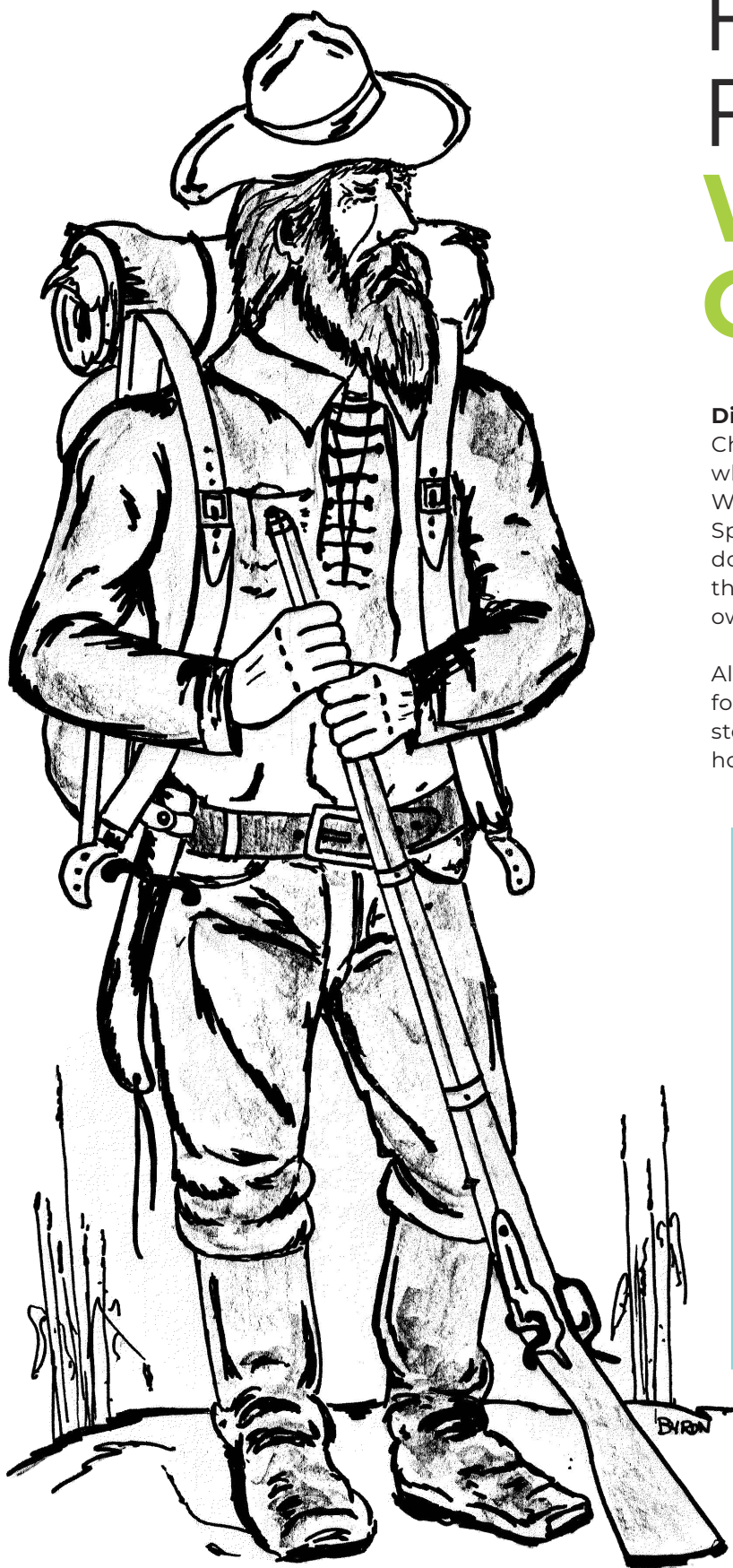

# Fun Facts: **Wildcat Charlie**

**Did you know?** Wildcat Days is named after Charlie Wiegert, also known as Wildcat Charlie, who was a German rancher in the Elkford area. Wildcat Charlie owned a ranch at Sulphur Springs in 1905. He kept a padlock on his cabin door, although everyone knew where he kept the key. He did this because he was the proud owner of the only padlock in the Elk Valley.

Although he was cranky, he was well known for being a welcoming host. Many trappers stopped in to enjoy the warm fire and warm hospitality he offered.

# A Belated 50th Anniversary Message from **Elkford's Mayor, Dean McKerracher**



"My family first moved to Elkford from Trail in 1971—the year that Elkford became a municipality. The original plan for my family was to come to Elkford, make the big dollars and go back to Trail. Fifty years later, we're still here!

I was among the first equipment operators working for the mine, helping to build the town as we know it today. In addition to a long career in mining, I am proud to have served Elkford on municipal council for the last 20 years: the first three as a councillor and the last 17 as Elkford's mayor. And what an honour it has been!

When we first moved to Elkford, it was nothing more than some single and double-wide trailers and a very large work-camp, as well as a mobile home park down by the river (which is now the location of the Teck parking lot). They had just started to build homes and there was only a first-aid station for healthcare.

Today, we're a flourishing mountain town that has grown to accommodate more than 2,700 full-time residents. Our community is among the friendliest and most welcoming you'll find anywhere. It's amazing how many modern amenities and services we have that you'd usually only find in large cities!

On July 16, 2021 Elkford marked its 50th Anniversary. We were planning an extra special event for last year but had to postpone it due to the COVID-19 provincial health orders and restrictions in place at the time. Now that those have been lifted and it's safe to gather once more, it's my great pleasure to invite you to come celebrate the Belated 50th Anniversary and Wildcat Days with us and experience everything Elkford has to offer!"

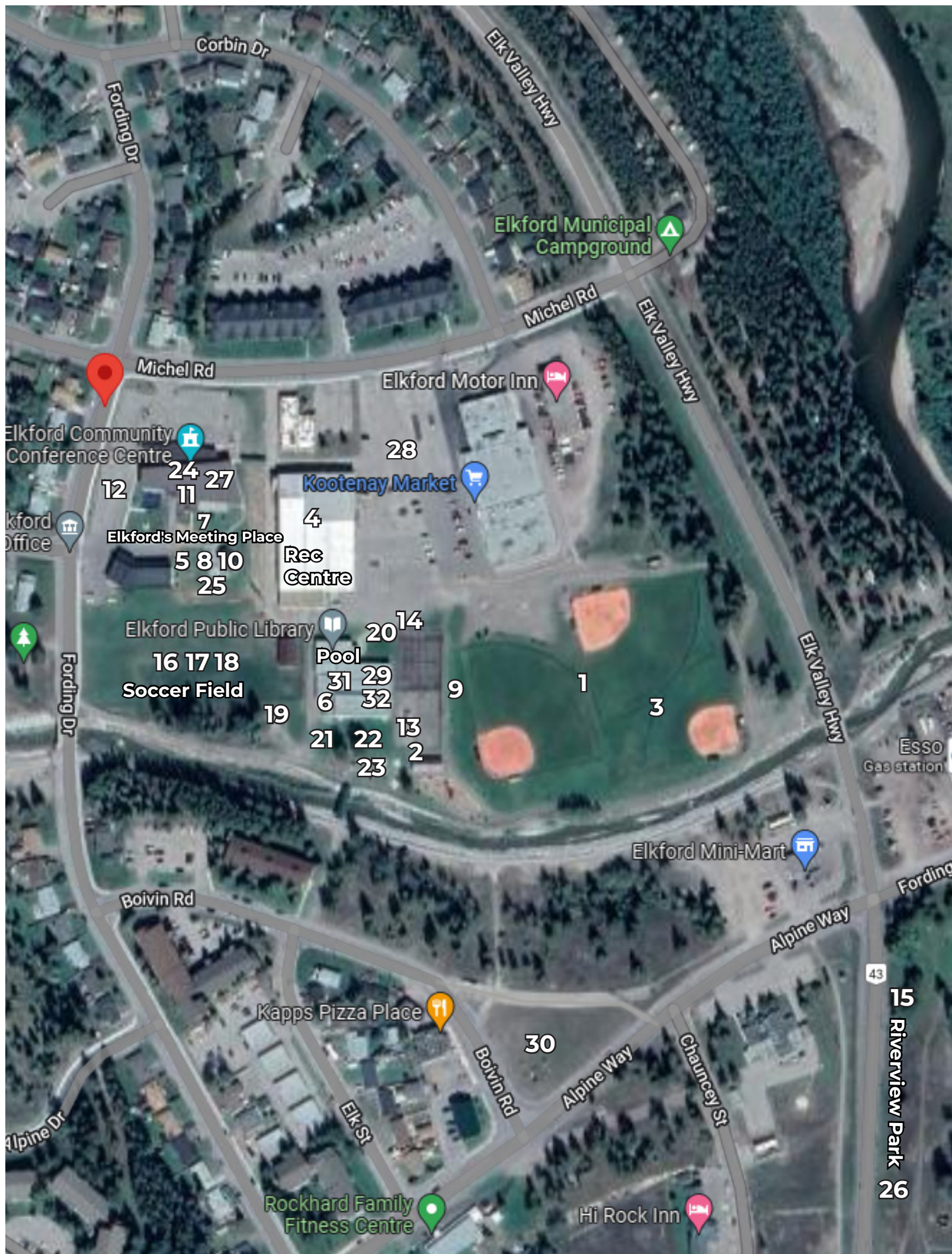

# Happy Belated 50th, **Elkford!**

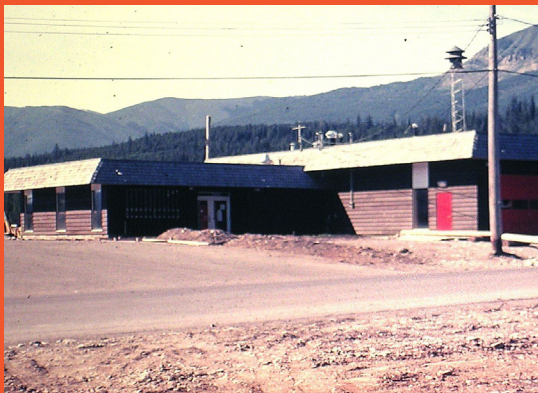
