above publishers available to all faculty, a request to VTAC is no longer required. All other third-party integrations will still need to be requested through VTAC. in addition to the defaults of Present, Tardy, and Excused. Plus, with Qwickly, you can associate attendance with the gradebook and send out automated absence emails to students.

The attendance record screen allows you to modify attendance records, add private comments, and delete session dates. Meanwhile, students are able to view their personal attendance record in each course. At the end of the semester, Qwickly makes it easy to export your attendance data so you can include it in course checkout.
