


YESS ANNUAL REPORT

HIGH LEVEL PURPOSE OF YESS

Youth Empowerment and Support Services (YESS) exists in our community to help youth who are in crisis because of family or community breakdown, mental illness, traumatic experiences, and often all of the above. We provide safe spaces for young people to get help, sleep safely, and access the basic necessities for survival as well as build the tools and life skills they need for wellbeing and healthy adulthood. We have evolved over our 41 years of operation from an overnight emergency shelter to a collaborative partner in a community of youth care leveraging more than 25 Edmonton youth agencies. Our goal first and foremost is to ensure that young people have the help they need when they need it and to ultimately prevent adult chronic homelessness.


And to our youth: You are resilient. You are courageous. You are strong. You are inspirational. YESS is here for you because you are worthy. Thank you.






2022-2023 STATS

2SLGBTQIA+

(Two-spirit, Lesbian, Gay, Transgender, Queer, Intersex, Asexual, plus other gender and sexual identities outside of cisgender and heterosexual identities)

We were able to collect 2SLGBTQIA+ information on 241 youth, which is **35% of all youth served** in 2022–2023.

Of the youth who shared their personal identity information, 36% identified as 2SLGBTQIA+

WHO WE ARE

OUR MISSION

To walk beside traumatized youth on their journeys towards healing and appropriate community integration.

WHAT WE DO

Based in Edmonton, Youth Empowerment and Support Services (YESS) provides immediate and low-barrier 24/7 shelter, a drop-in resource centre, temporary supportive housing, and individualized wrap-around supports for young people aged 15–24.

We work collaboratively within a network of care focused on the prevention of youth homelessness by providing youth with the necessary supports to stabilize their housing, improve their wellbeing, build life skills, connect with community, and avoid re-entry into homelessness.

YOUTH HOMELESSNESS IN EDMONTON

From April 2022 to March 2023, YESS served 697 young people between the ages of 15 and 24 who had experienced housing instability and trauma. These young people did not choose to experience homelessness; instead, they are fighting to survive their experiences with trauma (abuse, neglect, sexual exploitation, violence, discrimination, and more). Living in survival mode comes from trauma in the home, trauma within families, and trauma within their communities. Most often, youth in survival mode need access to resources for basic needs first and have to build up trust that services and agencies are able to help them build their own future in the community. We know from brain development research that healthy connections and relationships are needed to move past trauma and grow into healthier adults.

THE CYCLE OF TRAUMA

It is our belief that if these traumatic experiences are left unaddressed in young people, it will most likely create cyclic barriers to healing and moving forward with their lives in a positive way in community. Some of these barriers and results include addiction, mental illness, abuse, and criminal involvement. YESS has reorganized its structure and processes to be trauma-informed, created an internal trauma and mental health psychology team called the Wellness Integration Team, and has created an evaluation framework to help youth identify what life skills they still need to develop and where they are in their healing journey.

It is our belief that if we give youth safe space, consistent and non-judgemental support and teaching, and the time to choose their own path to success, we can prevent further entrenchment into the cycles of trauma and homelessness.

OUR FOCUS

YESS therefore focuses on the following priority areas to ensure that we are intentionally addressing the cycle of trauma and supporting youth in their journeys to stop the cycle.

We focus on prevention and diversion out of homelessness.

Prevention means providing proactive resources for youth and their caregivers before youth become homeless. Diversion means finding appropriate housing for youth before they become entrenched or as an exit out of homelessness.

We focus on healing trauma through relationship.


Trauma has a negative impact on the physical, emotional, and developmental wellbeing of an individual. Among many other serious effects, trauma can have a lasting impact on the ability to develop healthy relationships.

We focus on walking beside youth to minimize falling through gaps.

Barriers are policies or expectations that put resources out of reach for those who need them. These restrictions often prevent people from seeking help.

We focus on collaboration (with everyone).

Collaboration means we work together with other organizations and in line with local, provincial, and national plans to create a holistic approach to addressing homelessness.




OUR PROGRAMS

697 total clients in 2022–2023

Supportive Housing

YESS provides two supportive housing facilities: Graham's Place and Shanoa's Place. For youth who need the stability and support of a longer-term placement than our shelter, our two residences provide a homelike environment while youth work on their goals. Youth in our supportive houses are taught to identify realistic and individualized goals that help them move forward in their journeys towards healing and independence. Our purpose is to walk beside the youth in a more stable environment to help facilitate safe and appropriate community integration.



2022-2023 HIGHLIGHTS

- 21 youth supported in Graham's Place
- 13 of those youth initially accessed our 24/7 shelter and were able to transition into our Supportive Housing Program
- 14 youth supported in Shanoa's Place
- 9 of those youth transitioned into Supportive Housing from within YESS (Cohort Independent Living Pilot Program, 24/7 Shelter, and Graham's Place)
- 5 of those youth were direct placements through Children's Services

Armoury Resource Centre (ARC)

The Armoury Resource Centre (ARC) is home to a variety of daytime programs, including medical care, addictions and mental health counselling, help with continuing education and employment, art therapy and programming, recreational activities, life skills and employment readiness, and help with housing resources. ARC provides youth with basic needs and shelter from the elements with the support of non-judgemental staff in a safe place to hang out without the fear of loitering or trespassing charges. At ARC, youth have a safe place to come where they can build relationships with our staff on their own terms. Our staff focus is on establishing trust with youth so that they will see themselves as worthy of care and compassion, building positive relationships with staff that encourage growth and self-confidence.



24/7 Shelter

Our 24/7 sleep shelter gives youth a safe, secure, and immediate place to sleep and seek shelter, any time of the day. The shelter is open 24 hours a day, seven days a week, and provides beds for sleeping, basic needs like food, clothing, showers, laundry, school supplies, and packed lunches for youth attending school. This is a safe place for all youth with support and access to staff who are trained to deal with diverse client needs. We are 2SLGBTQIA+ friendly, we have harm reduction-minded staff, with suicidal ideation intervention and safety planning. We also provide on-site trauma support to help with sleep anxiety, problem solving, and emotional regulation. Youth who stay in shelter will also receive justice support from staff, as our organization works closely with Edmonton Police Service beat officers to understand charges and pathways through the system. Staff work to build community support connections before youth leave program to ensure supports exist beyond their time at YESS.

YESS Strategic Planning

YESS completed our five-year strategic plan this March 2023 and we have begun the process of envisioning the next five years. We have made significant progress towards a new vision and shift for YESS, but we also have several opportunities ahead of us that may significantly impact our direction. Because of this, we will be continuing our strategic planning this year under our new draft vision: Young people get the help they need, when they need it. We continue to engage with staff and external partners and stakeholders to help develop this five-year plan.

EDMONTON'S YOUTH STRATEGY

YESS is proud to be part of the Youth Agency Collaboration

The Youth Agency Collaboration (YAC) was formed in 2017 by a group of youth-serving agencies with one mission: create communities of care throughout Edmonton that will ensure young people have solid, holistic foundations upon which they can build their futures. Today, YAC is more than 24 youth agencies dedicated to providing comprehensive supports around-the-clock while driving meaningful collaboration between stakeholders. YESS is proud to be part of the Youth Agency Collaboration.

THE CURRENT STATE OF CRISIS AND YOUTH HOMELESSNESS IN EDMONTON


We are seeing the following trends and increases across agencies:

- increase in youth experiencing houselessness
- increased numbers of youth in shelter
- increased number of youth in youth agencies
- increased number of youth using substances
- increased accidental poisonings of youth
- increased suicide and suicidal ideation in youth
- increased number of youth with significant complex mental health issues
- increased crisis incidents in community with youth (arson, crime, violence)

- · increased instances of discrimination, fear and hate towards youth (cultural, identity-based, poverty, and homelessness)
- issues with large, centralized shelters combining adults and youth

Given these realities, youth and youth workers need:

- coordinated access and infrastructure
- · coordinated care
- coordinated information sharing
- strategic coordination
- · youth engagement
- coordinated funding



Collective and Integrated Youth Support Services

Our focus is on the holistic wellbeing for youth and a collaborative process amongst agencies in providing holistic support. Support services through our collective agencies for youth experiencing crisis, trauma and/or homelessness include:

- crisis and distress interventions and stabilization
- · temporary or short-term beds
- basic supportive services
- basic needs items
- · mental health resources and supports
- health services
- life skills

- employment resources
- harm reduction and recovery supports
- · arts and recreation
- · counselling supports
- cultural supports
- parenting and family supports
- supportive housing and transitional independent living options

Common Youth Success Outcomes

We have identified and developed shared youth success outcomes based on holistic life and wellbeing skills and are currently working on an accompanying evaluation framework.

Process for Collaborative Care

We have now moved into establishing a collaborative communities of care workflow, which includes a common intake and a holistic life and wellbeing assessment process.

Next Steps

Our next priority is to establish a governing framework that will track the progress of our collective efforts as we work towards shaping new standards for practice, coordinating government relations, and creating funding strategies. We aim to also develop an accessible sharing platform so stakeholders can seamlessly exchange resources from assessment planning through care management in support of their community initiatives.

Most importantly, we are pursuing increased commitment to and cohesion towards building out our collaborative communities of care processes across Edmonton and Alberta.

AWARDS

Lieutenant Governor's Circle on Mental Health & Addiction

The Circle's True Awards are presented to those demonstrating commitment, passion, and ingenuity in reducing stigma and improving lives of those affected by mental illness and addiction.

YESS was awarded the Circle's True Imagination Award 2022 for our Cohort Transitional Residence Pilot Project.

True imagination and innovation in mental health and addiction services are the cornerstone of this category. The YESS Cohort Independent Residence Pilot Project was created both as a direct response to the COVID-19 pandemic and a known lack of transitional residence in Edmonton's current youth housing system. This pilot program was funded by Homeward Trust for one year to provide "family cohort" style living for 73 youth and allowed them to be unmasked and not socially distanced in their cohorts. The program was also designed by youth to help them identify what skills they need to work on as they transition into more independence. This program was highly successful in helping more than 40 youth transition to more independent housing and helping the other 33 youth understand what further support they need in building resilience. This unique, youth-designed model proved to be a key element needed in the support system for youth experiencing crisis and housing instability.

Queen Elizabeth II Platinum Jubilee Medal

YESS is so honoured to see our President & CEO, Margo Long, nominated for the Queen Elizabeth Platinum Jubilee Medal for her dedication and service to Alberta. To have this nomination come from Rachel Notley, MLA for our neighbourhood in Edmonton-Strathcona, is particularly meaningful and reflects the impact Margo's leadership has had in our community.

Margo has served as the President & CEO of YESS for five years and in that time has grown our organization to become truly visionary in our scope for the ways we support youth who access our programs. Bringing our focus to the healing of trauma and integration back into community has allowed us to address the root causes of crisis and homelessness that youth face. In the past years of the pandemic, Margo empowered the leaders at YESS to become even more innovative, to try new programs and structures to meet youth where they were at in this truly unprecedented time. As we start to feel safer in looking ahead to the future, we are truly excited to have Margo's enormous sense of vision, empathy, and bravery at the heart of this journey.



EXPENSES

It currently costs just over \$8,961/year to serve one youth at YESS for one year, compared to the over \$100,000/ year (EndPovertyEdmonton 2015) it costs to serve one entrenched and addicted homeless adult. Preventing youth homelessness is both a prudent investment and the right approach to ending the cycle of homelessness.


