

#### A MESSAGE FROM REV JAMES



"I will raise up for myself a faithful priest, who shall do according to what is in my heart and in my mind. I will build him a sure house, and he shall go in and out before my anointed one forever."

1 SAMUEL 2:35

Reading these words while on retreat hit me like a hammer between the eyes. I looked up from the text to see Jesus, the Anointed One, present on the altar, and I felt my heart skip a beat. Although these words apply originally to the priest Zadok, and prophetically to Jesus himself, a "priest forever" (Heb 7:17), they seemed to call to me too, saying, "This is your call. This is what it means to be a priest."

These words emphasise that it is God, not us, who does all the heavy lifting. It is God who forms us in the womb and cultivates us through our lives. It is God who calls, and God who equips, so that we can join him in his work of bringing healing, unity, and peace to a world scarred by injustice, tribalism and fear.

Priesthood was never my original goal. Left to my own devices, I'd have chosen a much more "normal" life. I'd likely have lived pursuing approval, status, wealth, and pleasure—cold gods which promise life and often deliver emptiness. Instead, thankfully, Love reached in and, with gentle persistence, showed me that in the upside-down kingdom of Christ, the fullness of life comes through the doorway of the grave. We find our lives only when we lay them down (cf. Lk 17:33).

At this threshold moment, I cannot but be grateful to all those who have cooperated, knowingly or not, with God in equipping me to join the mission. Thank you for being here today. Please pray for me that, in my weakness, I may become a priest who acts according to the mind and heart of God, someone who is able to minister before God's anointed people and say with Christ, "This is my Body, given up for you."

#### LAYING ON OF HANDS

## PRAYER OF ORDINATION

Bishop Brian: Draw near, O Lord, holy Father, almighty and eternal God,

author of human dignity:

it is you who apportion all graces. Through you everything progresses;

through you all things are made to stand firm.

To form a priestly people

you appoint ministers of Christ your Son

by the power of the Holy Spirit, arranging them in different orders.

Already in the earlier covenant offices arose, established through mystical rites: when you set Moses and Aaron over your people to govern and sanctify them, you chose men next in rank and dignity to accompany them and assist them in their task.

So too in the desert you implanted the spirit of Moses in the hearts of seventy wise men; and with their help he ruled your people with greater ease.

So also upon the sons of Aaron you poured an abundant share of their father's plenty, that the number of the priests prescribed by the Law might be sufficient for the sacrifices of the tabernacle, which were a shadow of the good things to come.

But in these last days, holy Father, you sent your Son into the world, Jesus, who is Apostle and High Priest of our confession. Through the Holy Spirit he offered himself to you as a spotless victim; and he made his Apostles, consecrated in the truth, sharers in his mission.

You provided them also with companions to proclaim and carry out the work of salvation throughout the whole world.

And now we beseech you, Lord, in our weakness,

to grant us this helper that we need to exercise the Priesthood that comes from the Apostles.

Grant, we pray, Almighty Father, to this your servant the dignity of the Priesthood; renew deep within him the Spirit of holiness; may he henceforth possess this office, which comes from you, O God, and is next in rank to the office of Bishop; and by the example of his manner of life, may he instil right conduct.

May he be a worthy co-worker with our Order, so that by his preaching and through the grace of the Holy Spirit the words of the Gospel may bear fruit in human hearts and reach even to the ends of the earth.

Together with us, may he be a faithful steward of your mysteries, so that your people may be renewed in the waters of rebirth and nourished from your altar; so that sinners may be reconciled and the sick raised up. May he be joined with us, Lord, in imploring your mercy for the people entrusted to his care and for all the world.

And so may the full number of the nations, gathered together in Christ,
be transformed into your one people and made perfect in your Kingdom.

## HANDING OVER OF THE BREAD AND WINE

A paten holding bread and a chalice containing the wine mixed with water for the celebration of Mass is brought forward. Bishop Brian places them in the hands of Fr James and says:

Bishop Brian: Receive the oblation of the holy people, to be offered to God.

Understand what you do, imitate what you celebrate, and conform your life to the mystery of the Lord's Cross.

#### FRATERNAL KISS

Bishop Brian gives Fr James the fraternal kiss, saying:

Bishop Brian: Peace be with you.

Fr James: And with your spirit.

Likewise, all the priests present give Fr James the fraternal kiss. Meanwhile, the choir chant the following responsory:






For on the night he was betrayed, he himself took bread, and giving you thanks, he said the blessing, broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying:







Go into all the world, and proclaim the Gospel. I am with you always, says the Lord.






